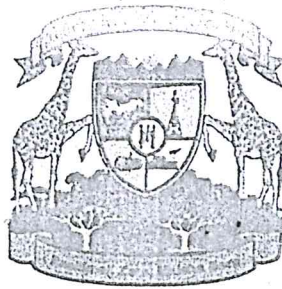



1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee.

1. The Committee on Appointments is established under Standing Order 184 and is mandated to consider for approval by the County Assembly, appointments under Article 179(2) (*Members of the County Executive Committee*).

1.2 Committee Membership.

2. The Committee was constituted by the House on 26th October, 2022 and comprises of the following Members:

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Notification of the Nominations.

3. Pursuant to Article 179(2)(b) of the Constitution as read with section 35 of the County Governments Act (CGA) and section 6 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act (PACAAA, *herein after referred to as "the Act"*), His Excellency the Governor Dr. Julius M. Malombe notified the County Assembly of the nomination of the below listed persons to serve in the Kitui County Executive Committee through a letter dated 4th November, 2022 referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/37 (*Annexure 1*):-

1. Richard John Mwendandu, nominee, Ministry of Energy, Environment, Forestry, Natural & Mineral Resources.
2. Phoebe Ndunyu Mutemi, nominee, Ministry of Culture, Gender, Youth, ICT, Sports & Social Services.
3. Stephen Mbaya Kimwele, nominee, Ministry of Agriculture & Livestock.
4. Rose Mawia Mutuku, nominee, Ministry of Trade, Industry, MSMEs, Innovations & Cooperatives.
5. Peter Mwikya Kilonzo, nominee, Ministry of Finance, Economic Planning & Revenue Management.
6. Ruth Koki Mwanzia, nominee Ministry of Health & Sanitation.
7. Reuben Mulwa Itiko, nominee Ministry of Roads, Public Works & Transport.
8. Joyce Kasyoka Masila, nominee Ministry of Education, Training & Skills Development.

9. Peter Gitonga Nkunda, nominee Ministry of Water & Irrigation.

10. Fredrick Kisong'e Kimanga, nominee, Ministry of Lands, Housing & Urban Development.

4. H.E the Governor also forwarded the nominees' *curriculum vitae* and *testimonials*.

5. Further, through a letter dated 16th November, 2022 referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/38 H.E the Governor availed the criteria used to arrive at the nominees (*Annexure 2*).

2.2 Notification to the House and Referral to the Committee on Appointments

6. Pursuant to the provisions of section 7 of the Act and Standing Order 42(2), the Speaker, through a Communication dated 16th November, 2022 informed the House of the Governor's nominations upon which the names of the nominees stood committed to the Committee on Appointments for consideration.

7. On 22nd November, 2022, Hon. Alex Mutambu Nganga the member for Miambani Ward requested for the Speaker's considered ruling on whether the County Assembly would be acting in breach of section 42(2) of the CGA if it were to proceed and vet the Governor's nominees noting that the said section provided in mandatory terms that the constitution of the County Executive Committee should be finalized within 21 days after the swearing-in of the members of the County Assembly.

8. The Committee on Appointments held a meeting on 22nd November, 2022 where it was resolved that the approval hearings scheduled for 24th and 25th November, 2022 would be deferred to a later date to allow the Committee deal with emerging issues relating to the vetting exercise ad more specifically the Speaker had received letter from EACC advising the County Assembly not to vet the nominees before receiving their integrity reports.

2.3 Notification to the Public.

9. Article 196(1)(b) of the Constitution mandates a County Assembly to facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of the County Assembly and its Committees. Section 7(5) the Act requires that the public should be notified of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven (7) days prior to the public hearing.



10. In compliance with Article 196 and section 7(5) and (10) of the Act, the Clerk of Assembly placed an advertisement in print media (*Annexure 2*) informing the public of the public hearings and further requesting them to submit written statements on oath contesting the suitability of any of the nominees. The Committee did not receive any statement(s) on oath contesting the suitability of any of the nominees.

2.4 Notification to the nominees.

11. Section 7(4) of the Act requires the Clerk to notify a candidate of the time and place for holding an approval hearing by notice in two (2) newspapers of national circulation and by writing. The Clerk of Assembly invited nominees, in writing and through media for the approval hearing through an advertisement dated 8th December, 2022 (*Annexure 3*).

2.5 Clearances and Compliance requirements.

12. The County Assembly wrote to the below listed government agencies requesting them to issue reports on the nominees relating to the matters within the respective agencies' mandate:-

1. **Ethics & Anti – Corruption Commission (*the Commission*)**

Ethics and Integrity.

13. The Commission responded through a letter dated 29th November, 2022 (*Annexure 4*), stating that it had neither undertaken any investigations nor recommended prosecution against any of the nominees pursuant to its mandate.

2. **Kenya Revenue Authority**

Tax obligation.

14. The Tax Compliance Certificates submitted by the nominees were confirmed by the Committee through the KRA's *Itax* certificate checker platform as valid.

3. **Directorate of Criminal Investigations.**

15. The DCI confirmed through a letter dated 13th December, 2022 (*Annexure 5*) that the Certificates of Good Conduct held by each of the nominees were valid and authentic.

4. **Directorate of Immigration.**

Status of Citizenship.

16. The Directorate through a letter dated 30th November, 2022 (*Annexure 6*) confirmed that all the nominees were Kenyan citizens and none of them held dual citizenship.

5. **Higher Educations Loans Board.**

17. All the nominees were cleared by HELB through a letter dated 14th December, 2022 (*Annexure 7*).



6. Public Service Commission.

18. The Public Service Commission issued an advisory to the County Assembly on the issue of vetting public or state officers through a letter dated 14th December, 2022 (*Annexure 8*).

7. Office of the Official Receiver.

Status of Bankruptcy.

19. The Official Receiver through a letter dated 30th November, 2022 (*Annexure 9*) confirmed that none of the nominees had been subject to any insolvency proceedings.

8. Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.

Political Party affiliations.

20. The Registrar of Political Parties through a letter dated 29th November, 2022 (*Annexure 10*) confirmed that none of the nominees were officials of any registered political party.

9. Universities.

Authentication of Nominees' academic certificates.

21. All the concerned Universities confirmed that the degree certificates held by all the nominees were authentic (*Annexure 11-18*).

10. Kenya National Examination Council.

Statement of Examination Results.

22. The Council confirmed that Certificates of Secondary School Education held by all the nominees were authentic (*Annexure 19-29*).

11. Credit Reference Bureau.

Credit Reference.

23. Metropol CRB Ltd and CreditInfo confirmed that the Credit Reference Certificates submitted by the nominees to the County Assembly were valid and authentic (*Annexure 30-31*).

2.6 Issues for consideration during the approval hearings

24. Section 8 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant Committee of the County Assembly shall be:-

- a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee including the criteria for the shortlisting of the nominees;
- b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and



- c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's credentials, abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

In conducting the approval hearings, the Committee was guided by the above legal provision and further interrogated the following issues to ascertain the nominees' suitability:-

i) Procedure for nomination.

25. Article 179(2) (b) of the Constitution as read with Section 35 of the CGA gives the Governor the power to appoint the CEC with the approval of the County Assembly whereas Section 6 of the Act mandates an appointing authority to notify the relevant County Assembly upon nominating a person for appointment in any County Government office requiring County Assembly's approval.

26. In compliance with the above requirements therefore, H.E the Governor notified the County Assembly of the nominations upon which the County Assembly was required to consider the suitability of the nominees.

ii) Constitutional and Statutory requirements.

a) Two third gender rule.

27. Article 27(8) of the Constitution requires the State to take legislative and other measures to implement the principle that not more than two-thirds of the Members of elective or appointive bodies shall be of the same gender.

28. Section 35(2) of the CGA precludes the County Assembly from approving nominations to the Executive Committee which do not take into account the two third gender rule.

b) Representation of regional and ethnic diversity.

29. Section 35(2)(b) and (c) of the CGA precludes the County Assembly from approving nominations to the Executive Committee which do not take into account the representation of the minorities, marginalized groups and communities and community and cultural diversity within the county.

c) Qualifications for appointment as a CECM.

30. Section 35(3) and (4) of the CGA provide as follows:

(3) A person may be appointed as a member of the county executive committee if that person—

(a) is a Kenyan citizen;

- (b) is a holder of at least a first degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
 - (c) satisfies the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution; and
 - (d) has knowledge, experience and a distinguished career of not less than five years in the field relevant to the portfolio of the department to which the person is being appointed.
- (4) A member of the County Executive Committee shall not hold any other State or public office.

d) Leadership and integrity.

31. Article 73(2) provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:
- a) Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability;
 - b) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corruption practices;
 - c) Selfless service based solely on public interest, demonstrated by:
 - i) Honesty in the execution of public duties
 - ii) The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.
 - iii) Suitability of the nominees having regard to whether their abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

32. The nominees' suitability was assessed after scrutiny of their academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, background and qualities as well as their performance during the approval hearings conducted on 15th and 16th December, 2022.

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEES.

33. The Committee held four sittings between 15th and 16th December, 2022 during which it conducted approval hearings and noted the following, THAT:

Article 179(2) (b) of the Constitution provides that the County Executive Committee consists of not more than ten (10) CECMs if the Assembly has thirty (30) or more Members. Therefore this nomination is in line with the above legal provision. The Committee examined the nominees against the criteria set out under section 8 of the Act.



3.1 RICHARD JOHN MWENDANDU

34. Richard John Mwendandu, the nominee for Energy, Environment, Forestry, Natural and Mineral Resources appeared before the Committee on 15th December, 2022 at 9:30 AM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of birth.

35. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1958 in Ikanga Kyatune, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

36. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Forestry from the University of Nairobi, a Post Graduate Diploma in Natural Resources Economics and a Masters of Science in Land Use Planning both from the University of Toronto, Canada.

Work experience.

37. The nominee has over forty years work experience and has been working as an independent consultant since October, 2009 consulting on matters relating to environment, drought and land use amongst others. He also worked as a Director at the Ministry of Environment and Forestry from 2008 to 2018 where he was involved in the global environment discourse, negotiations and natural resource conflict resolutions.

38. He has also worked as an Environmental Planner for Tana and Athi Basins, Project Manager at Kenya Forestry Research Institute (KEFRI), Deputy Project Manager at Dry- Land Agroforestry Research Project and as a National Agro- forester at the Ministry of Agriculture, amongst others.

Income and net worth.

39. The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya Shillings Ninety Million (Kshs. 90 million).

Integrity.

40. The nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

41. The nominee submitted that he was neither a state nor a public officer as he was retired from civil service and was currently an independent consultant.

Original Documents

42. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

- i) Identification Card.

- ii) Degree certificate.
- iii) Clearances from:-DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.

3.1.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.

43. The Committee posed the following sector specific questions to the nominee to which he responded as follows:-

On natural and mineral resources.

44. The nominee highlighted that Kitui County was endowed with minerals like coal, limestone, iron, vermiculite (for fireproofing), and industrial graphite, amongst others.
45. As far as coal mining is concerned the nominee submitted that the 4th Schedule of the Constitution allows for development of policies and framework for engagement with the national government if extraction is to be done. He committed to advocate for mining while spearheading the use of the best available technologies to safeguard both the environment and the people and to ensure there is environmental recovery, safety and equity for the residents.

On encroachment in forests, hills and riparian areas.

46. The nominee stated that Article 69 of the Constitution requires the State to provide a safe and quality environment and there are national laws on encroachment that can be domesticated to suit the local context. For instance, protected areas such as parks are covered by the Protected Areas Act.
47. To deal with this, he committed to review the existing laws and domesticate them and further sensitize the public on the effects of encroaching on such protected areas.

On the status of streetlights and maintenance of the same.

48. The nominee stated that he will take stock of the existing streetlights and ensure that repairs are done. To address damage and theft, he will ensure that the public is sensitized on the importance of the streetlights and protecting public property.

On climate change and increasing forest cover.

49. The nominee stated that the forest cover in Kitui is about 7% and climate change is a global issue and has affected food production, fodder and water amongst other environment dependent things and noted that there was a need to plant more trees so as to increase tree cover. He committed to ensure that there are community large tree nurseries per Ward to reduce the cost of transporting seedlings.



50. The nominee also committed to ensure that there was mitigation through adaptation by sourcing for funding from the Climate Green Fund and Adaptation Change Board, tree planting and grass planting.

On waste management.

51. The nominee stated that waste is not well managed and instruments should be put in place to ensure proper waste management for instance, Kalundu dumpsite is an eyesore and all the waste drains into the river and residents downstream feed on the poisonous waste through the water collected from the river. The nominee committed to put instruments on waste management, ensure relocation of the dumpsite to a more suitable place from town and plant trees on the area to rehabilitate the site.

3.1.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

52. The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the CECM, Energy, Environment, Forestry, Natural and Mineral Resources: THAT:-

53. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as he is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

54. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Forestry from the University of Nairobi, among other professional qualifications. He has over forty years work experience having worked at the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and KEFRI. His academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.

55. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.

56. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which he has been nominated.



3.2 PHOEBE NDUNYU MUTEMI

57. Phoebe Ndunyu Mutemi, the nominee for Culture, Gender, Youth, ICT, Sports and Social Services appeared before the Committee on 15th December, 2022 at 10:30 AM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:-

Date and place of birth.

58. The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen born in 1985. She comes from Kyome Thaana, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

59. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Education (Arts) from Egerton University and Masters of Business Administration (Finance) from Kenyatta University. The Nominee has attained a Certified Public Accountant Part II.

Work experience.

60. The nominee has over ten years work experience and has been working as a Teacher at Kithyoko Secondary School since 2012 up to date undertaking various duties including preparing lesson plans, teaching and evaluating learners, amongst other duties. She has also worked as an Accountant/ office Administrator at Ujamaa Non-Governmental Organization.

Income and net worth.

61. She estimated her net worth to be Kenya Shillings Forty Five Million Nine Hundred and Fifty Thousand (Kshs.45, 950,000/=).

Integrity.


62. The nominee contended that she had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

63. The nominee submitted that she was a teacher employed by Teachers Service Commission and tendered an affidavit (*Annexure 32*) undertaking to relinquish or resign from her position as a teacher upon being appointed as a CECM.

64. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

- i) Identification Card.
- ii) Degree certificate.
- iii) Clearances from:-DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.



3.2.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows:-

On the relevance of her Education and work experience with the Docket.

65. The nominee stated that she has dealt with the youth since she left high school as well as with women in different capacities notably her active participation in Women Self Help groups where she mentioned that she is a member of three different groups where they mainly focus on empowering themselves as well as other women in the society. The nominee further stated that in the self-help groups where she is a member do visit vulnerable groups in the society. This exposure, she stated, gives her an upper hand in serving as the CECM in the docket.

On Youth unemployment.

66. The nominee committed to steer an initiative for form IV leavers who don't qualify to join colleges to go for technical and Vocational Skills training so that they can acquire skills which will help them secure jobs or even employ themselves.

67. The nominee also offered to run sensitization and training programs on savings and investments where the youths will be trained on entrepreneurial skills and they can access credit facilities like the Youth and Uwezo funds.

68. The nominee further committed to oversee the sensitization on the 30% government tenders to the marginalized groups to ensure that the youths benefit from the same.

On PLWDs.

69. Despite the nominee having no statistical data on this particular category of people exhibited her awareness to the challenges facing this category of person's especially in public places and committed to formulate policies that will alleviate these challenges. In her endeavours to economically empower the PLWDs, the nominee committed to ensure that this category of persons benefit from the 30% government tenders preserved for the marginalized.

On Sports and Talent identification and development;

70. The nominee upon stating her awareness of an existing sports policy explained that the policy focuses on talents development as well as infrastructure development. She said she will ensure that she invests in individual talents development as well as teams' development. The nominee further committed to invest in training the coaches of teams as well as upgrading playgrounds. She also committed to steer and sponsor competitions.



On how she would deal with one opportunity being competed for by a youth and a woman.

71. The nominee submitted that she would consult the department and make a decision based on the consultation but where she will be required to make the decision solely as the CECM, she would give the opportunity to a youth because;-
- a) Youth are a key resource and can be very innovative and bring more ideas;
 - b) Youth are energetic and can provide for many people.

3.2.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

72. The Committee, having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and her oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the CECM, Culture, Gender, Youth, ICT, Sports and Social Services: **THAT:-**

73. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

74. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Education (Arts) from Egerton University and a Masters of Business Administration (Finance) from Kenyatta University amongst other professional qualifications. She has over ten years work experience having worked at Kithyoko Secondary School and other institutions. Her academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.

75. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant Government agencies.

76. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County Governments and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which she has been nominated.



3.3 PETER MWIKYA KILONZO

77. Peter Mwikya Kilonzo, the nominee for Finance, Economics Planning and Revenue Management appeared before the Committee on 15th December, 2022 at 11:30 AM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of birth.

78. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1972 in Athi, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

79. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Mathematics/ Economics from the University of Nairobi and is pursuing a Masters in Business Administration (Marketing Option) at McGrath Institute of Business, Australia. He has also undertaken several short courses.

Work experience.

80. The nominee has over fifteen years work experience. He was a Member of the County Assembly of Kitui for two terms for the period 2013-2022. In his second term in the County Assembly of Kitui, the nominee served as the Leader of Majority Party and a Chairperson/ Member of several County Assembly Committees.

81. The nominee is currently a Non- Executive Chairperson of Fashtech Computers Limited where he has previously served as the Executive Chairperson, and Sales and Marketing Manager performing various duties including providing leadership and advise to the Board, promoting effective communication and overseeing operations of the company. He has also worked at Escom Computers as a Sales and Marketing Manager and at MicroLAN Kenya Limited as a Sales Representative.

Income and net worth.

82. He estimated his net worth to be Sixty Million (Kshs. 60 million).

Integrity.

83. The nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

84. The nominee submitted that he is neither a state nor a public officer and tendered an affidavit (*Annexure 33*).

Original Documents.

85. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card.
- ii. Degree certificate.
- iii. Clearances from:-DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.

3.3.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.

86. The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which he responded as follows:-

On safeguarding the Assembly's financial or /autonomy interest.

87. The nominee stated that as a former Majority Leader of Kitui County Assembly, he had been part of the team that was pushing the Senate to ensure that the Assemblies are autonomous financially because a non-cooperative Executive arm of the County government affects oversight, representation and legislation which are the core mandates of the County Assembly.

88. In addition, together with former MCAs, the nominee submitted that they undertook initiatives meant for the good of MCAs like Ward Development Fund and Community Level Infrastructure Development Programme (CLIDP). He committed to honour all CLIDP matters and advocate for a legislation on CLIDP as it was currently anchored on the Governor's goodwill.

89. He has served in the Assembly when salaries were not paid on time and will ensure that payments are made on time. He will ensure that the Assembly does not face any financial challenges.

On timely payment of contractors and service providers.

90. He stated that there are usually procurement plans committing funds which are available. He will ensure that any commitment which satisfies all requirements is paid. For rolling projects, the funds are usually revoted.

On pending bills.

91. He stated that pending bills accumulate through rolling projects or malice advanced through numerous supplementary budgets and unachievable own source revenue targets.

92. To handle this, he committed to set own source revenue targets that are reasonable, achievable and prudent. As is, the Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA) has



projected Kitui as having a potential of collecting Kshs. 1.6 billion revenue per year and therefore he will look into the leakages for improved collection.

On revenue streams.

93. He stated that existing revenue streams need to be improved or operationalized. For instance:-

- i) Hospitals need to have drugs to avoid loss of revenue to the private sector and health facility revenue collectors need to be qualified.
- ii) Agricultural machinery need to be maintained promptly to avoid loss of revenue.
- iii) The valuation roll has not been updated and therefore rates currently charged are low. He will ensure that it is updated for better property rates.
- iv) County houses are unmaintained despite the current higher cost of housing. Therefore they need to be updated for better returns.
- v) Agricultural Training Centre (ATC) products needs to be marketed for better returns and awareness on the center created.
- vi) Liquor licensing controlled by the national government as there are no liquor licensing Boards, leading to loss of revenue. He will ensure that the Boards are operationalized.

On e-revenue.

94. The nominee stated that this calls for introduction of cashless payment systems. Payment systems in Kitui need to be integrated to ensure proper reconciliation. The ICT department should also be well structured to ensure real-time monitoring for better revenue collection management.

3.3.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

95. The Committee having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing, the Committee made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the CECM, Finance, Economics Planning and Revenue Management THAT:-

96. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as he is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

97. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Mathematics/ Economics from the University of Nairobi and is pursuing a Masters in Business Administration (Marketing Option) at McGrath Institute of Business, Australia. He has over fifteen years work

experience having served as an MCA for two terms and worked at Fashtech Computers Limited, Escom Computers Limited and MicroLAN Kenya Limited. His academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.

98. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
99. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County Governments and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM to the county department to which the nominee has been nominated.

3.4 ROSE MAWIA MUTUKU

100. Rose Mawia Mutuku, the nominee for Trade, Industry, ICT, Innovation and Cooperatives appeared before the Committee on 15th December, 2022 at 2:30 PM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:-

Date and place of birth.

101. The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen born in 1969 in Kisasi, Kitui County.


Academic and professional qualifications.

102. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Technology and Management Studies (Accounting) from the University of Nairobi. She also holds a Masters of Business Administration (Strategic Planning) and a Masters of International Relations both from the University of Nairobi and has attended several short courses and trainings.

Work experience.

103. The nominee has over twenty years work experience and current works with Smart Logistics Solution Limited where she has been since 2009 as the Founder and Managing Director. Her duties include implementing and overseeing the company's business operations, liaising with stakeholders, driving its strategic growth, responsible for overall performance of the business, amongst other duties.

104. She has also worked with East African Breweries (EABL) as the Group Supply Chain and Procurement Manager for Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania whereby she undertook strategic planning, oversaw inventory management and financial management.



105. In addition, she has worked at the Ministry of Finance as a Senior Procurement Officer and has been involved in various consultancies.

Income and net worth.

106. She estimated her net worth to be Kenya Shillings Five Hundred and Ninety Million (Kshs. 590 million).

Integrity.

107. The nominee submitted that she had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

108. The nominee submitted that she is neither a state nor a public officer and tendered an affidavit (*Annexure 34*).

Original Documents.

109. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

3.4.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.


110. The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows:-

On what the Ministry deals with.

111. The nominee stated that she will be expected to ensure that the trade function operates to the maximum whereby industries are working and are run by citizens for income and sustainability, create markets for local products, create sustainable way of income generation within the County through trade and industry, ensure that we have cooperatives that are going to work together to do collective production, market and source for quantity and quality products to assist in attracting foreign investment, and ensure commercialization of products originating from the County.

On management of KICOTEC and the Stone Crusher.

112. She stated that these facilities can be utilized to grow the County to the next level and will work together with the County Assembly to review the management of the facilities towards enhancing them to ensure they are beneficial to the residents as the government should facilitate trade. She will also review the existing policies and determine whether



they are beneficial, economically viable and whether public private partnerships can be utilized for better management and provision of employment opportunities.

On areas of untapped trade potential.

113. She informed the Committee that Kitui has many untapped trade areas including agribusiness, forestry, mining, warehousing system for cereals and sand packaging.

On value addition.

114. She stated that value addition is turning a primary product into a secondary or tertiary product. She stated that various products from Kitui can be used to produce other valuable products towards generation of more income and revenue as opposed to being used for consumption purposes. For instance, mangoes to make concentrates, enzymes, sweeteners which have longer shelf life. Green grams can be used in the cosmetic industry, sorghum for cosmetics and pharmaceuticals, sandal wood, dried pumpkins and sweet potatoes export amongst others.

On application of the Warehouse Receipt System in Kitui.

115. She informed the Committee that she has been a Board Members of the Warehouse Receipt System (WRS) Council and was part of the team that advocated for the governing Act. The system has a lot of potential in Kitui as collectively, produce can be warehoused and a financial back up system put in place that pays farmers immediately. The produce is held in the warehouse for certain periods and sold at higher prices and farmers are paid more and the County collects better revenue, which can lead to higher turnover for products.

On innovation incubators.

116. She stated that the County is ready for innovation incubators and we have the resources including land, knowledge and people. The County Assembly should consider putting up a catalyst fund for innovation labs to expose the citizens especially the youth into these ventures.

On relevance of academic background to the position.

117. She informed the Committee that she worked as a procurement officer with the Ministry of Finance and as a result understands negotiations and contracting amongst others. She also sits in various boards including WRS and understands trade as she has traded locally and internationally in the course of her duties. She has brought in donors and can attract foreign direct investment (FDI) through grants and investors and can provide connections to markets for products as she is a Member of various bodies including Kenya Manufacturers Association and Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO) amongst others.



3.4.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE.

118. The Committee, having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and her oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the CECM, Trade, Industry, ICT, Innovation and Cooperatives, THAT:-
119. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
120. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Technology and Management Studies (Accounting) from the University of Nairobi. She also holds a Masters of Business Administration (Strategic Planning) and Masters of International Relations, both from the University of Nairobi.
121. She has over twenty years work experience having worked at Smart Logistics Solution Limited, East African Breweries (EABL) and Ministry of Finance. Her academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.
122. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
123. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County Governments and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which she has been nominated.



3.5 STEPHEN MBAYA KIMWELE.

124. Stephen Mbaya Kimwele, the nominee for Agriculture and Livestock appeared before the Committee on 15th December, 2022 at 3:30 PM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:-

Date and place of birth

125. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1985 in Kivou, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

126. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Commerce Degree (Finance) from Catholic University and a Master of Business Administration (Finance) from Egerton University. He is currently pursuing a Doctorate in Business Administration at the University of Nairobi. He is also a certified Public Accountant (CPA) and has attended several trainings and courses.

Work experience.

127. The nominee has over 10 years work experience and is currently the Hospital Administrator at Port Florence Community Hospital, Kisumu whereby his duties include supporting the hospital's strategic, business and operational plans; formulating finance and marketing policies, strategies, programs and regulations; developing the hospitals budgets, negotiating partnership amongst other duties.

128. He has also worked as a Hospital Administrator in Mwhila Mission Hospital Kakamega and Ganjoni Hospital Mombasa, a Marketing Manager at Intermax Oil Limited and Banoda Oil Limited as a Territory Manager, Depot Manager and Accountant, and at Citi Bank as a Clerk.

Income and net worth.

129. He estimated his net worth to be Kenya shillings Twenty One Million (Kshs. 21 million).

Professional Associations and Membership.


130. He is a Member of the Institute of Certified Public Accountants of Kenya (ICPAK) Member Number 21653.

Integrity.

131. The nominee submits that he has never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

132. The nominee submitted that he is neither a state nor a public officer and tendered an affidavit to that effect (*Annexure 35*).

3.5.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.

134. The Committee posed several questions to the nominee to which he responded as follows:

On commercialization of farming.

135. He stated that to ensure income generation from farming, he will formulate policies that encourage large scale farming, ensure capacity building of farmers, come up with seed distribution programmes, look for markets for farm produce and advocate for mindset change towards farming.

On Apiculture.

136. The nominee informed the Committee that Kitui is known for honey production, he will come up with policies to ensure that sensitization programmes on bee keeping are undertaken and advocate for new ways of bee keeping. In addition, he will ensure that value addition measures are undertaken including partnering with other Ministries for establishment of a processing plant to package honey.

On livestock farming value addition.

137. The nominee stated that the Governor's Manifesto provided for marketing and he will further come up with policies on livestock breed improvement for better animal products such as milk and meat.

On agricultural extension services.

138. The nominee stated that extension officers are usually facilitated with motor bikes and he will come up with relevant policies and ensure proper facilitation of veterinary officers to reach farmers.

On job creation through agriculture.

139. The nominee noted that he would advocate for mindset change towards agriculture and ensure that capacity building exercises are undertaken to attract the youth into farming. He committed to work with the Ministry of Water and Irrigation towards water harvesting, construction of dams, water pans and this will encourage youth to take up farming.

On strategies to enhance agriculture and livestock farming.

140. The nominee submitted that the Governor's manifesto provided for livestock and food crop farming improvement which will be achieved through various means including purchase of two (2) tractors per Ward to help farmers prepare their farms in time and livestock breed improvement through Artificial Insemination.

3.5.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

141. The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing, the Committee made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the CECM, Agriculture and Livestock; THAT:-
142. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as he is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
143. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Commerce Degree (Finance) from Catholic University and a Master of Business Administration (Finance) from Egerton University. He is currently pursuing a Doctorate in Business Administration at the University of Nairobi. He has over 12 years work experience gained from working as Hospital Administrator in various hospitals, and also working at Intermax Oil Limited and at Banoda Oil Limited. His academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.
144. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all government agencies.
145. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County Governments and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which the nominee has been nominate.



3.6 RUTH KOKI MWANZIA:

146. Ruth Koki Mwanzia, the nominee for Health and Sanitation appeared before the Committee on 16th December, 2022 at 9:30 AM and was vetted under oath. The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of birth.

147. The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen born in 1976. She comes from Mulango, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

148. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Environmental/ Public Health from Moi University and is currently pursuing a Masters in Public Health (Epidemiology and Population Health) at Maseno University. She also holds several Diplomas and Certificates from different institutions.

Work experience.

149. The nominee has over seventeen years work experience and is currently working as a private academic and content writer and also undertakes women empowerment activities with GROOTS Kenya. She also worked with Kasule Vital Voices Community Based Organization in Kisumu.

150. The nominee was the CECM for Health and Sanitation, Kitui County Government between 2013-2017 where her duties included implementation of relevant legislations, spearheading policy and strategy formulation amongst other duties.

151. She has also worked with World Vision Kenya as a Regional Development Officer, Development Facilitator, Deputy Programme Manager, Coordinator and Programme Manager.

152. In addition, she has worked with Family Health International, Kenya Clinical Officers Association, Horizons Institute of Advanced Management and other institutions.

Income and net worth.

153. She estimated her net worth to be Kenya Shillings Fifty Million Six Hundred and Six Thousand (Kshs. 50,606,000/=)

Integrity.

154. The nominee submitted that she had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry:



State or public officer.

155. The nominee submitted that she is neither a state nor a public officer and tendered an affidavit (*Annexure 36*).

Original Documents.

156. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation:

3.6.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

157. The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows:

On theft of drugs and corruption in health facilities.

158. The nominee submitted that treatment in health facilities cannot be complete without the dispensing of drugs which has been frustrated by theft and corruption in hospitals. She agreed that this is a situation that must be stopped.

159. The nominee submitted the following as some of the initiatives she will employ in dealing with this menace:-

- a) Automation of services- the nominee submitted that there is already automated system in Mwingi and Kitui general hospitals although she noted that the same were very general. She suggested adoption of integrated automated system up to dispensary level that can be monitored from a central point; and
- b) The nominee also suggested applying confidential reporting system where members of the public can report cases of corruption and theft.

On Governor's manifesto.

160. The nominee submitted that the Governor has undertaken to improve the health of the people of Kitui by doing the following:-

- a) Ensuring that the fourteen hospitals that are Kitui county are brought to real hospital standards in terms of Human Resource, Equipment and supply of drugs, pharmaceutical and non-pharmaceutical; and
- b) Having one Health centre in each ward- the nominee noted that Kitui County had fifty six (56) health centres which were more than the wards in Kitui County. She submitted that it would require the department to establish which wards have more

and which wards have none and the population that can be served by the health centres.

On Ambulance services.

161. The nominee submitted that Kitui County currently had forty six (46) ambulances with twenty two (22) being operational and twenty four (24) being non-functional.

162. The nominee undertook to ensure that ambulance services are available and all ambulances are working within her first one hundred (100) days in office. To further improve this services, she undertook to:-

a) Establish an Ambulance Command Centre from where the services shall be operated and provide a number through which the people of Kitui may call to request ambulance services. The nominee further indicated that she will sensitize the people of Kitui on the availability of the said services; and

b) Since ambulances provide emergency services, provision of fuel to them was a critical management issue to which she would establish a system and modalities through which they are fuelled to ensure that they are able to attend to patients.

c) On the cost of ambulance services which she noted was Kshs. 11,400/=, the nominee submitted that charges for such services depended on the distance undertaken by the ambulance and noted that the driver should be facilitated by the county government. She undertook to make proposals for adoption by the County Assembly on what needs to be done to improve ambulance services in Kitui County.

d) On how the available ambulances are shared, she noted that Mwingi and Kitui General Hospitals should have more ambulances because of the kind of care they provide but undertook to look at how the ambulances are currently shared to see where the gap is and address the same.

On NHIF assistance initiative by the County Government.

163. The nominee noted that this was an initiative where the County Government assisted poor families in meeting the cost of paying for NHIF for a period of time. She noted that the initiative was established in the spirit of initiating universal health coverage in the county and the same is due to end sometime in the year 2023.

164. The nominee committed to look at the program and how it operated and determine how to extend the same.

On snake bites and the unavailability of snake anti-venom.

165. The nominee acknowledged that snake bites are a menace in Kitui County. The nominee further noted that there might be cases where death or disability as a result of a snake bite could be considered medical negligence on the part of a health officer and cases where the same may not be considered as negligence. She noted that where a patient comes to a health facility and a health officer despite the availability of a snake anti-venom refuses or fails to administer the snake anti-venom on time leading to death or disability then this may be classified as medical negligence.
166. The nominee however noted that where the snake anti-venom is not available, then such a health officer may not be considered negligent as procurement of medical supplies is done at a different level.
167. The nominee also submitted that she would endeavour to ensure that the County governments identifies strategic areas/places in the whole county and have facilities equipped with snake anti-venom and trained staff to administer the anti-venom. For storage, the nominee noted that in areas without electricity, she would ensure solar powered refrigerators for storage of the anti-venom and further inform the people of Kitui where to access the anti-venom.
168. On prevention of snake bites, the nominee noted that she would be pushing for the people of Kitui to be sensitized to clear bushes around their homes, ensure there are no rodents in their homes and further ensure that there are no water masses within their compounds.
169. The nominee further noted that since World Health Organization (WHO) had classified snake bites as one of the most neglected African tropical diseases, she would be requesting her counterparts in other counties in the ASAL region to form a front through which the counties can get help from WHO.

On why oath of office was necessary.

170. The nominee noted that taking oath of office was important as the same was a personal commitment from the nominee to do the right thing and to be truthful and honest to the people the nominee has been appointed to serve.

On incomplete health facilities/dispensaries.

171. The nominee submitted that she will be guided by the Health Operationalization Policy (HOP), this policy looks at the distance that patients cover and the cost and time spent to access medical services especially from level 2 facilities.

172. The nominee informed the Committee that the County had not been able to operationalize some of the health facilities and in the interest of equity and owing to the limited resources, the nominee committed to first give priority to areas where the patients have to walk for a distance of more than thirty (30) kilometres with intend of ensuring that patients only cover five (5) kilometres to access medical services.

On casuals that have worked for County Government and have not been paid.

173. The nominee submitted that she was aware of the case of casuals who had not been paid. She undertook to look at the available records to establish who had worked and for what period and plan their payment.

On the K-CHIC programme.

174. The nominee submitted that in her understanding, this programme was a form of insurance for the people of Kitui County where they were contributing some money for purposes of accessing medical services. She noted that through the program, ante-natal services and family planning services had improved. She undertook to study the report on the performance of the program and whatever lessons can be learned from the program and determine whether to advance it.

3.6.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE.

175. The Committee, having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and her oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the CECM, Health and Sanitation; THAT:-

176. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

177. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Environmental/ Public Health from Moi University and is currently pursuing a Masters in Public Health (Epidemiology and Population Health) at Maseno University. She has over seventeen years work experience having worked as the CECM for Health and Sanitation, Kitui County Government, GROOTS Kenya, Kasule Vital Voices Community Based Organization, World Vision Kenya amongst other organizations. Her academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.



178. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.

179. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County Governments and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which she is nominated.

3.7 MR. REUBEN MULWA ITIKO

180. Eng. Reuben Mulwa Itiko, the nominee for Roads, Public Works and Transport appeared before the Committee on 16th December, 2022 at 10:30 AM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of birth.

181. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1962 in Chuluni, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

182. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Nairobi. He has also attended several trainings and courses.

Work experience.

183. The nominee has over thirty years work experience and has worked with the National Water Harvesting and Storage Authority where his duties included general administration, preparation of budgets, procurement plans, work plans, supervision and management of construction of water projects among others.

184. He also worked at Northern Water Services Board as Deputy Chief Executive Officer, the In-Charge of Water Services and the Head of Business Unit. He has also worked with Ministry of Regional Development Authorities, Kisumu Water and Sewerage Company Limited, Kandara and Kahuti Rehabilitation Water Projects.

Income and net worth.

185. He estimated his net worth to be Sixty Six Million Three Hundred and Eighty Four Thousand (Kshs. 66,384,000/=)

Professional Associations and Membership

186. The nominee is a member of the following professional bodies-

- a) Engineers Board of Kenya (E.B.K) - Reg. No. EBK-A 1960.
- b) Institute of Engineers of Kenya (M.I.E.K) - Reg. No. M-2484.

Potential conflicts of interest

187. The nominee stated that he does not have any persons or matters that would present potential conflicts of interest should he assume the position he has been nominated to. The nominee however acknowledged that his daughter worked as an engineer in the department that he was being vetted to head and undertook to the committee that if there were to arise a potential conflict of interest situation then he would advise professionally and declare his interest.

Integrity.

188. The nominee contended that he has never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary.

State or public officer.

189. The nominee submitted that he is neither a state nor a public officer and tendered a letter dated 20th September, 2021 showing that he had retired from public service (*Annexure 37*).

Original Documents.

190. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card.
- ii. Degree certificate.
- iii. Professional bodies registration certificates.
- iv. Diplomas.
- v. Clearances from:-DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.

3.7.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE


191. The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which he responded as follows:-

On relating his education and experience to the position.

192. The nominee submitted that he had a wealth of experience from his service in the national Government's Water Ministry as a civil engineer. He also stated that he was properly trained as a civil engineer and very well exposed to matters on Water, Roads and Buildings.

On Frequent breakdowns of County graders and fuel shortage.

193. The nominee stated that he was in charge of vehicles, plants and equipment while at the national governments ministry of water and admitted that it was a very challenging area



to manage. The nominee said that he would advocate for the government to buy fuel in bulk and store it in centralized stores where it would be issued from. This he says would ensure proper control.

On opening of new County roads.

194. The nominee demonstrated awareness of an existing draft policy on opening of county roads and dozing which he committed to do a follow up to ensure it was forwarded to the County Assembly for approval. Once the policy is approved, the nominee committed to start opening county roads, a program that is in tandem with the governor's manifesto.

On repairs and maintenance of feeder roads.

195. The nominee would advocate for use of County machinery as opposed to engaging contractors as according to him this would be much cheaper. The nominee indicated that the use of County Machinery as opposed to contracting would cut the costs by half.

196. The nominee also said he would have service crew stationed at strategic places near where the machineries are operating to ensure they offer support where and when necessary.

197. The nominee further indicated that he would work towards lowering the cost of tendering by ensuring that the engineers developing BoQs strictly follow the manuals with the recommended rates.

On the poorly done projects.

198. The nominee proposed to involve the locals whenever a project is being handed over to the contractor and notify them on the scope of works to be undertaken so that they can monitor. The nominee would also ensure that regular spot checks are done by an officially assigned officer who should take responsibility incase anything goes wrong.

199. The nominee further submitted that a contractor who does substandard work would be forced to re-do the same otherwise he/she would not be paid. Further, if an inspection committee is proved to have been compromised goes ahead to approve incomplete or poorly done works, then they will face consequences for their actions.

On timely payments to contractors

200. The nominee committed to ensure that contractors are paid within one month upon completion of their works. He said he would fast track the inspection and acceptance

of the projects as soon as the projects are completed. He further said that he would advocate for the payment of genuine pending bills before new projects are given.

3.7.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE.

201. The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the CECM, Roads, Public Works and Transport, THAT:-

202. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as he is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

203. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Nairobi. The nominee has over thirty years work experience and worked at the National Water Harvesting and Storage Authority as a Coordinator where his duties included general administration, preparation of budgets, procurement plans, work plans, supervision and management of construction of water projects amongst other projects.

204. He also worked at Northern Water Services Board as Deputy Chief Executive Officer, the In-Charge of Water Services and the Head of Business Unit, he has worked with Ministry of Regional Development Authorities, Kisumu Water and Sewerage Company Limited, Kandara and Kahuti Rehabilitation Water Projects. His academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.

205. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.

206. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which he has been nominated.



3.8 JOYCE KASYOKA MASILA

207. Joyce Kasyoka Masila, the nominee for Education, Training and Skills Development appeared before the Committee on 16th December, 2022 at 11:30 AM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of birth.

208. The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen born in 1969. She comes from Zombe-Mwitika, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

209. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood Development and Education) from South Eastern Kenya University and a Diploma in Early Childhood Development and Education.

Work experience.

210. The nominee has over twenty five years' work experience and is currently working as an ECDE Teacher at Thua Primary School. She has also worked as an untrained teacher at Zombe Girls Secondary School and at St. John's Malivani Secondary School in Makueni.

Income and net worth.

211. She estimated her net worth to be Kenya Shillings Five Million Seven Hundred Thousand (Kshs. 5,700,000/=).

Potential conflicts of interest.

212. The nominee stated that she did not have any persons or matters that would present potential conflicts of interest should she assume the position to which she has been nominated.

Original Documents.

213. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card.
- ii. Degree certificate.
- iii. Diplomas.
- iv. Clearances from:-DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.

214. Upon scrutinizing the Identification Card, the Committee established that the nominee's name on the ID and the name used by the Governor in nominating her were different. The nominee was vetted as JOYCE KASYOKA MASILA and was asked to prove her name as submitted by H.E the Governor and was unable.

Integrity.

215. The nominee has never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

216. The nominee submitted that she was currently an ECDE teacher employed by the County Government of Kitui and tendered an affidavit (*Annexure 40*) undertaking to resign once appointed as the County Executive Committee Member.

3.8.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

217. The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows:-

On relating her education and experience to the position.

218. The nominee stated that she holds a diploma in ECDE education and a Bachelors degree of Education in Early Childhood Development and that her experience as an ECDE teacher makes her suitable for the position.

On handling the distance covered by children and teachers to access ECDE centers.

219. The nominee submitted that this is a major area of concern for her. She committed to initiate establishment of feeder ECDE centers whose proximity is about 2-3 kilometers.

On village polytechnics;

220. The nominee did not demonstrate any knowledge on the number of polytechnics in Kitui County and gave wrong data on the number of polytechnics where she said they were 52 instead of 48. The nominee did not demonstrate knowledge on the distribution of these village polytechnics and their staffing levels. She however demonstrated knowledge on the courses they offer.

On the absorption of the ECDE teachers to Permanent and Pensionable Terms.

221. The nominee submitted that it has been the ECDE teachers cry to be absorbed to permanent and pensionable terms, a move she said would act as a motivator to the teachers. The nominee submitted that she would urge the Budget Committee to allocate more funds towards actualizing this.

On her duties as a CECM.

222. The nominee highlighted the following as her duties;-

- i) Supervising ministry programs;
- ii) Ensuring proper utilization of resources in the ministry;

- iii) Supervising administration and service delivery in the ministry;
- iv) Ensuring capacity building to teachers and field officers; and
- v) Implementation of the ECDE curriculum.

On the Governor's manifesto.

223. The nominee submitted that ECDE is among the governor's priorities and that the Governor had committed to construct an ECDE classroom in every public primary school. She also said that the governor in his manifesto, had committed to install ICT equipment in every polytechnic.

On regulating the privately owned child-care facilities.

224. The nominee defined a child-care facility as a place where children below the age of three years are placed for primary care. To regulate them, the nominee said that she would ensure that the facilities are secure for the kids and that the care-givers employed in those facilities are qualified and well trained. She however did not mention some of the regulatory frameworks that she would be proposing.

3.8.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

225. The Committee, having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and her oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the CECM, Education, Training and Skills Development, THAT:-
226. The nominee's name on the submitted identification document and the name submitted by H.E the Governor were different and as such, the person nominated by the Governor and the person who appeared before the Committee for vetting were two different people.
227. The nominee submitted an Affidavit of name but the Committee resolved that as per the law the Affidavit could not cure that anomaly in this case since the Committee considered the name on Identification document as the nominee's legal name as opposed to the name submitted by H.E the Governor.
228. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

229. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
230. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood Development and Education) from South Eastern Kenya University and a Diploma in Early Childhood Development and Education and is currently working an ECDE Teacher at Thua Primary School.
231. The nominee has over twenty five years' work experience most of it gained from working as an untrained teacher at Zombe Girls Secondary School and St. John's Malivani Secondary School in Makueni and has not held any management position in her teaching career.
232. The nominee did not demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and does not have the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which she has been nominated.

3.9 PETER GITONGA NKUNDA

233. Peter Gitonga Nkunda, the nominee for Water and Irrigation appeared before the Committee on 16th December 2022 at 2:30 PM and was vetted under oath. The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of birth.

234. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1975 in Tharaka, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

235. The nominee holds a Bachelors Degree in Tourism Management from Moi University and a Masters in Project Planning and Management from the University of Nairobi. He is currently pursuing a Doctorate in Community Development at Tharaka University College. He also holds certificates in Human Resource Management and Travel Management.

Work experience.

236. The nominee has over twenty years work experience and worked as the CECM Tourism and Natural Resources, Kitui County Government between 2013- 2017 and Acting CECM, Lands, Infrastructure, Housing and Urban Development in the County Government of Kitui between 2015-2017 where he involved in financial management, tourism management, project planning and management, monitoring and evaluation.

237. He has also worked as the Project Director for Deliverance Church Kaloleni and Programme Officer for Tharaka Integrated Development Assistance in Kitui County.

Income and net worth.

238. He estimated his net worth to be Kenya Shillings Eight Million Five Hundred Thousand (Kshs. 8,500,000/=)

Integrity.

239. The nominee submitted that he has never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

240. The nominee submitted that he is neither a state nor a public officer and tendered an affidavit to that effect (*Annexure 38*).

Original Documents.

241. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card.
- ii. Degree certificate.
- iii. Diplomas.
- iv. Clearances from:-DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.

3.9.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

242. The Committee posed several sector specific questions to the nominee to which he responded as follows:-

On how his work experience is related to the docket.

243. He stated that he has a lot of experience in community development work as he was involved in development programmes which included provision of water services to the community like piped water supply and drilling boreholes. When he was pursuing his Masters degree in Project Planning and Management, he learnt about planning, implementation and reporting various community projects. He worked with the County Government as a CECM for Tourism and Natural Resources and was during his tenure appointed as the Acting CECM, Lands. This gives him wide perspective in leading and managing the docket effectively.

On addressing water scarcity.

244. He stated that Article 43(1)(d) of the Constitution provides for the right to safe and clean water and mandates various actors particularly the County Government to take

measures to ensure realization of this right. The 1st County Government's overriding goal in this sector is to ensure that citizens are able to access water within 2 kilometers. As a CECM he will ensure that this is addressed through various strategies and programmes, particularly implementation of the Governor's manifesto on water provision through construction of mega dams, drilling of boreholes, sand dams, pipeline extensions, rock catchment areas development, amongst others.

On stalled water projects.

245. He stated that he will conduct an audit of the existing water projects to determine their status through public participation and conduct assessment to determine what needs to be done for each project to ensure that they are beneficial to the residents. The Ministry is usually allocated budgets for repairs and maintenance of projects every year.

On the proposed High Grand Falls Dam.


246. He stated that this is a National Government project meant to be implemented as from 2023. The community does not have information on the implementation of the project or resettlement plans. Despite it being a national government project, he will be proactive in ensuring that public participation is done to ensure that citizens are informed in advance so as to prepare themselves psychologically and that adequate compensation is made.

On the controversial drifts investigated by the EACC.

247. He stated that it was during his tenure as the Acting CECM Lands that some drifts became a subject of investigation by the EACC in 2017. He however stated that most of the issues raised therein were largely political as it was towards the election period. After EACC conducted investigations, it was confirmed that the drifts were actually constructed and of standard quality, they cleared them and according to him, most the contractors have been paid and residents are still benefitting from those projects. He informed the Committee that he was never mentioned in the investigations and was only called by the EACC to appear as a witness.

On the Kitui water companies.

248. He stated that we have two water companies that is KITWASCO and KIMWASCO. KITWASCO has been facing mismanagement issues touching on billing, irregular connections and integrity issues. He will conduct audit on the company operations to know the structural and human resource challenges affecting the company and come up with strategies or decisions for proper management of the companies to ensure efficiency and effectiveness in offering services including pipeline extensions and stop dependency on subsidies.



3.9.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

249. The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing, the Committee made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the CECM, Water and Irrigation; THAT:-
250. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as he is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
251. The nominee holds a Bachelors Degree in Tourism Management from Moi University and a Masters in Project Planning and Management from the University of Nairobi. He is currently pursuing a Doctorate in Community Development at Tharaka University College.
252. The nominee has over twenty years work experience gained from working as a CECM, Project Director and Programme Officer. His academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.
253. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been by cleared all the relevant government agencies.
254. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which he has been nominated.

3.10 FREDRICK KISONG'E KIMANGA

255. Fredrick Kisong'e Kimanga, the nominee for Lands, Housing and Urban Development appeared before the Committee on 16th December, 2022 at 3:30 PM and was vetted under oath.

The Committee noted the following:-

Date and place of birth.

256. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1976 in Kithumula/ Kwa Mutonga, Kitui County. .



Academic and professional qualifications

257. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Government and Literature from the University of Nairobi and a Masters Degree in Public Administration from Moi University. He has also undertaken several short courses and trainings.

Work experience.

258. The nominee has over twenty years work experience. He is currently a Senior Deputy County Commissioner in Mukurweini where his duties include chairing security meetings, peacebuilding and conflict management, coordination of national government projects, amongst others.

259. He has also worked as a Deputy County Commissioner, Under Secretary/ State Functions at the Executive Office of the President, Assistant County Secretary at the County Government of Kitui, Senior Assistant Secretary and Assistant Secretary at the Office of the President, District Officer, amongst others.

Income and net worth.

260. He estimated his net worth to be Kenya Shillings One Hundred and Twenty Five million (Kshs. 125 million).

Integrity.

261. The nominee submitted that he has never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or Public officer

The nominee submitted that he is public officer and will relinquish his position once approved. (*Annexure 39*).

Original Documents.

262. During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original document to the Committee for confirmation.

- i. Identification Card.
- ii. Degree certificate.
- iii. Diplomas.
- iv. Clearances from:-DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA.

3.10.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.

263. The Committee posed several questions to the nominee to which he responded as follows:

On the Mwingi Municipality.

264. The nominee informed the Committee that legally there is no Mwingi Municipality as the County Assembly approved the Charter which was assented to by the Governor but the conferment was not done. It is a political process that involves the residents and a Municipal Board has to be set up, which was not done.

265. If approved, in collaboration with the County Assembly, the process can be fast tracked to ensure that the Municipality is operationalized and this will help in increasing revenue, services and general efficiency.

On illegally acquired or grabbed public land

266. He stated that the public service is guided by the principles and values of public service and land grabbing allegations indicate that County staff must have been involved in the dealings. Given an opportunity, he will preside over a civil service guided by the principles and values of public service where corruption is a thing of the past. He will deal with any errant officer engaging in corruption and ensure that if public land has been grabbed, it is repossessed.

On double allocation of land.

267. He stated that there is need to have a land management system domiciled in the lands office as opposed to County Treasury in a bid to ensure accountability and revenue officers attached there. There is therefore need to invest in technology and digitize land records so as to minimize fraud. Rogue officers also need to be dealt with as any fraud in lands involves officers serving in the Ministry and cultivate a culture of transparency, accountability and non- corruption.

On management of the boda boda sector.

268. He informed the Committee that the *boda boda* sector contributes greatly to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and the Governor's manifesto provides for a Department to deal with *boda boda*. Through public participation, stakeholders will be consulted to agree on planning of the town as designated stages can be put up outside the town center so as to decongest the town.

On affordable housing.

269. He stated that there were two affordable housing projects one at Manyenyoni and the other one opposite Tanathi offices whereby the County Government went into a public private partnership. Ground breaking was done but no construction is ongoing. If

approved, he will study the agreements and in consultation with the County Assembly determine how these projects can be fast-tracked and viability of the projects as the County is in need of affordable housing.

3.10.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

270. The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the CECM, Lands, Housing and Urban Development, THAT:-

271. In accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as he is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.

272. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Government and Literature from the University of Nairobi and a Masters Degree in Public Administration from Moi University. He has over twenty years work experience having worked as a Senior Deputy County Commissioner, Deputy County Commissioner, Under Secretary State Functions at the Executive Office of the President, Assistant County Secretary at the County Government of Kitui, Senior Assistant Secretary and Assistant Secretary at the Office of the President, District Officer, amongst others. His academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.

273. The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all the relevant government agencies.

274. The nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CECM in the county department to which the nominee has been nominated.

4.0 COMMITTEE GENERAL OBSERVATIONS.

275. All the nominees were vetted and assessed in line with the criteria provide for under section 7(9) of the Act.

276. That the nomination of all ten (10) nominees fulfilled the provisions of section 35 of the CGA as it met the conditions set therein.

277. Pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Committee observed that the following nominees met the integrity threshold, demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the dockets to which they had been nominated and had the requisite abilities, academic qualifications and professional experience to be approved for appointment:-

1. Richard John Mwendandu, nominee, Ministry of Energy, Environment, Forestry, Natural & Mineral Resources.
2. Phoebe Ndunyu Mutemi, nominee, Ministry of Culture, Gender, Youth, ICT, Sports & Social Services.

4. Rose Mawia Mutuku, nominee, Ministry of Trade, Industry, MSMEs, Innovations & Cooperatives.

6. Ruth Koki Mwanzia, nominee, Ministry of Health & Sanitation.

* 278. Further, that pursuant to section 8 of the Act, the Committee observed the following concerning JOYCE KASYOKA MASILA:

- i) The nominee's name on the submitted identification document and the name submitted by H.E the Governor were different and as such, the person nominated by the Governor and the person who appeared before the Committee for vetting were two different people.
- ii) The nominee submitted an Affidavit of name but the Committee resolved that as per the law the Affidavit could not cure that anomaly in this case since the Committee considered the name on Identification document as the nominee's legal name as opposed to the name submitted by H.E the Governor.
- iii) The nominee did not demonstrate knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the dockets to which she had been nominated and

did not have the requisite experience and competencies and is therefore not suitable to be approved for appointment.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

SUB: ADVISORY ON VETTING OF NOMINEES TO THE KITUI COUNTY SERVICE BOARD

Your letter on the above matter dated 12th December, 2022 refers.

The Public Officers may be vetted by the Assembly and if approved the Assembly informs H. E. the Governor that the appointments of the public officers is subject to their resignation or being granted leave of absence by the Commission.

Regulation 38 of the Public Service Commission Regulation 2020 provide as follows

- (1) *"The Commission may grant leave of absence to a public officer on recommendation of the authorized officer through the relevant Human Resource Management Advisory Committee for a period not exceeding three years which may be extended only once for a period not exceeding three years.*
- (2) *Where an officer is appointed on contractual terms of a public body for a period exceeding three years, the Commission may grant leave of absence for the duration of the contract.*
- (3) *Leave of absence may be granted to a public officer for purposes of taking up contractual appointments within a public body, private corporation or international organization to which the officer cannot be seconded or to which service cannot be transferred;*

Provided that an officer may only be granted leave of absence to a private corporation where the Commission determines that the experience and expertise that the officer shall gain from the private organization shall be of benefit to the public body which the officer is from.

- (4) *Leave of absence may be granted to a spouse of a foreign service officer who has been posted outside Kenya during the tour of service of the foreign service officer.*
- (5) *Leave of absence shall not be increment-earning.*
- (6) *During a leave of absence, the public body will not make a contribution of its portion towards an officer's pension under contributory pension scheme.*
- (7) *Despite paragraph (6), an officer undertaking a leave of absence may continue to contribute towards the officer's pension under contributory pension scheme during the leave of absence.*
- (8) *The period of leave of absence shall not be pension-earning within the provisions of the Pensions Act.*
- (9) *Upon completion of the period of leave of absence, a public officer shall revert to the terms and conditions of service appropriate to their substantive position in the public body and shall not be eligible for another leave of absence within a period of three years from the period of the leave of absence".*

Nomination is not an appointment. The Appointment will only be made after the vetting and approval by the County Assembly, a State Officer or Public Officer is not therefore required to resign before vetting, they can resign and or be granted leave of absence after the vetting and approval by the Assembly.


Joyce Kasyoka Masila nominee for Education, Training and Skills Development was not approved by the Committee on Appointments due to the following reasons,
