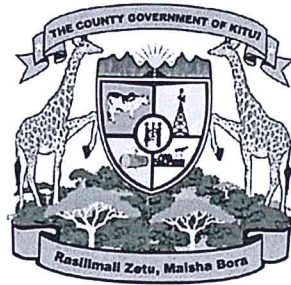

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FOREWORD

Pursuant to Articles 179(2) of the Kenya Constitution 2010 and section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, no 5 of 2017, His Excellency the Governor nominated Ms. Joyce Titus for appointment as County Executive Committee Member (CECM) for the Ministry of Education, Training and Skills Development.

This nomination was conveyed to the Speaker of the County Assembly through letter Ref. No. CGKTI/00G/ADM/23/42) dated 10TH January 2023. The nominee's curriculum vitae and testimonials were enclosed in the letter.

On Monday, 16th January 2023 and pursuant to Standing Order 42(2), the Speaker of the County Assembly read the Message from His Excellency the Governor communicating the name of the nominee to the House for the position of County Executive Committee Member (CECM). Pursuant to Article 179(2)(b) and Standing Order 42 (1), the name of the nominee was referred to the Committee on Appointments for vetting and reporting to the House within twenty-one (21) days.

Consequently, and in accordance with Section 6(2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Monday, 23rd January, 2023, inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominee in accordance with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Friday, 27th January 2023 at 5.00 pm. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum touching on the suitability of the nominee.

The nominee appeared before the Committee as scheduled for the approval hearing in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and the County Assembly Standing Orders on her suitability or otherwise for appointment to the position of County Executive Committee Member (CECM), Ministry of Education, Training and Skills Development.

Pursuant to section 9(2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Committee observed that the nominee met the integrity threshold;

demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the portfolio to which she had been nominated; and had the requisite abilities, academic qualifications and professional experience to be approved for appointment as a County Executive Committee Member (CECM) .

Having conducted the approval hearing for the nominee pursuant to Article 179(2) of the Kenya Constitution, sections 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 42(4), the Committee recommends that this House: -

APPROVES the nomination of Ms. Joyce Titus, for appointment as County Executive Committee Member (CECM), Ministry of Education, Training and Skills Development by His Excellency the Governor, County Government of Kitui.

May I take this opportunity to thank all the Members of the Committee for their input and valuable contributions and time during the approval hearing and deliberations during the writing of the report. The Committee also takes this opportunity to thank the Offices of the Speaker and of the Clerk of the Assembly for the technical support accorded to her during the exercise.

On behalf of the Committee on Appointments and pursuant to Article 179(b) of the Kenya Constitution 2010, section 9(2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No. 5 of 2017 and the provisions of Standing Order 42(4), it is now my pleasant duty and privilege to present to the House, the Second Report of the Committee on Appointments on the approval hearing of Ms. Joyce Titus for appointment to the position of County Executive Committee Member (CECM), Ministry of Education, Training and Skills Development.

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee.

1. The Committee on Appointments is established under Standing Order 184 and is mandated to consider for approval by the County Assembly, appointments under Article 179(2) (*Members of the County Executive Committee*).

1.2 Committee Membership.

2. The Committee was constituted by the House on 26th October, 2022 and comprises of the following Members:

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Notification of the Nominations.

Pursuant to Article 179(2)(b) of the Constitution as read with section 35 of the County Governments Act (CGA) and section 10 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act (PACAAA, *herein after referred to as "the Act"*), His Excellency the Governor Dr. Julius M. Malombe resubmitted the name of JOYCE TITUS, the nominee to the position of County Executive Committee Member for Education, Training and Skills Development through a letter dated 10th January 2023 referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/42 (*Annexure 1*):-

3. H.E the Governor also resubmitted the nominee's *curriculum vitae* and *testimonials*.

2.2 Notification to the House and Referral to the Committee on Appointments

4. Pursuant to the provisions of section 7 of the Act and Standing Order 42(2), the Speaker, through a Communication dated 16th January, 2023 informed the House of the Governor's message where the Speaker reported that the Governor had resubmitted the name of the nominee to the County Ministry of Education, Training and Skills Development upon which the name of the nominee stood committed to the Committee on Appointments for consideration.
5. In resubmitting the name, the Governor explained that the requirements of Section 10 of the Act had been complied with as the nominee had first been nominated using her unofficial name and was resubmitted using her official known name.

6. The Committee on Appointments held a meeting on 20th and 21st January, 2023 where it was resolved that the approval hearing for the nominee would be conducted on 30th January, 2023.

2.3 Notification to the Public.

7. Article 196(1)(b) of the Constitution mandates a County Assembly to facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of the County Assembly and its Committees. Section 7(5) of the Act requires that the public should be notified of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven (7) days prior to the public hearing.

8. In compliance with Article 196 and section 7(5) and (10) of the Act, the Clerk of Assembly placed an advertisement in print media (*Annexure 2a*) informing the public of the public hearings and further requesting them to submit written statements on oath contesting the suitability of the nominee. The Committee did not receive any statement(s) on oath contesting the suitability of any of the nominee at the close of the submission period.

2.4 Notification to the nominees.

9. Section 7(4) of the Act requires the Clerk to notify a candidate of the time and place for holding an approval hearing by notice in two (2) newspapers of national circulation and by writing. The Clerk of Assembly invited the nominee to the approval hearing through an advertisement dated 23rd January, 2023 (*Annexure 2b*).

2.5 Clearances and Compliance requirements.

10. The County Assembly wrote to the below listed government agencies requesting them to issue reports on the nominee relating to the matters within the respective agencies' mandate: -

1. Ethics & Anti – Corruption Commission (*the Commission*)

Ethics and Integrity.

11. The Commission responded through a letter dated 26th January 2023 referenced EACC.7/10/5VOL.XX11(15) stating that it had neither undertaken any investigations nor recommended prosecution against the nominee pursuant to its mandate.

2. Kenya Revenue Authority

Tax obligation.

12. The Tax Compliance Certificate submitted by the nominee was confirmed by the Committee through the KRA's *i-tax* certificate checker platform as valid.

3. Directorate of Criminal Investigations.

13. The DCI confirmed through a letter dated 23rd January 2023 referenced DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.X11/34 *that* the Certificate of Good Conduct held by the nominee is valid and authentic and that the nominee had not been under the Directorate's investigation pursuant to its mandate.

4. Directorate of Immigration.

Status of Citizenship.

14. The Directorate through a letter dated 25th January 2023 referenced IMM/7/2VOL.1VTF/ (31) confirmed that the nominee is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

5. Higher Educations Loans Board.

15. The nominee was cleared by HELB through a letter dated 24th January 2023 referenced HELB/RR/112009/199 (*Annexure 3*).

6. Office of the Official Receiver.

Status of Bankruptcy.

16. The Official Receiver through a letter dated 24th January 2023 referenced OR/COS/01/VOL.1 (*Annexure 4*) confirmed that the nominee has not been subject to any insolvency proceedings.

7. Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.

Political Party affiliations.

17. The Registrar of Political Parties through a letter dated 23rd January 2023 referenced RPP/ORG/43VOL.11(7) (*Annexure 5*) confirmed that the nominee is not an official of any registered political party.

8. University.

Authentication of Nominees' academic certificates.

18. **South Eastern Kenya University** confirmed that the degree certificate held by the nominee is authentic through a letter dated 20th January 2023 referenced SEKU/ARSA/EXAMS/004/VOL.3/092 (*Annexure 6*).

9. Kenya National Examination Council.

Statement of Examination Results.

19. The Council confirmed that Certificate of Secondary School Education held by the nominee is authentic through a confidential and certified statement of results dated 23rd January 2023. (*Annexure 7*).

10. Credit Reference Bureau.

Credit Reference.

20. Metropol CRB Ltd confirmed that the Credit Reference Certificate submitted by the nominee to the County Assembly was valid and authentic through a letter referenced MCRB/CERT/OI/23 (*Annexure 8*).

2.6 Issues for consideration during the approval hearings

21. Section 8 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant Committee of the County Assembly shall be:-

- a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee including the criteria for the shortlisting of the nominees;
- b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's credentials, abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

In conducting the approval hearings, the Committee was guided by the above legal provision and further interrogated the following issues to ascertain the nominees' suitability: -

i) Procedure for nomination.

22. Article 179(2) (b) of the Constitution as read with Section 35 of the CGA gives the Governor the power to appoint the CEC with the approval of the County Assembly whereas Section 6 of the Act mandates an appointing authority to notify the relevant County Assembly upon nominating a person for appointment in any County Government office requiring County Assembly's approval.

23. Section 10 (2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that;

"A nominating authority shall not resubmit the name of a candidate whose nomination has been rejected by the County Assembly unless the circumstances relied on for the rejection of the appointment of the candidate did not exist or ceased to exist at the time of rejecting the nomination of the candidate".

In compliance with this requirement therefore, H.E the Governor resubmitted the name of the nominee for appointment in the County Ministry of Education, Training and Skills Development upon which the County Assembly was required to consider the suitability of the nominee.

ii) Constitutional and Statutory requirements.

a) Qualifications for appointment as a CECM.

24. Section 35(3) and (4) of the CGA provide as follows:

(3) A person may be appointed as a member of the County Executive Committee if that person—

(a) is a Kenyan citizen;

(b) is a holder of at least a first degree from a university recognized in Kenya;

(c) satisfies the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution; and

(d) has knowledge, experience and a distinguished career of not less than five years in the field relevant to the portfolio of the department to which the person is being appointed.

(4) A member of the County Executive Committee shall not hold any other State or public office.

b) Leadership and integrity.

25. Article 73(2) provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:

a) Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability;

b) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corruption practices;

c) Selfless service based solely on public interest, demonstrated by:

i) Honesty in the execution of public duties

ii) The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.

iii) Suitability of the nominees having regard to whether their abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

26. The nominee's suitability was assessed after scrutiny of her academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, background and qualities as well as her performance during the approval hearings conducted on 30th January 2023.

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEE.

27. The Committee held a sitting on 30th January 2023 during which it conducted approval hearing and noted the following; -

THAT:

i.) Article 179(2) (b) of the Constitution provides that the County Executive Committee consists of not more than ten (10) CECMs if the Assembly has thirty (30) or more Members. Therefore, this nomination is in line with the

above legal provision. The Committee examined the nominees against the criteria set out under section 8 of the Act.

- ii.) Nine (9) of the County Executive Committee Members have already been approved by the County Assembly. The nominee subject to the instant approval hearing was not approved by the County Assembly as the nominee had been nominated by H.E the Governor using the nominee's an unknown name.

3.1 JOYCE TITUS

28. Joyce Titus, the nominee, CECM for Education, Training and Skills Development appeared before the Committee on 30th January 2023 at 8:40am and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following: -

Date and place of birth.

29. The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen born in 1969. She hails from Zombe/Mwitika, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

30. The nominee holds a Bachelor's Degree in Education (*Early Childhood Development and Education*) from South Eastern Kenya University (*SEKU*) and a Diploma in Early Childhood Development and Education.

Work experience.

31. The nominee has over twenty-five years' work experience and is currently working as an ECDE Teacher at Thua Primary School. She has also worked as an untrained teacher at Zombe Girls Secondary School and at St. John's Malivani Secondary School in Makueni.

Income and net worth.

32. She estimated her net worth to be Kenya Shillings, Six Million Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand (Kshs. 6,250,000/=).

Potential conflicts of interest.

33. The nominee stated that she did not have any persons or matters that would present potential conflicts of interest should she assume the position to which she had been nominated.

Original Documents.

34. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original documents to the Committee for confirmation.
- i. National Identification Card.
 - ii. Degree certificate.
 - iii. Diplomas.
 - iv. Clearances from: - DCI, HELB, CRB, ORPP and KRA.
35. The nominee also submitted academic documents certified by the issuing institutions where upon scrutiny, it was established that the nominee's name on the ID and some of her academic credentials was different. The nominee however submitted an Affidavit of name in respect of the difference in the names. (*Annexure 9*)

Integrity.

36. The nominee has never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

37. The nominee submitted that she was currently an ECDE teacher employed by the County Government of Kitui and tendered an affidavit (*Annexure 10*) undertaking to resign once appointed as the County Executive Committee Member.

3.1.1 GENERAL AND SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

38. The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows: -

On relating her Education and Experience to the Position;

39. The nominee submitted that she holds a diploma in ECDE education and a Bachelors degree of Education in Early Childhood Development. She also cited that her experience as an ECDE teacher has enabled her to acquire significant knowledge and skills as far as handling little children is concerned. She further stated this experience has also made her develop a great passion to work with little children.

On the Governor's manifesto;

40. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of the Governor's manifesto and its contents in regards to the docket she was being vetted for. The nominee cited that ECDE being among the governor's priorities, the Governor in his manifesto had committed to construct an ECDE classroom in every public primary school, Construct ECDE feeder classrooms, and confirm the ECDE teachers to permanent and Pensionable terms. The

nominee further alluded that the governor had also committed to improve the village polytechnics as well as install ICT equipment in the youth polytechnics.

On School feeding program;

41. The nominee acknowledged the importance of feeding programs in schools citing that from her experience, she had come across kids coming to school appearing very weak out of hunger and that such kids would start dozing off in class hence losing concentration as early as ten O'clock in the morning. She alluded to the fact that a hungry child cannot concentrate in class and a school feeding program will address this challenge. The nominee further cited that a school feeding program is very advantageous to the children coming from poor backgrounds since such programs would provide an opportunity for such children to have access to balanced diet and thus fighting against issues such as malnutrition.

On Linkages/Collaborations between the County Ministry of Education and the National Government;

42. The nominee mentioned that she foresees collaborations with the National Government in the following areas to enhance vocational training and ECDE;
- ❖ Curriculum development, which she cited that it is done by the National Government through KICD. The nominee said that her ministry will work closely with this body (KICD) which is responsible for developing the curriculums used in ECDE and vocational training centers.
 - ❖ Policy formulation/development; a function she acknowledged that it belongs to the National Government and hence the need to work together.
 - ❖ The nominee alluded to the fact that the National Government provides funds in support of youth polytechnics in form of grants hence the need to collaborate on the same.

On School drop-outs arising from teenage pregnancies;

43. The nominee admitted that the numbers of such related school drop-outs are on the rise, citing societal moral decadence as a possible cause. She further admitted that

4.0 COMMITTEE GENERAL OBSERVATIONS.

50. The nominee was vetted and assessed in line with the criteria provided for under sections 7(9) and 10 of the Act.
51. That the nomination of the subject nominee and the already approved nominees fulfilled the provisions of section 35 of the CGA as it met the conditions set therein.
52. Pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Committee observed that the nominee met the integrity threshold, demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the docket to which she had been nominated and had the requisite abilities, academic qualifications and professional experience to be approved for appointment.
53. Further, that pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Committee observed the **THAT;**
- The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the docket to which she had been nominated and had the requisite experience and competencies and is therefore suitable to be approved for appointment.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

THAT, having conducted the approval hearings for the nominee pursuant to Article 179 (2) of the Constitution, section 35 of the CGA, section 9 of the Act and Standing Order 184 the Committee recommends that this House;

- ❖ **APPROVES** the nomination of Mrs. Joyce Titus for appointment as the County Executive Committee Member for Education, Training & Skills Development by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.
- ❖ **Advises** H.E the Governor, Kitui County DR Julius Makau Malombe to receive confirmation from the nominee of her resignation from public service or leave of absence prior to appointing her to the docket nominated and approved to.



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there is a need to address the matter and thus committed, once approved, to enforce proper measures to ensure that such young adults, specifically the girls would continue to develop skills; she will advocate, sensitize and encourage these young girls to enroll in the youth polytechnics which are distributed across the County so that they can acquire skills that will be useful for their economic development. The nominee further stated that the County Government will soon construct and equip public child-care centers where such young adults who would wish to continue with their studies after giving birth, can drop their babies on their way to school and pick them later in the evening on their way from school.

3.1.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

44. The Committee, having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and her oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the CECM, Education, Training and Skills Development, **THAT: -**
45. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
46. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
47. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Education (*Early Childhood Development and Education*) from South Eastern Kenya University and a Diploma in Early Childhood Development and Education and is currently working as an ECDE Teacher at Thua Primary School.
48. The nominee has over twenty-five years' work experience most of which is gained from working as an untrained teacher at Zombe Girls Secondary School and St. John's Malivani Secondary School in Makueni.
49. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which she has been nominated.

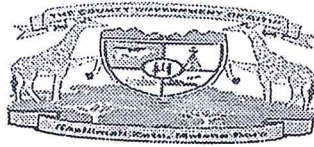

RE: RESUBMISSION OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FOR EDUCATION, TRAINING AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT TO THE COUNTY ASSEMBLY

The above matter refers.

The contents of your letter dated 10th January, 2023 are duly acknowledged.

The reference and use of the word memorandum under Standing Order 134 of the Kitui County Assembly Standing Orders is noted. Nonetheless, the word memorandum is broad and extensive and can be used in respect to communication contained in notices and letters as well as in reference to matters a County Governor re-submits for consideration by the County Assembly which is the case in this matter.

The memorandum dated 22nd December 2022 submitted to your office effectively re-submitted the nominee for Education, Training and Skills Development Joyce Titus for the consideration of the County Assembly pursuant to Section 10(2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. This section provides that;

(2) A nominating authority shall not resubmit the name of a candidate whose nomination has been rejected by the County Assembly unless the circumstances relied on for the rejection of the appointment of the candidate did not exist or ceased to exist at the time of rejecting the nomination of the candidate.

The issue of the nominee's identity did not exist as the name Joyce Kasyoka Masila and Joyce Titus referred to one and the same person as her sworn affidavit indicated and as affirmed by her when she appeared physically before the Appointment Committee.

A handwritten signature in black ink, appearing to be 'Joyce Titus'.

Additionally, the nominee's conflicting names viz: the name Joyce Kasyoka Masila on the CECMs nomination list by the appointing authority and Joyce Titus on her identification card that was relied upon as a basis for her rejection ceased to exist with the name alignment as indicated on her identity card through the affidavit sworn by Joyce Titus.

The lady nominee who hails from a marginalized area of our county, is qualified to lead and oversee the discharge of the functions assigned to County Governments under part 2, schedule 4 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010. These functions are Pre-primary education/Early Childhood Development Education (ECDE), village polytechnics, home craft centres and childcare facilities. It is noteworthy that over 95% of the staff of the Ministry she is nominated to head are ECDE teachers. The nominee has worked progressively and attained a degree in ECDE - the highest qualification specified in the Salaries and Remuneration Commission (SRC) approved scheme of service for ECDE teachers.

Appointment into office of the nine (9) approved County Executive Committee members as suggested in your letter would have the effect of constituting a County Executive Committee that does not comply with the two thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) gender rule. 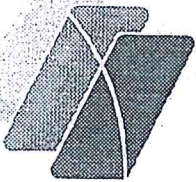

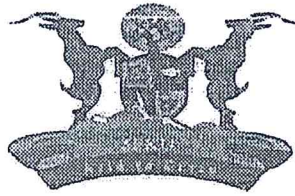

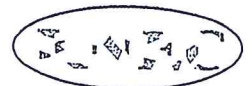
