CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the County Assembly's Sectoral Committee on Labour and Social Welfare during the approval hearing of **Ms.** Francisca Kanza Kyui, nominee for appointment as County Chief Officer, Department of Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services as requested by H.E. the Governor and communicated to the House by the Speaker on Monday, 16th January 2023.

The Hon. Speaker vide a communication made on Monday, 16th January 2023 conveyed to the House the Message from H.E. the Governor and subsequently referred the name of the nominee, her curriculum vitae, and the criteria of nomination to the Sectoral Committee for approval hearing.

Pursuant to sections 7, 8 and 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017, the Committee would conduct the exercise within twenty-one (21) days.

On Monday, 23rd January 2023, the Clerk of the Assembly notified the nominee and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Assembly Website of the date, time and venue of holding the approval hearing. In compliance with section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017, the Clerk of the Assembly in the same advertisement, invited members of the general public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominee in conformity with section 7 (5) of the same Act. The memoranda were to be received by Thursday, 26th January 2023 at 5 p.m. However, at the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum against the nominee's suitability.

The Clerk of the Assembly also wrote to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and Credit Reference Bureau (CRB) seeking authentication of the nominee's clearance certificates submitted to the Assembly by the appointing authority.

The nominee appeared before the Committee on Monday, 30th January 2023 at eleven O'clock in the morning for vetting. The Committee examined the suitability of the nominee based on the criteria set out in Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act No. 5 of 2017. In addition, the Committee examined the nominee's academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on Leadership and Integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominee; any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question and suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities met the needs of the County Department.

Committee Recommendations

The Committee having held approval hearing on the nominee regarding her suitability, observed that due process was followed on the recruitment process as provided for under Section 45 of the County Governments Act (2012). The Committee thus recommends that the County Assembly of Kitui **APPROVES** the nomination of Ms. Francisca Kanza Kyui for appointment as County Chief Officer, Department of Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services.

The Committee registers its appreciation to the Offices of the Speaker and that of the Clerk of the Assembly, for the logistical support extended during the vetting process.

CHAPTER ONE

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee.

The Committee on Labour and Social Welfare is one of the Twelve sectoral committees of the County Assembly of Kitui established under **Standing**Order 190 whose mandates pursuant to the **Standing Order 190 (5)** are inter-alia:

- a) make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.
- b) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- c) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
- d) study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- e) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives.
- f) vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any other law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 185(Committee on Appointments).

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Notification of the Nominations.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 45 of the County Governments Act (CGA) and section 6 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act (PACAAA, herein after referred to as "the Act"), His Excellency the Governor Dr. Julius M. Malombe notified the County Assembly of the nomination of the Chief Officers to serve in the Kitui County Ministries through a letter dated 19th December, 2022 referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40.

Francisca Kanza Kyui, appeared in the list as a nominee for the Department of Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services.

H.E the Governor also forwarded the nominee's *curriculum vitae* and *testimonials*.

Further, through a letter dated 21st December, 2022 referenced CAK/ADM/15/7/ (44) H.E the Governor availed the criteria used to arrive at the nominees.

2.2 Notification to the House and Referral to the Committee

Pursuant to the provisions of section 7 of the Act and Standing Order 42(2), the Speaker, through a Communication dated 16th January, 2023 informed the House of the Governor's nominations upon which the name of the nominee stood committed to the Sectoral Committee for consideration.

2.3 Notification to the Public.

Article 196(1)(b) of the Constitution mandates a County Assembly to facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other

business of the County Assembly and its Committees. Section 7(5) the Act requires that the public should be notified of the date, time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven (7) days prior to the public hearing. In compliance with Article 196 and section 7(5) and (10) of the Act, the Clerk of Assembly placed an advertisement in print media on 23rd January, 2023 informing the public of the public hearings and further requesting them to submit written statements on oath contesting the suitability of any of the nominees. The Committee did not receive any statement(s) on oath contesting the suitability of the nominee.

2.4 Notification to the nominees.

Section 7(4) of the Act requires the Clerk to notify a candidate of the time and place for holding an approval hearing by notice in two (2) newspapers of national circulation and by writing. The Clerk of Assembly invited the nominee, in writing and through media for the approval hearing through an advertisement dated 23rd January, 2023.

2.5 Clearances and Compliance requirements.

The County Assembly wrote to the below listed government agencies requesting them to issue reports on the nominee relating to the matters within the respective agencies' mandate: -

1. Ethics & Anti – Corruption Commission - Ethics and Integrity.

The Commission responded through a letter dated 26th January, 2023. Referenced EACC/10/5 VOL.XXII(15) stating that it had neither undertaken any investigations nor recommended prosecution against any of the nominee pursuant to its mandate.

2. Kenya Revenue Authority-Tax obligation.

The Tax Compliance Certificate submitted by the nominee was authenticated by KRA via a letter dated 17th January, 2023, referenced CAK/ADM/15/7/ (100).

3. Directorate of Criminal Investigations.

The DCI confirmed through a letter dated 23rd January, 2023 *Referenced DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.XII/34* that the Certificate of Good Conduct held by the nominee was valid and authentic.

4. Directorate of Immigration-Status of Citizenship.

The Directorate through a letter dated 25th January 2023 (*Annexure 6*) refence confirmed that the nominee was a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

5. Higher Education Loans Board.

The nominee was cleared by HELB through a letter dated 24th January, 2023

6. Office of the Official Receiver-Status of Bankruptcy.

The Official Receiver through a letter dated 24th January, 2023 referenced OR/COS/01/VOL1 confirmed that the nominee had not been subject to any insolvency proceedings.

7. Universities- Authentication of Nominees' academic certificates.

The Committee received an authentication letter from JKUAT dated 19th January, 2023 referenced JKU/2/60/4 that the degree certificate held by the nominee were authentic.

8. <u>Kenya National Examination Council-Statement of Examination</u> Results.

The Council confirmed to the Committee via a letter dated 23rd January 2023 referenced KCSE/23/005/002/025 that Certificate of Secondary School Education held by the nominee was authentic.

9. Credit Reference Bureau.

CREDIT**INFO** Limited via a letter dated 20th January, 2023 referenced CAK/ADM/15/7/ (110) confirmed that the Credit Reference Certificate submitted by the nominee to the Committee was valid and authentic.

10. Office of the Registrar of Political Parties

Via a letter dated 23rd January, 2023, the registrar of political Parties confirmed to the Committee that the nominee was not affiliated to any political party(s).

2.6 Issues for consideration during the approval hearing

Section 8 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant Committee of the County Assembly shall be: -

- a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee including the criteria for the shortlisting of the nominees;
- b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's credentials, abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

In conducting the approval hearing, the Committee was guided by the above legal provisions and further interrogated the following issues to ascertain the nominee's suitability: -

i) Procedure for nomination.

Section 45 of the CGA gives the Governor the power to appoint the Chief Officers with the approval of the County Assembly whereas Section 6 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act mandates an appointing authority to notify the relevant County Assembly upon nominating a person for appointment in any County Government office requiring County Assembly's approval.

In compliance with this requirement therefore, H.E the Governor notified the County Assembly of the nomination upon which the County Assembly was required to consider the suitability of the nominee.

ii) Constitutional and Statutory requirements.

a) Two third gender rule.

Article 27(8) of the Constitution requires the State to take legislative and other measures to implement the principle that not more than two-thirds of the Members of elective or appointive bodies shall be of the same gender.

b) Qualifications for appointment as a Chief Officer.

Section 45(1-6) of the CGA provides as follows;

- 1. The Governor shall: -
- (a) nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the CPSB;
- **(b)** With the approval of the County Assembly, appoint County Chief Officers.
 - > the office of the County Chief Officer shall be an office in County Public Service.
 - > the County Chief Officer shall be responsible to the respective County Executive Committee Member for the administration of a County department as provided under Section 46.

- > the County Chief Officer shall be the authorized officer in respect of exercise of delegated power.
- > the Governor may re-assign a County Chief Officer.
- > a County Chief Officer may resign from office by giving notice, in writing to the governor.

(c) Leadership and integrity.

Article 73(2) provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:

- a) Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability;
- b) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corruption practices;
- c) Selfless service based solely on public interest, demonstrated by:
- i) Honesty in the execution of public duties
- ii) The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.
- iii) Suitability of the nominee having regard to whether her abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

The nominee's suitability was assessed after scrutiny of the academic credentials, professional trainings and experiences, personal integrity, background and qualities as well as her performance during the approval hearing conducted on 30th January 2023.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEE.

The Committee held one sitting on 30th January 2023 during which it conducted an approval hearing and examined the nominee against the criteria set out under section 8 of the Act.

3.1 FRANCISCA KANZA KYUI

Ms. Francisca Kanza Kyui, the County Chief Officer nominee for the department of Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services appeared before the Committee on 30th January 2023 at 11:00 a.m. and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of birth.

The nominee is a Female Kenyan citizen born in 1975 in Mutomo/ Kibwea Ward, Kitui South Sub-County - Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

The nominee holds a master's degree of science in Project Planning and Management from the University of Nairobi (UoN), a Bachelors Degree of Science in Mathematics and Computer science from Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology (JKUAT) and a Diploma in Education from the Kenya Science Teachers' College.

Work experience.

- > The nominee has over twenty years work experience and has been working as an Assistant Director, Policy and Research from 2015 up to date.
- > The nominee has been in charge of development of Policy and Research proposals for Kitui County from 2015 to date.

- > The nominee has worked as an Accounting Officer- office of the County Secretary, Kitui from 2022 up to date.
- ➤ That between the year 2015-2018, the nominee was a member of the Committee implementing programmes for Persons Living With Disabilities (PLWDs) in Kitui County.
- ➤ That between 2011-2015, the nominee headed the departments of Mathematics and Sciences in Mbitini girls and Mutendea secondary schools.
- That between the year 2013-2015, the nominee was a Teacher (Mathematics and Physics) at Mbitini girls' secondary school,

Income and net worth.

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the Committee that her estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings twenty-five Million (Kshs. 25 million) which she co-owns with her husband.

Integrity.

The nominee submitted that she had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

Original Documents

During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following documents to the Committee for confirmation.

- i) Identification Card.
- ii) Degree certificates.
- iii) Clearances from: -DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.

3.1.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.

The Committee posed the following sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows: -

On the overview of the County department in which she had been nominated as a Chief Officer;

The nominee submitted that the department falls under the Office of the Deputy Governor. The nominee further cited that the department will be dealing with implementation of Performance management system, a system she defined as a systematic process of getting better results from the teams through managing of performance, within agreed framework of planned goals, objectives and standards.

The nominee further stated that the department would be taking the entire public service through the process of performance contracting which entails;

- > Reviewing of performance contracting guidelines,
- > Identifying the performance targets for the ministries in line with the governor's manifesto,
- > Negotiating the performance targets,
- > Vetting of performance targets,
- ➤ Signing of performance contracts whereby the CECMs will be signing with H.E the governor, the Chief Officers with CECMs while Directors will be signing with the Chief officers, after which they will be required to implement the performance contract they will have signed.
- > Monitoring and receiving reports on status of implementation of the performance contracts.
- > Mid-year review of the status of implementation

- ➤ Evaluation, moderation and ranking of the departments to check on how they have performed as far as implementation of the targets is concerned.
- ➤ Public announcement of the performance evaluation report for all the departments.
- > Rewarding the best performers and sanctions to non-performers.

The nominee went ahead to expound on the aspect of disaster and emergency services where she submitted that if approved, she will endeavor to establish in her department, a well-coordinated disaster management system that will ensure a disaster risk reduction in the County, well preparedness of the people of Kitui County, prompt responses to emergences and recovery to ensure that communities are able to live their normal life.

On her main duties and responsibilities as the Chief Officer, department of Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services;

If approved as the Chief Officer for Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services; the nominee alluded that among other responsibilities;

- > She will be in charge of the general administration of the budget for the department,
- > She will be the accounting officer and the authorized officer for the department,
- She will be responsible for ensuring that there is efficient, effective and economic use of financial human and other resources for the department,
- > She will be expected to provide strategic policy direction for effective public service delivery,

- > She will be responsible for overseeing implementation and monitoring of performance management system both in the department and the entire County in general,
- > She will be responsible for establishment of a well-coordinated disaster management system to ensure there is disaster preparedness, mitigation, response and even recovery.

On statutory documents that she will be required to prepare before submitting the sector budget estimates;

The nominee submitted that as an Accounting Officer for the department, she will be expected to prepare a departmental Annual Development Plan (ADP) in line with the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) to capture the strategic priorities for the department as well as the departmental County Fiscal Strategy Paper (CFSP) which captures the broad priorities and the ceilings for the department. The nominee further stated that she will also be obligated to participate in the preparation of the County Budget Proposals which outline the spending plan and the revenue steam evening as well as the County Budget Review and Outlook Paper (CBROP) which outlines the expenditure and variance for the spending on programs and capital projects.

On defining Performance contracting and its benefit to the people of Kitui County;

The nominee defined Performance contracting as a part of the broad public sector reform aimed at improving efficiency, effectiveness and management of public service. She also submitted that Performance contracting is a systematic process where departments set their targets based on their mandate, functions and strategic objectives.

The nominee further submitted that Performance contracting will be very useful in ensuring that the County Government receives maximum benefits from the resources at her disposal and that it will ensure an existence of a linkage between planning, budgeting and the expected results. She also cited that with the introduction of Performance contracting in the County, there will be efficient, effective and economical use of the County human resources and that the employees will be motivated by the rewards that will be attached to good performance.

On some of the Disasters likely to occur/re-occur in the County and their possible interventions;

The nominee submitted that some of the disasters likely to occur or reoccur in the County would include Drought and famine which she admitted have been very frequent in the County and that she would propose as an intervention, that her department works in liaison with the relevant stakeholders like the National Drought and Management Authority, Food and Agricultural Organization, the Red Cross and other relevant agencies to ensure that food is distributed to the people who are severely affected by draught.

The nominee also committed to liaise with the departments of Agriculture, Water and Irrigation to ensure that the people of Kitui can be encouraged to start irrigation that can enable them get domestic food.

The other disaster that the nominee cited common in the County is drowning in flooded rivers and dams. In this case, the nominee suggested an intervention; to put up warning sign boards at designated points and possibly engage the services of security officers in such dangerous areas to bar people

from approaching them carelessly. She also committed to ensure that all dams are well fenced as an intervention to control drownings in dams.

The other disaster that the nominee mentioned as a common disaster in the County is fire break-outs. As an intervention measure to this disaster, the nominee cited that her department will ensure that there is an emergency response unit with a call center where people will be given a specific number they can call during fire and other emergencies. This call center, the nominee submitted, will be operational 24 hours and will be installed with a software that with a click of a button, will be able to give an analysis of the nature of emergencies that have occurred, where they have occurred and whether and how they have been responded to.

On the nominee's awareness to any Act/regulation in the County touching on emergencies and disaster management;

The nominee acknowledged that she was aware of an Emergency Fund Act that was developed by the County government of Kitui and approved by the County Assembly in the year 2018. The nominee however lamented that the Act was not operationalized since it specifically sought to establish an emergency fund, something that was never done. The nominee alluded that Section 110 of the Public Finance Management Act gives provisions for the CECM for Finance to establish a fund for emergency and that the government of that time needed not to develop a Bill but a regulation in order to operationalize the Fund. If approved, the nominee committed to develop a policy framework that will have clear guidelines on how emergency funds can be utilized in our County.

On some of the probable challenges the nominee expects to face in her line of duty and how she would tackle them;

The nominee quoted inadequacy of funds to implement matters relating the department she was being vetted to serve as its Chief Officer as a probable challenge she expects to face. However, she committed to work in liaison with the other ministries and the relevant agencies to ensure that programs performance contracting, disaster and emergency services are well funded.

The other challenge that the nominee cited as a likely one to face is resistance from staff. The nominee admitted performance contracting is generally resisted by employees and especially in the public sector. To handle this challenge, the nominee committed to offer thorough training to all staff on all matters Performance contracting and its importance in service delivery.

CHAPTER FOUR

4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

Upon considering the nominee's filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and the oral submissions during the approval hearing, the Committee made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer for Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services;

THAT: -

- 1) In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

- 3) The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
- 4) The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County department and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a Chief Officer in the County department to which She has been nominated.

Your letter Ref: CAK/ADM/15/7/(44) dated $21^{\rm st}$ December, 2022 on the above refers. We wish to respond to the issues raised as follows:-

1. Rationale for the Post 2022 General Election Departmental Structure

The County Governor is obligated by law to ensure the structuring of the County Government after a General Election in a manner that will most effectively and efficiently deliver on the incoming government's vision and development agenda. This is the letter and spirit of section 30(2) (e) of the County Government Act, 2012.

The **twenty six (26)** departments under the reorganised county government structure were presented to the pre-election County Executive Committee and formed the basis of the Supplementary Budget I that the said County Executive Committee approved on **Wednesday October 19, 2022** and thus complying with the requirements of Section 46 of the County Governments Act, 2012.

It is noteworthy, the said Supplementary Budget I was subsequently forwarded to the County Assembly and was accordingly approved on **Wednesday November 30**, 2022. The **twelve (12)** ministries and twenty **six (26)** departments were part of the Governor's inaugural speech at the opening of the 3rd County Assembly delivered on the

Marian

11th October, 2022. Hence, the County Assembly was duly indulged on the matter, as necessary.

The Kitui County Public Service Board equally adopted and maintained the departments and proceeded to prepare advertisements for potential applicants to fill the subject chief officer positions in the **twenty six (26)** departments on the **7**th and **14**th **October**, **2022**.

2. Procedure used to arrive at the nominees including criteria for shortlisting

Following the advertisements for the positions of Chief Officers (CO's) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on **7**th **October**, **2022** and **14**th **October**, **2022** a total of **1,866** applications were received.

The County Public Service Board (CPSB) has advised my office that they were guided by the Constitutional Values and Principles in Article 10 and 232 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, and they used the following criteria to shortlist a total of 208 applicants for the **26** posts with **eight (8)** persons shortlisted per position:

- i. At least one candidate from each of the **Eight(8)** Sub Counties per position where applicable
- ii. At least one candidate from each of the **forty (40)** wards in all the positions where applicable
- iii. Meets the minimum qualifications and experience as per the advert
- iv. Representation of special groups such as Persons Living with Disability (PLWD), Women and Youth
- v. Regional balancing/ County diversity
- vi. Minorities

The County Public Service Board conducted interviews from **Wednesday November 23**rd, **2022** to **Friday December 9**th, **2022**. After the interviews were concluded the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on **Tuesday December 13**, **2022** to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

3. Report of the Kitui County Public Service Board on the selection of the Twenty Six (26) nominees.

The County Public Service Board's report on the scoring and ranking of the candidates shortlisted and interviewed for the **Twenty Six (26)** CO positions is herewith enclosed.



4. Criteria for Nomination for Appointment

After I was satisfied the gender, regional balance etc considerations would be realized, I opted to nominate for appointment all those candidates that were ranked highest by the County Public Service Board *granted the overriding essence of recruitment*

of CO's is effective delivery of services to our people. (See attached, my letter Ref. CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40 dated December 19, 2022) Besides educational qualifications and leadership management exposure/experience and potential, I have, to the extent possible, endeavored to observe the 2/3 gender rule, regional balance, intergenerational and diversity inclusivity.

All the county's **eight (8)** constituencies have at least one Chief Officer (CO) nominee. **Eight (8)** of the nominees are women with **one (1)** of them coming from a marginalized/minority community in the county.

Nine (9) of the nominees are aged 37 years or below and Seven (7) of these are youth aged below 35 years. I was advised that none of the Persons Living with Disability (PLWD) qualified for the advertised chief officer positions.


