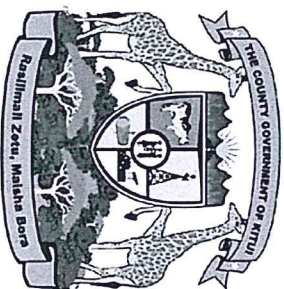

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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Sectoral Committee on Lands, Infrastructure and Urban Development during the vetting of Mr. Peter Ketonya Musya,-nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, Department for Transport and Boda Boda Sector, Mr. Evans Mutemi Mutua-nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, Department of Urban Development, Mr. Michael Mutisya Kalii-nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, Department of Land and Housing and Mr. Benjamin Kithae Chamia- nominee for appointment as Chief officer, Department of Roads and Public Works as submitted by H.E. the Governor.

- The Hon. Speaker vide a communication made on Monday, 16th January 2023 during a special sitting, conveyed to the House the Message from H.E. the Governor and subsequently referred the names of the nominees', curriculum vitae, and the report of the County Public Service Board on the criteria of nomination to the Sectoral Committee for approval hearings. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-one (21) days pursuant to Section 7, 8 and 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No.5 of 2017. The Clerk of the County Assembly notified the nominees and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Assembly Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearings on Monday, 23rd January 2023.

In compliance with section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No.5 of 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Monday, 23rd January 2023 informing the public of the nomination, date, time and place of the approval hearings. He also invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written

statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominee in conformity with section 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No.5 of 2017. The memoranda were to be received on or before Friday, 27th January 2023 at 5.00 p.m. (East African Time). However, at the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum for or against the nominee's suitability.

The Clerk of the County Assembly also wrote to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and Credit Reference Bureau (CRB) seeking authentication of the clearance certificates presented to the Assembly by the appointing authority.

The nominees appeared before the Committee on Monday, 30th January 2023 between 9.00 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. for approval hearings. The Committee examined the suitability of the nominees based on the criteria set out in Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No.5 of 2017. In addition, the Committee examined the nominees' academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on leadership and integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominees; any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question and suitability of the nominees for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities met the needs of the County Departments.

Committee Recommendations

The Committee having held approval hearings on the nominees regarding their suitability, observed that due process was followed on the recruitment process as provided for under Section 45 of the County Governments Act

(2012). The Committee therefore recommends that the County Assembly of Kitui:

1. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Peter Ketonya Musya** for appointment as the Chief Officer – Transport and Boda Boda Sector by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.
2. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Evans Mutemi Mutua**, for appointment as the Chief Officer – Urban Development by H.E Governor, Kitui County.
3. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Michael Mutisya Kalii**, for appointment as the Chief Officer – Land and Housing by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.
4. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Benjamin Kithae Chamia**, for appointment as the Chief Officer – Roads and Public Works by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.

The Committee registers her appreciation to the Officers of the Speaker and that of the Clerk of the Assembly, for the logistical support extended during the vetting process.



CHAPTER ONE

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee.

The Committee on Lands, Infrastructure and Urban Development is established under Standing Order 190(5) and is mandated to:

- i. Investigate, inquire into and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operation and estimates of the assigned department;
- ii. Study programs and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- iii. Study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- iv. Study, assess and analyse the relative success of departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- v. Investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
- vi. To vet and report on all appointments where the constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 185(Committee on Appointments); and
- vii. Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

1.2 Subjects under the Committee

In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider Land, development controls, Urban Development, Transport, housing, Public Works and Boda Boda matters.

In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the Ministries of Roads, Transport and Public works and Ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban Development.

1.3 Committee Membership.

The Committee was constituted by the House on 26th October, 2022 and comprises of the following Members:

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Legal Framework

Qualifications for appointment as a Chief Officer.

The Office of the Chief Officer is established under section 45 of the County Governments Act (CGA) which states that:

- (1) The Governor shall—
 - (a) nominate qualified and experienced county chief officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board; and
 - (b) with the approval of the County Assembly, appoint county chief officers.
 - (2) The office of a county chief officer shall be an office in the county public service.
 - (3) A county chief officer shall be responsible to the respective county executive committee member for the administration of a county department as provided under section 46.
 - (4) The county chief officer shall be the authorized officer in respect of exercise of delegated power.
- Through an advertisement dated 7th October, 2022 (annexure 2), the Kitui County Public Service Board called for applications from qualified persons outlining the requirements for appointment, including the following:
- i. Be a holder of at least a first Degree from a University recognized in Kenya;
 - ii. Have relevant knowledge and experience of more than 5 years in the relevant field;

- iii. Satisfy the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
- iv. Be conversant with the Constitution and all devolution related legislations.

Article 73(2) of the Constitution was paramount to the Committee as it executed its mandate: It states that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:

- a) Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability;
- b) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corruption practices;
- c) Selfless service based solely on public interest, demonstrated by:
 - i) Honesty in the execution of public duties;
 - ii) The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.

The nominees' suitability as to whether their abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made to were assessed after scrutiny of their academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, background and qualities as well as their performance during the approval hearings conducted on 30th January, 2023.

2.2 Notification of the Nominations.

Pursuant to section 45 of the CGA and section 6 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act (PACAAA, *herein after referred to as "the Act"*), His Excellency the Governor Dr. Julius M. Malombe notified the County Assembly of the nomination of twenty six (26) persons for appointment as

County Chief Officers in various Departments through a letter dated 19th December, 2022 referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40 (*Annexure 3*):- The list contained the following four (4) persons nominated to serve in the County Ministry of Roads, Transport and Public Works and County Ministry of Land, Housing and Urban Development:

1. **Mr. Peter Ketonya Musya** , nominee for appointment as the Chief Officer, Department of Transport and Boda Boda Sector.
2. **Mr. Evans Mutemi Mutua**, nominee for appointment as the Chief Officer, Department of Urban Development.
3. **Mr. Michael Mutisya Kalii**, nominee for appointment as the Chief Officer, Department of Land and Housing.
4. **Mr. Benjamin Kithae Chamia**, nominee for appointment as the Chiefg officer, Department of Roads and Public Works.

H.E. the Governor also forwarded the nominees' *curriculum vitae* and testimonials.

Though a letter dated 21st December 2023 referenced CAK/ADM/15/7/(44) (*Annexure 4*), the Speaker of the County Assembly of Kitui wrote to H.E the Governor requesting him to furnish his office with a report from the County Public Service Board on the selection of the 26 nominees and the criteria for shortlisting of their pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

Further, through a letter dated 23rd December, 2022 referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/41 H.E. the Governor availed the criteria used to arrive at the nominees (*Annexure 5*).

2.2 Notification to the House and Referral to the Committee

Pursuant to the provisions of section 7 of the Act and Standing Order 42(2), the Speaker, through a Communication dated 16th January, 2023 informed the House of the Governor's nominations upon which the names of the nominees stood committed to the Committee on Lands, Infrastructure and Urban Development for consideration.

2.3 Notification to the Public.

Article 196(1)(b) of the Constitution mandates a County Assembly to facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of the County Assembly and its Committees. Section 7(5) of the Act requires that the public should be notified of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven (7) days prior to the public hearing.

In compliance with the above legal provisions, on 23rd January, 2023, the Clerk of Assembly placed an advertisement in print media (*Annexure 6*) informing the public of the public hearings and further requesting them to submit written statements on oath contesting the suitability of any of the nominees. The Committee did not receive any statement(s) on oath contesting the suitability of any of the nominees.

2.4 Notification to the nominees.

Section 7(4) of the Act requires the Clerk to notify a candidate of the time and place for holding an approval hearing by notice in two (2) newspapers of national circulation and by writing. The Clerk of Assembly invited nominees in writing and through media, for the approval hearing, through an advertisement dated 23rd January, 2023 (*Annexure 6*).

2.5 Clearances and Compliance requirements.

The County Assembly wrote to the below listed government agencies requesting them to issue reports on the nominees relating to the matters within the respective agencies' mandate: -

1. Ethics & Anti – Corruption Commission (*the Commission*)

The Commission responded stating that it had neither undertaken any investigations nor recommended prosecution against any of the 4 nominees pursuant to its mandate.

2. Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA)

The Tax Compliance Certificates submitted by the nominees were confirmed by the Kenya Revenue Authority through a letter dated 1st February 2023 as valid (*Annexure 7*).

3. Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI).

The DCI confirmed that the Certificates of Good Conduct held by the nominees were valid and authentic.

4. Directorate of Immigration.

The Directorate confirmed that all the nominees were Kenyan citizens and none of them held dual citizenship.

5. Higher Educations Loans Board (HELB).

The nominees were cleared by HELB through a letter dated 24th January 2023 (*Annexure 8*).

6. Office of the Official Receiver.

The Official Receiver through a letter dated 24th January 2023 (*Annexure 9*) confirmed that none of the nominees had been subject to any insolvency proceedings.

7. Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.

The Registrar of Political Parties through a letter dated 23rd January 2023 (*Annexure 10*) confirmed that none of the nominees were officials of any registered political party.

Universities- Authentication of Nominees' academic certificates.

All the concerned Universities confirmed that the degree certificates held by all the nominees were authentic (*Annexure 11-12*).

8. Kenya National Examination Council.

The Council confirmed that Certificates of Secondary School Education held by all the nominees were authentic (*Annexure 13-16*).

9. Credit Reference Bureau (CRB).

Metropol CRB Ltd and TransUnion CRB Ltd confirmed that the Credit Reference Certificates submitted by the nominees to the County Assembly were valid and authentic (*Annexure 17*).

2.6 Report of the County Public Service Board on the Nominations

Pursuant to the provisions of section 45 of the CGA, the County Public Service Board invited applications from suitably qualified persons for the positions of County Chief Officers, via an advertisement in the Dailies dated 7th October 2022 with the closing date being 14th October 2022.

A total of 1,866 applications were submitted for consideration. 208 candidates were shortlisted for the 26 positions with eight (8) persons shortlisted per position. Interviews were conducted from 23rd November, 2022 to 9th December 2022. Thereafter, the Board submitted the names of candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor for nomination of suitable and qualified candidates.

2.7 Committee proceedings.

The Committee having received the names of the nominees was obligated to conduct approval hearings and make determination of the nominees' suitability or otherwise within 21 sitting days from the 1st sitting as provided for in section 9 of the Act.

The Committee held its first meeting to consider this subject matter on 16th January 2023, and considered its rules of procedure during the exercise and agreed on a framework for the approval hearing, as guided by the applicable laws. It held four (4) sittings within which it examined and reviewed the nominees' certificates and testimonials.

Thereafter, the Committee retreated to prepare its report as from 1st - 4th February 2023 at Mwingi Cottages Resort. The report of the Committee contains its recommendations based on the outcome of the vetting and approval hearings of the nominees.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS FOR NOMINEES TO THE POSITION OF COUNTY CHIEF OFFICER.

3.1. MR. PETER KETONYA MUSYA- DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT AND BODA BODA SECTOR

The nominee appeared before the Committee on 30th January 2023 at 9.00 a. m. and was vetted under Oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Personal background

The Nominee was born on 6th September 1990 in Kyuso Ward, Mwingi North Sub County and is Married.

Academic & Professional Background

The Nominee is Currently Pursuing MSc. in Sociology at the Kenyatta University. He holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science and Sociology from Kenyatta University (2016). He sat for his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) at Ikuu Boys High School Chuka 2007) and his Kenya Certificate of primary Education (2003).

Professional Association

The nominee is not a member of any professional body.

Work Experience

The nominee has a cumulative work experience of four (4) years having worked with Daylink Solutions Limited as a Research Assistant Support Staff from March 2017- to date, Kalonzo Musyoka Foundation as a project administrator in the year 2016 and Nyumbani Village as a research officer from 2014 to 2015.

Clearance as per the Constitution

The nominee presented all the required clearance certificates as required under Chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

Income and net Worth

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings thirty five Million and nine hundred thousand (Kshs. 35,900,000).

Integrity

The nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary Report of inquiry.

Original documents

During the approval hearings, the nominee submitted the following original documents to the committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card
- ii. Academic Certificates
- iii. Clearances from:- DCI, HELB, CRB AND KRA

3.1.1 RESPONSES TO SECTOR THEMATIC QUESTIONS

On Suitability to the Position nominated

The nominee informed the Committee that he possesses relevant skills and knowledge that makes him best suited for this position. He is conversant with the Boda Boda sector having operated and owned several motorcycles. Further, he has been in the leadership of the sector aiming at converting challenges faced into fortunes.

In addition, the nominee stated that he had a competitive advantage on matters transport over other candidates since he was privileged to manage a fleet of vehicles from his former immediate employment.

Understanding of the roles/functions of a Chief Officer

The nominee informed the committee that a Chief officer is the head of human resource personnel as well as the accounting officer in his department. He will

thus implement and actualize all the plans and any other duties that may be assigned to him by the CECM and H.E the Governor.

On improvement of parking areas.

The nominee acknowledged that lack of parking zones has been a major challenge in the County. He committed to collaborate with key stakeholders to identify and put-up parking zones so as to ease traffic and increase revenue collection.

On Misuse of County Vehicles

The nominee appreciated the concerns of the committee where the county vehicles have been used for private purposes. Others had broken and stalled in private garages within then County. He promised to come up with an integrated fleet management system that will solve this issue. Further, he submitted to the committee that once approved, he will repair all vehicles and county machineries that had broken down. Disciplinary action would be taken to the staffs who misuse county vehicles.

Measures to manage human resource

The nominee noted that county staff are not well motivated and some lack requisite skills to discharge their duties. He promised to the committee that if approved, he will ensure he has a motivated workforce through timely payments of their allowances and salary, do capacity building and skills enhancement to meet the demands of the duties assigned.

On increasing number of motorcycle accidents

The nominee informed the committee that there has been increased number of accidents caused by the motorcycle riders which is as a result of reckless driving, non-adhering to traffic rules among others. He promised to fulfil the aspirations of H.E the Governor by training the riders on safety and traffic

rules in conjunction with transport agencies such as NTSA and form SACCOS to manage and regulate the sector.

3.1.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

After listening to the nominee submission, the committee observed that;

1. The nominee meets the Constitutional and statutory requirements relating to the position nominated to.
2. The nominee is academically and professionally qualified for the position since he has all the requisite knowledge and skills to run the docket.
3. The nominee clearly exhibited an understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer and sector responsibilities.

3.2 MR. EVANS MUTEMI MUTUA- DEPARTMENT OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT

The nominee appeared before the Committee on 30th January 2023 at 10.00 a.m. and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and Place of Birth

The nominee was born on 12th May 1996 in Mutonguni Ward, Kitui West Sub County and is married.

Academic & Professional Background

The nominee holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Quantity Surveying from the University of Nairobi (2019). He sat for his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) at St. Charles Lwanga School, Kitui (2014) and his Kenya Certificate of primary Education at Mutulu Primary School (2010).
Professional Association

The nominee is not a member of any professional body.

Work Experience

The nominee has a cumulative work experience of 4 years having worked with Primecost Limited as a project cost manager from January 2022 to date, Sentrim Contract Limited as a Construction Project Manager from March 2021 to November 2021 and Design Cost Limited as an Assistant Quantity Surveyor from June 2019 to January 2021. Further, the nominee is Currently a member of Pending Bills Review and Audit Committee at Kitui County.

Income and net Worth

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings twenty four million and nine hundred thousand (Kshs.24,900,000).

Integrity

The nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary Report of inquiry.

Original documents

During the approval hearings, the nominee Submitted the following original documents to the committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card
- ii. Academic Certificates
- iii. Clearances from:- DCI, HELB, CRB AND KRA

3.2.1 RESPONSES TO SECTOR THEMATIC QUESTIONS Understanding of the roles/functions of a Chief Officer

The nominee informed the committee that a Chief officer is the head of human resource personnel as well as the accounting officer of the docket in charge. He will implement and actualize all the plans and any other duties that may be assigned to him by the CECM and H.E the Governor.

On embezzlement of funds by the County staff during preparation of Bills of Quantities.

The nominee informed the committee that if approved, he will ensure that he is involved in preparation of all Bills of the quantities in the department and ensure officers do pre-visit to the site before preparing Bills of Quantities so as to have a clear picture of the site.

On plans to upgrade other Urban Areas to Town Status.

The nominee acknowledged that there was a need to upgrade other urban areas to towns so as to ensure that residents of those urban areas enjoy services provided by the town administration. Further, he informed the committee that he is conversant with the Cities and Urban areas Act and knows the criteria and process of conferring the town charter. He promised to improve infrastructure, waste management and drainage in the urban areas and fast track operationalization of Mwingi Municipality through the Committee Executive Member (CECM).

On waste Management, Improvement of drainage systems, Street lighting and Kalundu Dump site

The nominee stated that he will take stock of the existing street lights and ensure that repairs are done and the new street lighting will be solar powered so as to cut on electricity bills. To address the issue of vandalisation, he will ensure that the public is sensitized on the importance of the street lights and protecting public property. Further, He promised to fulfill the aspiration of the H.E the Governor on relocating the Kalundu dump site to another area and redesign drainage systems and use storm water for landscaping in Urban areas.

On how to deal with Town Cartels

The nominee acknowledged that there are so many cartels within towns who control all the operations. He promised the committee that if approved he will come up with policies and regulations on waste management and drainage in consultation with the County Executive Committee Member (CECM).

3.2.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

After listening to the nominee submission, the committee observed that;

1. The nominee meets the Constitutional and statutory requirements relating to the office in question.
2. The nominee is academically and professionally qualified for the position since he has all the requisite knowledge and skills to run the docket.
3. The nominee clearly exhibited an understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer and the sector responsibilities.

3.3. MR. MICHAEL MUTISYA KALII-DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND HOUSING

The nominee appeared before the Committee on 30th January 2023 at 11.00 p.m. and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and Place of Birth

The nominee was born on 18th December 1973 in Kiomo/Kyethani Ward, Mwingi West Sub County and is married.

Academic & Professional Background

The nominee is currently pursuing Masters degree in Business Administration specializing in Operation Management from the University of Nairobi. He holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Economics and Mathematics from the University of Nairobi (1999). He has a Diploma in Management Information Systems from the Institute for the Management of Information Systems, United Kingdom (2004). He sat for his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) at St. Joseph's Seminary School Mwingi (1993) and sat for his Kenya Certificate of primary Education at Kairungu Primary School (1989).

Professional Association

The nominee is not a member of any professional body.

Work Experience

The nominee has a cumulative work experience of over 20 years. Currently, he is a Business Consultant. He worked with Faulu bank from March 2016 to May 2021 as the Head of Operations and Customer Service, K-rep Bank (currently Sidian Bank) as the Head of Business Development from July 2013 to 2015, K-rep Bank (Sidian Bank) as the Head of the Operations and Information Technology from 2010 to July 2013 and K-rep Bank (Sidian Bank) as a senior Manager Branch Operations from 2007 to 2009. Further, the nominee is currently a member of the Pending Bills Review and Audit Committee at Kitui County.

Income and net Worth

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings one hundred and fifty seven million, three hundred and eighty seven thousand (Kshs.157,387,000).

Integrity

The Nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary Report of inquiry.

During the approval hearings, the nominee Submitted the following original documents to the committee for confirmation.

3.3.1 RESPONSES TO SECTOR THEMATIC QUESTIONS Understanding of the Relationship Between Chief Officer and the County Assembly Sectoral Committee

The nominee informed the committee that if approved, he will endeavor to consult the sectoral committee and submit quarterly reports on budget implementation on timely basis to enable the sectoral committee to do their oversight role.

On Eradication of Land Grabbing, Squatters in Kanyonyoo and Manyoyoni

The nominee informed the committee that once approved to the position of the Chief Officer, he would ensure that there is a Land Management system and will involve the County Assembly Sectoral Committee to ensure that the department is mandated to control the system. He informed the Committee that he was aware that land grabbing is aided by the county staff and disciplinary actions will be taken against them as a control measure to the issue. Further, he will collaborate with other land agencies to recover government land from grabbers and the process will be done in a humane way.

On the issue of squatters, the nominee noted that the main cause of squatters is the delayed land adjudication and therefore promised that once confirmed to the position he would work closely with the other land agencies to fast track the settlement of squatters.

On the Issue of Land Title Deeds

The nominee indicated that if approved he will start by liaising with other land agencies through H.E the Governor and County Executive Committee Member to fast track issuance of title deeds in the County. Further, he promised to fast track estate administration to ensure title deeds that are still registered under deceased persons are processed to their respective successors.

On Transparency in service delivery

The nominee informed the committee that if approved he will ensure accountability among the County staff, delegation of duties within the department and set clear performance targets for all staff. Further, he indicated that he will employ an open-door policy as way of getting information.

On Land Rates

The nominee informed the Committee that there is need to seal all loopholes in land rates collection to ensure that the county does not lose revenue from land owners. He promised the Committee that if approved he will have an inventory of all land owners, rates supposed to be paid and what the county currently collects. Further, he indicated that systems will be put in place on how to remind land owners to pay their land rates on time and agree on how to settle historical land rates arrears.

On Short-term and Long-term Goals for the Department

The nominee indicated that on short term goals for the department, he will endeavor to reorganize land registry in the County, fast track implementation of the Affordable Housing policy, build capacity and motivate staff in the department and initiate Land Education clinics to the residents of Kitui County. Further, on long term goals he indicated that he will automate approvals for building plans and land rates and collaborate with Land agencies through the H.E the Governor and County Executive Committee Member (CECM) to fast track issuance of title deeds to residents of Kitui.

On affordable Houses for Low Income earners.

The nominee appreciated the fact that the affordable Housing policy had already been approved by the County Assembly and the contractor was already on site. He promised to fast track the construction of the houses and upon completion priority will be given to low income earners.

On Fight Against Corruption in Land Matters

The nominee appreciated the fact that land transactions are marred with a lot of corruption and fraud. He indicated that he would ensure that all land services are automated to deter corruption. Further, he informed the Committee that he will ensure that the Land department has a land information management system to manage land records in a paperless way.

On issue of substandard structures

The nominee acknowledged that due to poor workmanship and use of substandard materials by the contractors has led to collapsing of buildings resulting to loss of lives and properties. He indicated that serious enforcement will be done to ensure that building inspection is done effectively.

On Compensation of land at the High Grand falls Dam in Tharaka Ward.

The nominee informed the Committee that he will endeavor to sensitize residents as a way of ensuring that during compensation they get value for their Land.

3.3.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer, in the Department of Land and Housing, **THAT: -**

1. The nominee meets the Constitutional and statutory requirements relating to the office in question.
2. The nominee is academically and professionally qualified for the position since he has all the requisite knowledge and skills to run the docket.
3. The nominee clearly exhibited an understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer and the sector responsibilities.

3.4 MR. BENJAMIN KITHEE CHAMIA-DEPARTMENT OF ROADS AND PUBLIC WORKS.

The nominee appeared before the Committee on 30th January 2023 at 2.00 p. m. and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and Place of Birth

The Nominee was born on 20th August 1965 in Kyangwithya West Ward, Kitui Central Sub County and is married.

Academic & Professional Background

The nominee has a Masters of Science degree in Construction Engineering and Management from Jomo Kenyatta University (2020), holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Civil Engineering from Jomo Kenyatta University (1990). He sat for his A levels at Kangaru High School (1985), O levels at St. Charles Lwanga School Kitui (1983) and sat for his Certificate of Primary Education at (1973).

Professional Association

The nominee is a member of Engineers Board of Kenya and Institute of Engineers of Kenya.

Work Experience

The nominee has a cumulative work experience of over 30 years. Currently, he is a consultant in Contract Management with Bende Contractors LTD. He worked with Put Sarajevo from 1999- 2017 as the Contracts Manager, Kirinyaga Construction (k) LTD Contracts manager as from November 1990 to 1999.

Income and net Worth

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings seventy one million, three hundred and twelve thousand and five hundred shillings. (Kshs.71,312,500).

Integrity

The nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary Report of inquiry.

During the approval hearings, the nominee Submitted the following original documents to the committee for confirmation.

3.4.1 RESPONSES TO SECTOR THEMATIC QUESTIONS

On his relationship with the County Assembly Sectoral Committee and his understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer

The nominee informed the committee that the two arms of Government are interdependent, and that the office of the chief officer will be accountable to the County Assembly in line with the requirements and guidelines of the relevant laws.

He also submitted to the committee that he will be responsible for implementing the department's policies, and that he would prepare quarterly progress reports to be submitted to the County assembly in line with the public Finance Management Act (2012).

On use of sub-standard materials by contractors

The nominee committed to ensure procurement of high-quality goods for construction and in adherence to the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act (2012). This would ensure quality assurance standards in the department of roads.

He informed the committee that he will have professional quantity surveyors, building inspectors and material technicians who would ensure proper standards are maintained.

On leasing of construction equipment

Based on his technical experience in construction machinery and equipment management, Mr. Benjamin Chamia advised the committee that it would be cheaper and economical for the County Government to own equipment rather than lease the same.

On roads in rugged terrains

The nominee responded to the committee that he has enormous experience in construction and maintenance of roads regardless of the geographical formations and would thus not have a challenge in the varied problematic terrains.

He cited an ongoing construction and tarmacking works of 120km road in extreme areas of Turkana County as a part of his achievements.

On road network;

The nominee stated that he has 32 years of experience in the road construction industry and especially on contract management and would definitely perform well owing to his vast experience.

On road grading, he explained that there are nine (9) graders in the County. Since there are eight (8) Sub-counties, he intends to have one grader in each Sub-County which would do between 2km to 5km per day which would translate to more than 100 km per ward annually.

He submitted that he intends to upgrade and tarmac roads in all ward headquarters and other major towns in accordance with the Governor's Manifesto. He further stated that he would do road mapping for the 40 wards to establish the key roads, classify and prioritize them accordingly.

The nominee stated that he would collaborate with agencies like **KURRA, KeRRA, KENHA and KWS** who manage the roads and advise them accordingly.

On the construction of a cut-line

The nominee alluded that it was indeed important to do a cut line between Kitui and Tana River County. He pointed out that the funds for the cut line had been provided for in the approved supplementary budget I (FY2022/2023). He said that he would collaborate with the National

Government to construct police stations in the area and ensure security is maintained.

On management and motivation of employees in the Department

The nominee responded that he would motivate machine operators and drivers and advise on signing of performance contracts. Further, he will ensure maintenance of machinery and procurement of all consumables in the department. He indicated that he is a hands-on person that would ensure staff are trained on how to do surveys to get accurate data, to inspect the various levels of works and approve appropriately.

He underscored that he would delegate work and enable the staff be accountable as they undertake their duties.

On pending bills;

The nominee informed the committee that he was aware of a committee that was formed by H.E the Governor to look into the pending bills and do verifications of all the projects and give recommendations. Therefore, he intends to implement the recommendations by the committee. To address the issue of pending bills he would ensure that before any contract is awarded, there is a budget for the same.

3.4.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer, in the Department of Roads and Public Works, **THAT:-**

1. The nominee meets the Constitutional and statutory requirements relating to the office he has been nominated.
2. He demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the Country Department and has the requisite abilities,

qualifications and experience to serve as a Chief Officer in the County Department to which he has been nominated.

3. The nominee clearly exhibited an understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer and sector responsibilities.

CHAPTER FOUR

4.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

THAT, having conducted the approval hearings for the nominees pursuant to the provisions of Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, and Standing Order 190 (5)(f) the Committee recommends that this House:

1. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Peter Ketonya Musya** for appointment as the Chief Officer – Transport and Boda Boda Sector by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.
2. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Evans Mutemi Mutua**, for appointment as the Chief Officer – Urban Development by H.E Governor, Kitui County.
3. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Michael Mutisya Kalii**, for appointment as the Chief Officer – Land and Housing by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.
4. **Approves** the nomination of **Mr. Benjamin Kithae Chamia**, for appointment as the Chief Officer – Roads and Public Works by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.




RE: NOMINATION OF PERSONS TO BE APPOINTED AS CHIEF OFFICERS

Following the advertisements for the positions of chief officers (COs) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on 7th October, 2022 and 14th October, 2022 a total of 1,866 applications were received. A total of 208 applicants were shortlisted for the 26 posts with eight (8) persons shortlisted per position. Interviews were conducted from Wednesday November 23rd, 2022 to Friday December 9th, 2022.

After the conclusion of the interviews, the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on Tuesday December 13, 2022 to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

Please note four (4) current chief officers (COs) who were appointed in 2017/2018 by my predecessor H.E. Charity Kaluki Ngilu moved to court on 13th December 2022 alleging their appointments were on permanent and pensionable (P&P) basis and not contractual, among other prayers. The officers were granted conservatory orders by the Employment and Labour Relations Court (ELRC) thus restraining the Governor from appointing new chief officers to the four departments listed below or replacing them as COs until the case is heard and determined. The ex-parte orders were served to the Governors Office on Wednesday December 14, 2022.

The initial court order was extended by the ELRC during an Interparties appearance on Monday December 19, 2022. I am advised the ELRC orders were also served to the County Assembly and I trust they have been availed to you. It is noteworthy the ELRC Court did not injunct the entire recruitment process as prayed by the four applicants/plaintiffs.

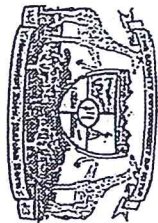

Your letter Ref: CAK/ADM/15/7/(44) dated 21st December, 2022 on the above refers.
We wish to respond to the issues raised as follows:-

1. Rationale for the Post 2022 General Election Departmental Structure

The County Governor is obligated by law to ensure the structuring of the County Government after a General Election in a manner that will most effectively and efficiently deliver on the incoming government's vision and development agenda. This is the letter and spirit of section 30(2) (e) of the County Government Act, 2012.

The **twenty six (26)** departments under the reorganised county government structure were presented to the pre-election County Executive Committee and formed the basis of the Supplementary Budget I that the said County Executive Committee approved on **Wednesday October 19, 2022** and thus complying with the requirements of Section 46 of the County Governments Act, 2012.

It is noteworthy, the said Supplementary Budget I was subsequently forwarded to the County Assembly and was accordingly approved on **Wednesday November 30, 2022**. The **twelve (12)** ministries and **twenty six (26)** departments were part of the Governor's inaugural speech at the opening of the 3rd County Assembly delivered on the

11th October, 2022. Hence, the County Assembly was duly indulged on the matter, as necessary.

The Kitui County Public Service Board equally adopted and maintained the departments and proceeded to prepare advertisements for potential applicants to fill the subject chief officer positions in the **twenty six (26)** departments on the **7th** and **14th October, 2022.**

2. Procedure used to arrive at the nominees including criteria for shortlisting

Following the advertisements for the positions of Chief Officers (CO's) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on **7th October, 2022** and **14th October, 2022** a total of **1,866** applications were received.

The County Public Service Board (CPSB) has advised my office that they were guided by the Constitutional Values and Principles in Article 10 and 232 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, and they used the following criteria to shortlist a total of 208 applicants for the **26** posts with **eight (8)** persons shortlisted per position:

- i. At least one candidate from each of the **Eight(8)** Sub Counties per position where applicable
- ii. At least one candidate from each of the **forty (40)** wards in all the positions where applicable
- iii. Meets the minimum qualifications and experience as per the advert
- iv. Representation of special groups such as Persons Living with Disability (PLWD), Women and Youth
- v. Regional balancing/ County diversity
- vi. Minorities

The County Public Service Board conducted interviews from **Wednesday November 23rd, 2022** to **Friday December 9th, 2022.** After the interviews were concluded the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on **Tuesday December 13, 2022** to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

3. Report of the Kitui County Public Service Board on the selection of the Twenty Six (26) nominees.

The County Public Service Board's report on the scoring and ranking of the candidates shortlisted and interviewed for the **Twenty Six (26)** CO positions is herewith enclosed.



4. Criteria for Nomination for Appointment


After I was satisfied the gender, regional balance etc considerations would be realized, I opted to nominate for appointment all those candidates that were ranked highest by the County Public Service Board *granted the overriding essence of recruitment*
