CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

Mr. Speaker,

This report contains proceedings of the Sectoral Committee on Environment, Energy and Mineral Investments Development during the approval hearings of: -

- 1. David Soi Masai, the nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, Department of Environment and Forestry, and
- 2. Henry Ngilu Nyamai, the nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, Department of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources.

The Honourable Speaker through communication No. 5 of 2023 made on Monday, 16th January, 2023 notified the House of H.E. the Governor's Message vide a letter referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40 dated 19th December, 2022, submitting twenty-six (26) nominees to the positions of County Chief Officers in the different County departments and subsequently committed the nominees to the respective Sectoral Committees for approval hearings. The Speaker directed that the Committees undertake the vetting exercises within twenty-one (21) days and to consider the process as guided by Sections 7, 8 and 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

The Clerk of Assembly notified the nominees and the general public of the time and place for holding the approval hearings through adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation (Daily Nation and Standard newspapers), and the County Assembly Website on Monday, 23rd January, 2023. The advert also invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath on the suitability of the nominees by Thursday, 26 January, 2023 at 5.00 p.m., as envisaged by Section 7(5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. However, at the close of the submission deadline, the office of the Clerk had not received any memorandum contesting the suitability of the nominees for appointment to public offices.

The Assembly wrote to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and Credit Reference Bureau (CRB) seeking authentication of the clearance certificates presented to the Assembly by the nominees.

The nominees; David Soi Masai and Henry Ngilu Nyamai appeared before the Committee on Tuesday, 31st January, 2023 for approval hearings as from 11.30

am and 2.30pm respectively. The Committee examined the suitability of the nominees based on the issues for consideration as set out in Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The Committee keenly examined the nominees' academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of topical sector issues and on chapter six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010; on leadership and integrity all in an endeavor to establish their suitability for appointment as County Chief Officers in the departments nominated to.

The Committee observed that the nominees met the integrity threshold; demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the dockets nominated to; had the requisite abilities, academic qualifications and professional experience to be approved for appointment.

Following the approval hearings pursuant to provisions of Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 as read together with provisions of sections 6,7,8 and 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and provisions of County Assembly Standing Orders Nos. 179(6) and 190(5)(f), the Committee on Environment, Energy and Mineral Investments Development recommends that this Assembly: -

- Approves the nomination of David Soi Masai for appointment as the Chief Officer, Department of Environment and Forestry by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.
- 2. Approves the nomination of Henry Ngilu Masai for appointment as the Chief Officer, Department of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources by H.E the Governor, Kitui County.

1.1 Establishment and mandate of the Committee

The Committee on Environment, Energy and Mineral Investments Development is established under Standing Order No. 190 and is mandated to vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 185 (Committee on Appointments).

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal Framework and appointment process of County Chief Officers

Mr. Speaker,

Section 45 (I)(a) & (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012 requires the Governor with the approval of the County Assembly, to appoint County Chief Officers. Section 45(1)(a) provides that; whenever a vacancy arises in the office of a County Chief Officer, the respective Governor shall within fourteen days nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board. Further, Section 8(a) of Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 (PACAA) requires the County Assembly to consider the procedure used to arrive at the nominee including the criteria for the short listing of the nominees.

The Kitui County Public Service Board while observing Section 65 and 66 of the County Governments Act, 2012 on 7th and 14th October, 2022 advertised for the positions of twenty-six (26) County Chief Officers in the print media and the County Government website with the following requirements to the positions (See annex II):

- a) Be a Kenyan Citizen;
- b) Be a holder of at least a first Degree from a University recognized in Kenya.
- c) A post-graduate qualification in the relevant field will be an added advantage but not mandatory;
- d) Have relevant knowledge and experience of more than five years in the relevant field;
- e) Satisfy the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 on Leadership and integrity;

- f) Be conversant with the Constitution of Kenya and all the devolution related legislations;
- g) Possess an understanding and exhibit commitment to National Values and Principles of Governance and Public Service as outlined in Articles 10 and 232 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 respectively;
- h) Have the capacity to work under pressure to meet timelines;
- i) Have the ability to work in a multi-ethnic environment with sensitivity and respect for diversity;
- j) Be a strategic thinker and result oriented;
- k) Have excellent communication, organizational and interpersonal skills; and
- l) Be computer literate.

2.2 Notification of the Nominations.

Mr. Speaker,

Pursuant to Section 45 (i) (a) of the County Governments Act, H.E. the Governor, Dr. Julius Makau Malombe forwarded to the Speaker of the County Assembly, the names of twenty-six (26) nominees to the positions of County Chief Officers vide a letter referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40 dated 19th December, 2022, for vetting and subsequent consideration for appointment by the County Assembly. (See annex III)

H.E the Governor also forwarded the nominees' curricula vitae and testimonials. Further, upon request by the Honourable Speaker vide a letter referenced CAK/ADM/15/7/(44) dated 21st December, 2022) (See annex IV), the Governor furnished the County Assembly with a report from the County Public service Board on the selection together with the procedure used to arrive at the nominees including the criteria for shortlisting pursuant to the provisions of

Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 through a letter referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/41 dated 23rd December, 2022. (See annex V)

2.3 Committal to Sectoral Committees

The Honourable Speaker via Communication No. 5 of 2023 of 16th January, 2023 notified the House that he had received from H.E the Governor, a list of twenty-six (26) nominees to the positions of County Chief Officers and subsequently committed the same to the relevant sectoral Committees for consideration. The nominees; David Soi Masai and Henry Ngilu Nyamai were committed to the Committee on Environment, Energy and Mineral Investments Development.

2.4 Notification to the nominee and the members of the public

Mr. Speaker,

In line with Section 7(4) and (5) of the PACAA Act, 2017, the Clerk of Assembly placed adverts in the print media (Standard and Daily Nation newspapers) and the Assembly website on 23rd January, 2023 inviting the nominees for vetting on 31st January, 2023 by the Committee on Environment, Energy and Mineral Investments Development (herein after referred to as "the Committee") as from 9.00am at the County Assembly precincts. (See annex VI)

The Constitution of Kenya, 2010 further mandates the County Assembly to involve the general public in its legislative work, other Assembly business and its committees. The advert also notified the public of the approval hearing and invited them to submit written statement on oath regarding the suitability of the nominees to the said positions on or before 27th January, 2023 5.00pm pursuant to Section 7(10) of the PACAA Act, 2017.

2.5 Clearances and Compliance requirements

Mr. Speaker,

The County Assembly wrote to the below government agencies requesting for verification and information on clearance status of the n nominees: -

2.5.1 Ethics & Anti- Corruption Commission (EACC) Ethics and Integrity.

The Commission responded that it had neither undertaken any investigations nor recommended prosecution against David Soi Masai and Henry Ngilu Nyamai (herein after referred to as "the nominees") pursuant to its mandate.

2.5.2 Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA)

Tax obligation.

KRA confirmed through a letter referenced P951433068M dated 1st February, 2023 that the nominees had valid iTax compliance Certificates. (See annex VII)

2.5.3 Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI)

The DCI confirmed that the Certificates of Good Conduct held by the nominees were valid and authentic.

2.5.4 Status of Citizenship

Both the nominees are Kenyan citizens and do not hold dual citizenship.

2.5.5 Higher Educations Loans Board (HELB)

The nominees were cleared by HELB through a letter referenced HELB/RR/112009/199 dated 24th January, 2023. (See annex VIII)

2.5.6 Office of the Official Receiver.

Status of Bankruptcy.

The Official Receiver through a letter referenced OR/COS/01/VOL. 1dated 24th January, 2023 confirmed that none of the nominees had been subject to any insolvency proceedings. (See annex IX)

2.5.7 Office of the Registrar of Political Parties

Political Party affiliations.

The Registrar of Political Parties through a letter referenced RPP/ORG/43/VAOL. II (7) dated 23rd January, 2023 confirmed that none of the nominees were officials of any registered political party. (See annex X)

2.5.8 Universities

Authentication of Nominees' academic certificates.

The Commission for University Education through a letter referenced CUE/10/9/1/Vol. 624 dated 1st February, 2023 confirmed that the Degree – Bachelor of Philosophy from Pontifical Urbaniana University - Rome, presented by David Soi Masai was recognized and authentic.

The University of Nairobi through a letter referenced UON/AA/CEC/1/3 Vol. VIII dated 23rd January, 2023 confirmed that the degree certificates held by Henry Ngilu Nyamai was authentic. (See annex XI & XII)

2.5.9 Kenya National Examination Council (KNEC)

Statement of Examination Results.

The Council confirmed that Certificates of Secondary School Education held by the nominees were authentic. (See annex XIII & XIV)

2.5.10 Credit Reference Bureau (CRB)

Metropol Credit Reference Bureau Limited through a letter refenced MCRB/CERT/01/23 confirmed that the Credit Reference Certificates submitted by the nominees were valid and authentic. (See annex XV)

2.6 Report of the Country Public Service Board on the nomination

As highlighted above in this report, the Honourable Speaker wrote to H.E the Governor, amongst other things, enquiring on the procedure used to arrive at

the nominees including criteria for shortlisting. In his response by a way of letter, H.E the Governor inter-alia stated as follows:

- i. Following the advertisements for the positions of Chief Officers by the Kitui Country Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and the website on 7th and 14th October, 2022 a total of 1866 applications were received.
- ii. That the CPSB was guided by Constitutional Values and Principles as provided in articles 10 and 232 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 in the shortlisting of the applicants to the 26 positions.
- iii. That the below criteria was used to shortlist a total of two hundred and eight (208) applicants with eight (8) persons shortlisted per position;
 - a) At least one candidate from each of the Eight (8) Sub Counties per position where applicable.
 - b) At least one candidate from each of the forty (40) wards in all the positions where applicable.
 - c) Meets the minimum qualifications and experience as per the advert.
 - d) Representation of special groups such as Persons Living With Disability (PLWD), Women and Youth.
 - e) Regional balancing and County diversity
 - f) Minorities

The CPSB conducted interviews as from 23rd November, 2022 to 9th December, 2022 and submitted names of the candidates ranked for each post to the office of the Governor for nomination. Resultantly, H.E the Governor nominated for appointed all the candidates that were ranked highest and forwarded the same to the County Assembly for vetting and consideration

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Mr. Speaker,

Following the Committal of the nominees to the Committee on Environment, Energy and Mineral Investments Development on 16th January, 2023, the Committee sat at rise of the morning sitting and set the ground rules and the work plan for the vetting of the nominees.

From the foregoing, it was agreed that the Committee holds its approval hearings on 31st January, 2023. It is imperative to note that the Committee was guided by Section 8 of the PACAA Act, 2017 which sets out the following issues for consideration in any nomination before the County Assembly: -

- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee including the criteria for the short listing of the nominees;
- (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's credentials, abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

The Committee further interrogated and examined the nominees against the following issues amongst others to ascertain their suitability to the positions nominated to in sittings held on 31st January, 2023 at tent 4 within the Assembly precincts: -

- a) Academic qualifications
- b) Professional training and experience
- c) Professional affiliations
- d) Personal integrity

- e) Potential conflict of interest
- f) Knowledge of the relevant subject
- g) Background and qualities
- h) Overall suitability for the position

CHAPTER FOUR

4.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEES

4.1 DAVID SOI MASAI

David Soi Masai, the nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, Department of Environment and Forestry appeared before the Committee on 31st January, 2023 at 11:30 AM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Citizenship, date and place of birth.

The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1986 in Kauwi, Kitui West Constituency in Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

The nominee holds a Bachelor Degree in Philosophy from Pontifical Urbaniana University, Rome, and Advanced, Intermediate and Foundational Certificates in Research at a post- Graduate Level from Maryknoll Institute of African Studies. He sat for his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education in 2003 at St. Joseph's Seminary Mwingi and obtained a mean grade of C+ (plus).

Work experience.

The nominee has over twelve (12) years of work experience and has been working as a Retail Sales Manager at Britam Holdings (PLC) from 2015 to date. He also worked as a research Assistant at Maryknoll institute of African Studies as from 2010 to 2014.

Income and net worth.

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings Seventy-Eight Million, Seven Hundred and fifty-Six thousand (Kshs. 78,756,000). He further stated that his

current source of income was Commissions from insurance, and sale of crops and produce.

Personal Integrity

The nominee stated that he has never been charged in a court of law nor adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry.

State or public officer.

The nominee stated that he was neither a state nor a public officer.

Original Documents

During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original documents to the Committee for confirmation.

- i) Identification Card.
- ii) Academic Credentials Degree certificate and Advanced, Intermediate and Foundational Certificates in Research at a post-Graduate Level.
- iii) Clearances from DCI, EACC, HELB, CRB and KRA.

4.1.1 GENERAL AND SECTOR-SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

In order to assess the nominee's suitability for appointment to the position, the Committee posed several questions to the nominee as follows: -

i. On how his educational background is relevant to the position

The nominee explained that his educational background in Philosophy would enable him perform his duties effectively especially on research on environmental matters, policy direction and decision making as well as critical analysis of the issues at hand.

- ii. On Duties as a Chief Officer, Department of Environment and Forestry
 The nominee cited several roles that he would undertake as the Chief Officer in
 the Department as follows;
 - a) He would be responsible for managing the department's budget.
 - b) He would provide policy direction and give strategic guidelines in tandem with goals and objectives of department.
 - c) He would be the accounting and authorized officer for the department he would be expected to ensure prudent use and management of financial resources allocated to the department.
 - d) He would be bestowed with the responsibility of ensuring adherence to the Constitution specifically Articles 10 and 232 on National Values and Principles of Governance and the Principles of Public Service respectively. He elaborated that as a Chief Officer, he would be mandated to ensure compliance to the aforementioned.
 - e) He would also be expected to provide framework for the realization of the County Strategic Goals and objectives.

iii. Sand harvesting menace

The nominee explained to the Committee that through the Ministry's CECM, he would push to have a framework on sand harvesting to help protect the environment against degradation and that he would facilitate public participation in areas with tradable sand deposits.

iv. Forest cover for the County and measures to increase the same

The nominee stated that the current forest cover for the County was approximately 6.2%, a decrease from the 2013-2016 cover of 7.2%. He committed to increase the forest cover through tree planting in river banks, institutions and homes. He further reiterated on the need for concerted efforts to

protect the existing County forests and encouraging residents to plant trees in their homes.

v. Sustainable charcoal burning

The nominee observed that approximately 80% of the County residents used charcoal as a common source of energy. He stated that he would collaborate with experts, institutions and departments like energy and agriculture to preserve the eco-system through controlled charcoal burning and seeking alternative sources of energy.

vi. Challenges encountered in the course of duty

The nominee informed the Committee that he would identify the root cause of any challenge arising in the department and that he would involve the right stakeholders to craft long lasting and amicable solutions.

vii. On measures to warrant a competent and motivated workforce

The nominee stated that he would apply his experience and knowledge in Human Resource Management by enforcing performance management to ensure the set goals and objectives for the department are achieved within the specified timelines. He further committed to undertake periodic appraisals with a view of promoting the qualified staff whilst promoting a conducive working environment. Moreover, he reassured that discipline shall be enforced through the control systems that are provided for within the provisions of the Constitution and other relevant laws.

viii. On youth involvement in the fight against climate change

The nominee observed that the youth formed the biggest percentage of the County population and that he would ensure their involvement through tree planting, creation of awareness groups and ward level committees to champion climate change actions.

ix. Management of gifts and donations and conflict of interest

The nominee stated that he would declare any gifts and donations received in the line of duty and that he would distance himself from issues that directly touch on him to avoid influence over the outcome.

4.1.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

The Committee having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire, his Curriculum Vitae and having heard his oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on his suitability for appointment to the position of Chief Officer, Department of Environment and Forestry: -

- 1. THAT, the nominee demonstrated knowledge and understanding of topical and technical issues, the duties and responsibilities and other pertinent issues relating to Environment and Forestry, and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience as envisaged under section 8 of the PACAA Act, 2017.
- 2. **THAT**, the Skills and experience acquired by the nominee on research will be useful in implementing climate change actions, feasibility works on forestry and the overall attainment of the department's objectives.
- 3. THAT, there was no memoranda received from the public contesting his nomination and suitability for appointment to office.
- 4. **THAT**, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 on leadership and integrity, having obtained clearances from the EACC, KRA, DCI, and HELB.
- 5. **THAT**, the nominee has never been charged in a Court of Law or adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry and has no potential conflict of interest,

6. The Committee found the nominee suitable for appointment as the Chief Officer, Department Environment and Forestry.

4.2 HENRY NGILU NYAMAI

Henry Ngilu Nyamai, the nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, Department of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources appeared before the Committee on 31st January, 2023 at 2:30 PM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Citizenship, date and place of birth.

The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1990 in Mutito/Kaliku, Kitui East Constituency in Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

The nominee holds a Bachelor Degree of Science in Geology from the University of Nairobi where he attained a First-Class Honors and a Masters of Science in Geology from the same institution. He sat for his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education in 2007 at Mutito High School and obtained a mean grade of B.

Work experience.

The nominee has over ten (10) years of work experience having worked as:

- Projects Coordinator (Environment and Resilience Department) United
 Nations Development Programme (UNDP) from 2020 to date;
- The Head of Projects (Exploration and Mining) at Savannah Cement from 2016 to 2020;
- The Head of Hydrogeology (Principal Geologist) at Machakos County Government from 2014 to 2016; and
- A Quarry Engineer at ARM (Rhino Cement) from 2012 to 2014.

Income and net worth.

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings Forty-Seven Million and a Hundred thousand (Kshs. 47,100,000).

Personal Integrity

The nominee stated that he has never been charged in a court of law nor adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry.

State or public officer.

The nominee stated that he was currently neither a state nor a public officer. He however informed the Committee that he was once a public officer between from 2014 to 2016 when he worked at Machakos County Government as a Principal Geologist.

Original Documents

During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original documents to the Committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card.
- ii. Academic Credentials Degree certificate
- iii. Clearances from DCI, EACC, HELB, CRB and KRA.

4.2.1 GENERAL AND SECTOR-SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

In Order to assess the nominee's suitability for appointment to the position, the committee posed several questions to the nominee as follows: -

i. On how his educational background is relevant to the position

The nominee explained that field of geology is wide and involves areas such as environmental geology, mining and exploration among others. He stated that

besides introducing the idea of commercial mining he would also support the use of renewable sources of energy like solar, biogas and wind.

ii. On Duties as a Chief Officer, Department of Energy, Minerals and Natural resources

The nominee cited several roles that he would undertake as the Chief Officer in the Department nominated to as follows:

- a) General administration of the department
- b) He would be the accounting for the department
- c) He would provide policy direction and give strategic guidelines in line with goals and objectives of department.
- d) He would also be expected to provide framework for support and realization of the County Strategic Goals and objectives
- e) Execution of other duties as assigned by the CECM.

iii. On enhancing rural electrification across the County

The nominee said he would enhance rural electrification by partnering with institutions in the energy sector such as Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation (REREC), and Kenya Power and Lighting Company (KPLC) to enhance rural connectivity and increased electricity coverage in the County.

iv. On plans to support sustainable sand harvesting and charcoal trade

The nominee noted that there has been sand harvesting and charcoal trade despite an existing ban on both. He however observed that this has not been of substantial benefit to the people of Kitui and committed to establish a taskforce on sand harvesting and supporting the CECM to lift the ban on the two commodities, and to fully operationalize the Charcoal Management Act of 2014 after its review.

v. On distribution of natural and Mineral resources in the County

The nominee stated that the County is well endowed with minerals and natural resources and that there are tradable sand deposits at River Tiva and Kiromboko, Minerals like Coal at Mui basin, Limestone at Ngaie and Kanziko, Gemstones at Mutito kaliku and Kanziko, Copper at Kabati and migwani, Iron ore at Ikutha, and manganese and graphite in Kitui South.

The nominee further stated that he would enhance Mineral tapping by creating awareness and coming up with a County mining and mineral investment policy.

vi. On challenges in mining of minerals in the county

The nominee elaborated on several challenges that have hindered extraction of minerals in the County. These are: -

- a) Land adjudication the nominee stated that lack of title deeds in areas with minerals deposits has prevented or slowed down the investors from undertaking mining activities.
- b) Lack of liaison committees the nominee revealed that most of the areas with mineral deposits lack liaison committees which are supposed to advise the local communities on matters mining. He undertook to review the County regulations so as to ensure that the liaison committees are constituted in a bid to guide the locals in the mineral rich areas.
- c) Lack of awareness He also observed that there has been failure by the County government to engage the Communities and create awareness on mining. He committed to address the same if approved for appointment.

vii. On how to tackle environmental issues relating to the department

The nominee informed the Committee that in extracting the available minerals in the County, he would ensure usage of clean mining technologies; which do not release harmful substances that can pollute the environment and committed to partner with the National Environment Management Authority of Kenya

(NEMA) to control pollution. He further informed the Committee that most of the mining is done by the National Government and County Governments only deal with artisanal mining whereby the Governor is supposed to appoint the chair of the artisanal mining committee.

viii. On plans to utilize sand as a revenue stream in the County

The nominee stated that there is need to have a sand harvesting and management policy and have strict enforcement teams to seal revenue leakages and uphold orderliness in the sand harvesting sites. He further noted that the County can engage in production and sell of by-products of sand like cabros, culverts among other products as additional sources of own-source revenue.

ix. On green energy and how to enhance communities access to green energy so as to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The nominee stated that green energy is the renewable energy such as solar, biogas and wind. He noted that the Sustainable Development Goal number 7 encompasses access to safe and clean energy. He reaffirmed that he would enhance access of communities through collaboration with other institutions such as Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs).

x. On repairs and maintenance of solar security lights

The nominee stated that he would ensure budgetary allocation for repairs and maintenance of existing solar security lights in the budget estimates for every financial year and would undertake periodic inspection of solar security lights to map the non-functional lights for subsequent repairs.

xi. On use of solar energy to supplement National grid

The nominee explained to the Committee that he would initiate establishment of energy centres across the County to enhance the outreach of solar energy and

would seek for strategic partnerships with energy management bodies and NGOs for support.

xii. On measures to warrant a competent and motivated workforce

The nominee stated that he would support training of the staff by institutions like Kenya School of Government among others as a capacity building initiative for the department and would employ participatory approach to issues through inclusivity.

4.2.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

The Committee having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire, his Curriculum Vitae and having heard his oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on his suitability for appointment to the position of Chief Officer, Department of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources: -

- 1. THAT, the nominee demonstrated knowledge and understanding of topical and technical issues, the duties and responsibilities and other pertinent issues relating to Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources, and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience as envisaged under section 8 of the PACAA Act, 2017.
- 2. **THAT**, the Skills and experience acquired by the nominee on matters energy and mining will be useful to the position nominated to.
- 3. THAT, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant Government agencies.
- 4. **THAT**, there was no memoranda received from the public contesting his nomination and suitability for appointment to office.

- 5. **THAT**, the nominee has never been charged in a Court of Law or adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry and has no potential conflict of interest,
- 6. The Committee found the nominee suitable for appointment as the Chief Officer, Department Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources.

CHAPTER FIVE

Following the advertisements for the positions of chief officers (CO's) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on 7th October, 2022 and 14th October, 2022 a total of 1,866 applications were received. A total of 208 applicants were shortlisted for the 26 posts with eight (8) persons shortlisted per position. Interviews were conducted from Wednesday November 23rd, 2022 to Friday December 9th, 2022.

After the conclusion of the interviews, the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on Tuesday December 13, 2022 to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

Please note four (4) current chief officers (COs) who were appointed in 2017/2018 by my predecessor H.E. Charity Kaluki Ngilu moved to court on 13th December 2022 alleging their appointments were on permanent and pensionable (P&P) basis and not contractual, among other prayers. The officers were granted conservatory orders by the Employment and Labour Relations Court (ELRC) thus restraining the Governor from appointing new chief officers to the four departments listed below or replacing them as COs until the case is heard and determined. The ex-parte orders were served to the Governors Office on Wednesday December 14, 2022.

The initial court order was extended by the ELRC during an interparties appearance on Monday December 19, 2022. I am advised the ELRC orders were also served to the County Assembly and I trust they have been availed to you. It is noteworthy the ELR Court did not injunct the entire recruitment process as prayed by the four applicants/plaintiffs.

RE: NOMINATION FOR APPOINTMENT OF COUNTY CHIEF OFFICERS

Your letter Ref: CAK/ADM/15/7/(44) dated 21^{st} December, 2022 on the above refers. We wish to respond to the issues raised as follows:-

1. Rationale for the Post 2022 General Election Departmental Structure

The County Governor is obligated by law to ensure the structuring of the County Government after a General Election in a manner that will most effectively and efficiently deliver on the incoming government's vision and development agenda. This is the letter and spirit of section 30(2) (e) of the County Government Act, 2012.

The **twenty six (26)** departments under the reorganised county government structure were presented to the pre-election County Executive Committee and formed the basis of the Supplementary Budget I that the said County Executive Committee approved on **Wednesday October 19, 2022** and thus complying with the requirements of Section 46 of the County Governments Act, 2012.

It is noteworthy, the said Supplementary Budget I was subsequently forwarded to the County Assembly and was accordingly approved on **Wednesday November 30**, 2022. The **twelve (12)** ministries and twenty **six (26)** departments were part of the Governor's inaugural speech at the opening of the 3rd County Assembly delivered on the

Man

11th October, 2022. Hence, the County Assembly was duly indulged on the matter, as necessary.

The Kitui County Public Service Board equally adopted and maintained the departments and proceeded to prepare advertisements for potential applicants to fill the subject chief officer positions in the **twenty six (26)** departments on the **7**th and **14**th **October**, **2022**.

2. Procedure used to arrive at the nominees including criteria for shortlisting

Following the advertisements for the positions of Chief Officers (CO's) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on **7**th **October**, **2022** and **14**th **October**, **2022** a total of **1**,866 applications were received.

The County Public Service Board (CPSB) has advised my office that they were guided by the Constitutional Values and Principles in Article 10 and 232 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, and they used the following criteria to shortlist a total of 208 applicants for the 26 posts with eight (8) persons shortlisted per position:

- i. At least one candidate from each of the **Eight(8)** Sub Counties per position where applicable
- ii. At least one candidate from each of the **forty (40)** wards in all the positions where applicable
- iii. Meets the minimum qualifications and experience as per the advert
- iv. Representation of special groups such as Persons Living with Disability (PLWD), Women and Youth
- v. Regional balancing/ County diversity
- vi. Minorities

The County Public Service Board conducted interviews from **Wednesday November 23**rd, **2022** to **Friday December 9**th, **2022**. After the interviews were concluded the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on **Tuesday December 13**, **2022** to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

3. Report of the Kitui County Public Service Board on the selection of the Twenty Six (26) nominees.

The County Public Service Board's report on the scoring and ranking of the candidates shortlisted and interviewed for the **Twenty Six (26)** CO positions is herewith enclosed.



4. Criteria for Nomination for Appointment

After I was satisfied the gender, regional balance etc considerations would be realized, I opted to nominate for appointment all those candidates that were ranked highest by the County Public Service Board *granted the overriding essence of recruitment*

of CO's is effective delivery of services to our people. (See attached, my letter Ref. CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40 dated December 19, 2022) Besides educational qualifications and leadership management exposure/experience and potential, I have, to the extent possible, endeavored to observe the 3/3 gender rule, regional balance, intergenerational and diversity inclusivity.

All the county's eight (8) constituencies have at least one Chief Officer (CO) nominee. Eight (8) of the nominees are women with one (1) of them coming from a marginalized/minority community in the county.

Nine (9) of the nominees are aged 37 years or below and Seven (7) of these are youth aged below 35 years. I was advised that none of the Persons Living with Disability (PLWD) qualified for the advertised chief officer positions.


