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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWARD

This Report contains proceedings of the County Assembly's Sectoral Committee on Culture, Youth, Sports, Gender and Social Services during the approval hearings of **Ms. Bretta Mwikali Mwangangi**, nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, County department of Culture, Gender and Social Services and **Mr. Nason Kang'alya Kilonzo**, nominee for appointment as Chief Officer, County department of Sports, Youth, ICT and Innovation as requested by H.E. the Governor and communicated to the House by the Speaker on Monday, 16th January 2023.

The Hon. Speaker vide a communication made on Monday, 16th January 2023 conveyed to the House the Message from H.E. the Governor and subsequently referred the names of the nominees, their curriculum vitae, and the criteria of nomination to the Sectoral Committee for approval hearings.

Pursuant to sections 7, 8 and 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017, the Committee would conduct the exercise within twenty-one (21) days.

On Monday, 23rd January 2023, the Clerk of the Assembly notified the nominees and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Assembly Website of the date, time and venue of holding the approval hearings.

In compliance with section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act No. 5 of 2017, the Clerk of the Assembly in the same advertisement, invited members of the general public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominees in conformity with section 7 (5) of the same Act. The memoranda were to be received by Thursday, 26th January 2023 at 5 p.m. However, at the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum against the nominees' suitability. The Clerk of the Assembly also wrote to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations

(DCI), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and Credit Reference Bureau (CRB) seeking authentication of the nominees' clearance certificates submitted to the Assembly by the appointing authority.

The nominees appeared before the Committee on Tuesday, 31st January 2023 for vetting. The Committee examined the suitability of the nominees based on the criteria set out in Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act No. 5 of 2017. In addition, the Committee examined the nominees' academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on Leadership and Integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominees; any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the offices in question and suitability of the nominees for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities met the needs of the County Departments.

Committee Recommendation

The Committee having held approval hearings on the nominees regarding their suitability, observed that due process was followed on the recruitment process as provided for under Section 45 of the County Governments Act (2012). The Committee thus recommends that the County Assembly of Kitui **APPROVES** the nomination of **Ms. Bretta Mwikali Mwangangi**, for appointment as Chief Officer, County department of Culture, Gender and Social Services and **Mr. Nason Kang'alya Kilonzo**, for appointment as Chief Officer, County department of Sports, Youth, ICT and Innovation.

CHAPTER ONE

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Sectoral Committee on Culture, Youth, Sports, Gender and Social Services is one of the Twelve sectoral committees of the County Assembly of Kitui established pursuant to the provisions of Section 14(1)(b) of the County Governments Act, 2012 and **Standing Order 190**.

The mandate of the Committee pursuant to the **Standing Order 190 (5)** is inter-alia;

- a) make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.
- b) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- c) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
- d) study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- e) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives.
- f) **vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any other law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 185(Committee on Appointments).**

1.2 Subjects under the Committee

In accordance with the second schedule of the standing orders, the committee is mandated to consider the following subjects; - Culture, Gender, Youth, Sports, ICT, Innovation and Social Services.

In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the programs being implemented by the County Ministry of Culture, Gender, Youth, Sports, ICT, Innovation and Social Services.

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Legal Framework

The office of the Chief Officer is established under section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 which provides as follows:

45(1) the Governor shall—

- (a) Nominate qualified and experienced County Chief officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board; and*
 - (b) With the approval of the County Assembly, appoint county chief officers.*
- (2) The office of a county chief officer shall be an office in the county public service.*

The Chief Officer shall be responsible for the following functions amongst others as provided under section 45 (3) of the County Governments Act:

- (a) A county Chief Officer shall be responsible to the respective county executive committee member for the administration of a county department as provided under section 46;*
- (b) The County Chief officer shall be the authorized officer in respect of exercise of delegated power.*
- (c) The governor may re-assign a county chief officer.*
- (d) A county chief officer may resign from office by giving notice, in writing, to the governor.*

2.2 Advertisement by the County Public Service Board

The Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB), placed an advert in the Star Newspaper of Friday, 7th October, 2023 for sixteen (16) vacant posts of County Chief Officers in the County Government of Kitui as follows:- Public Service and General Administration, Performance Contracting, Disaster and Emergency Services, Decentralized Units, SEKEB And Inter – Governmental Relations, Governors Service Delivery Unit And Public Communication, Tourism, Hospitality And Game Reserve, Medical Services, Drugs And Medical Supplies Management, Public Health and Sanitation, Culture Gender and Social Services, Youth Sports, ICT, and Innovation, Roads and Public Works. Finance, Revenue Management and

Accounting, Economic Planning and Budgeting, Trade, Industry SMES And County IEZs, Transport and Boda-Boda Sector, Cooperatives and Citizen Groups Economic Empowerment Innovation.

The CPSB invited applications from qualified, results-oriented and self-motivated citizens to fill the vacancies, which written applications enclosing detailed curriculum vitae, Copies of academic and professional certificates and ID card clearly indicating the position applied for on the envelope were to be submitted in a sealed envelope and addressed to the Secretary/CEO Kitui County Public Service Board P.O. Box 33 - 90200, KITUI or delivered by hand at the reception desk at Kitui County Public Service Board Offices located along prison – KEFRI road to be received on or before 5:00 p.m. on Friday, 21st October 2022.

2.3 Interviews and Short listing

Interviews for shortlisted Chief Officer applicants took place from 23rd November to 9th December 2022. In short listing the CPSB used the criteria of ensuring that at least each of the eight (8) sub counties gets at least one candidate, at least one candidate from each of the forty (40) wards in all positions where applicable, the candidates meet the minimum qualifications and experience as per the advert, representation of special groups (PLWD, Women and Youth), Regional balancing/county diversity and the minorities work experience, gender representation and representation of Kenya's diverse communities/ethnic diversity, affirmative consideration, special groups and regional balance.

2.4 Selection Criteria by the CPSB

In order to reach the names of candidates to forward to the H.E. Governor for consideration of nomination, the CPSB conducted interviews on shortlisted candidates pursuant to the provisions of Article 179 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012, Sections 6 to 11 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, section 2.5.5 of the Kitui County Public Service Boards Recruitment and Selection Policy and Section C.1.1 of the Human Resource Policies and Procedures Manual for the County Public Service 2017.

The advert for the position of Chief Officers (CO's) attracted 1,866 applications. A total of 208 applicants were shortlisted from the 26 posts with 8 persons shortlisted per position, interviews were conducted from Wednesday November 23rd, 2022 to Friday December 9th, 2022.

After conclusion of the interviews, the CPSB submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the office of the Governor on Tuesday December 13th, 2022 to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

2.5 Notification and Submission of names to the County Assembly

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 (Revised 2020), Sections 6 to 11 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 190 (5)(f) of the County Assembly Standing Orders, His Excellency the Governor Julius Makau Malombe Vide a letter Ref: CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40 dated 19th December, 2022, H.E. the Governor submitted names of 26 which included the two nominees to the Ministry of Culture Gender, Youth, Sport, ICT and Innovation nominees to the County Assembly for vetting and approval namely:-

1. Mrs. Bretta Mwikali Mwangangi – Culture, Gender and Social Services.
2. Mr. Nason Kang'alya Kilonzo – Youth Sports, ICT and Innovation

2.6 Speaker's Communication and Committal to the Committee.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 7 (1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Hon. Speaker through a communication from the chair committed the names of the nominees for appointment to the position of County Chief Officer in the various ministries including the two appointees to the Ministry of Culture, Sports, ICT Gender and Social Services on Monday 16th January, 2023 and thereafter referred the two names to the Committee on Culture, Youth, Sports, Gender and Social Services for vetting and report to the Assembly within 21 Days.

2.7 Notification to the nominees

Subsequently, in accordance to Section 7(4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media, specifically the Star Newspaper dated 23RD January, 2023, inviting the nominee for vetting before the Assembly Sectoral Committee on Culture, Youth, Sports, Gender and Social Services 31st January, 2023 as from 9.00 a.m. at the Assembly Precincts.

In the advertisement, the nominees were asked to avail their original copies of the following documents for the vetting exercise, namely –

- a) Curriculum vitae;
- b) Academic Certificates and testimonials;
- c) Certificate of Good Conduct from the Police;
- d) Clearance from the Higher Education Loans Board;
- e) Clearance from the Kenya Revenue Authority; and
- f) Clearance from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission;

2.8 Notification to the public

Further, the Clerk of the County Assembly notified the public to submit memorandums by way of written submissions on oath regarding his suitability, in support of or against the nominee on or before 27th January 2023.

In view of the above-mentioned and in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, Section 45 of the County Government Act, 2012, Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and the Standing Orders 190 of the Kitui County Assembly Standing Orders, the Committee on Culture, Youth, Sports, Gender and Social Services proceeded to undertake the approval hearings as scheduled.

The Committee did not receive any memorandum in support or against the nominees.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS

The Committee conducted approval hearings for the nominees on 31st January 2023. In conducting the vetting exercise, the committee was guided by, among other documents, the County Governments Act, 2012, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, and the County Assembly Standing Orders.

The Committee examined the nominees using the guidelines in the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The Committee also considered the following in the vetting of the nominees: -

- a. Academic Qualifications
- b. Employment record and work experience
- c. Professional association
- d. Public office, political activities and affiliations
- e. Potential conflict of interest
- f. Tax compliance
- g. Vision and Leadership
- h. Integrity
- i. Expectations and Key priorities

3.1 MS. BRETТА MWIKALI MWANGANGI

Ms. Mwikali was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during vetting as follows;

3.1.1 Personal Background

The nominee is a female Kenyan born on 17th July, 1985 in Matinyani Ward in Kitui County. The nominee confirmed that she is a Kenyan Citizen and did not hold any other citizenship.

3.1.2 Academic and Professional Qualifications

The nominee holds a Bachelor of Education (Primary with Special Needs option) from African Nazarene University (attained second Class Honors – Upper Division)- in 2012. She also holds a Diploma in Management from the Kenya Institute of

Management (attained a Credit) – in 2013, She also holds another Diploma in Special Needs Education (attained a Credit) – in 2007, She attended Kamwenja Teachers Training College (attained a P1 Certificate) – in 1991. She sat for her Kenya Certificate of Education in St. Mary's Girls High School in 1986 and Certificate of Primary Education in Matinyani DEB Primary School in 1982.

3.1.3 Employment Record

The nominee is a Head Teacher at Kithendu Primary – Machakos County (2010 to date). She has also served as a head teacher in the following schools:

1. Ndalani Primary School 2011 – 2018 – Matinyani Sub County (Kitui County)
2. Kavisi Primary School 2010 – 2011 – Katulani Sub County (Kitui County)

Duties and Responsibilities.

- i. Working as the Teachers Service Commission Agent within the School.
 - ii. In charge of school development both physical and social infrastructure.
 - iii. Supervision of curriculum implementation
 - iv. Provision of quality education to learners.
 - v. Creating academic programs for learners that meet national standards.
 - vi. Working closely and communicating with learners' parents.
 - vii. Helping assess learners needs and development.
 - viii. Management and stewardship of school resources.
3. Deputy Head Teacher 2009 – 2010 - Unyaa Primary School – Kitui Central Sub County (Kitui County)

Duties and responsibilities.

- i. Principal assistant to the head teacher.
 - ii. In charge of learner's discipline and welfare.
 - iii. In charge of support staff.
 - iv. In charge of managing school stores.
 - v. Taking minutes during staff meetings.
4. Assistant Teacher 1991 – 2009 – A.I.C Matinyani Primary School.

3.1.4 Professional Association and memberships

The nominee is a registered member of the Teachers Service Commission (TSC)

3.1.5 Potential conflict of interests

The nominee declared that she currently does not have any persons or matter that would present a potential conflict of interest should she assume the office of the Chief Officer for Culture, Gender and Social Services. She further informed the committee that, should a conflict of interest arise, she would declare the interest in writing to the appointing authority as stipulated by the Law.

3.1.6 Other issues under consideration

Integrity

The Committee heard that the nominee had neither been charged in a court of law nor had been adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of any legislative Assembly. She further stated that she had not been dismissed or otherwise removed from Office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

Sources of income and net worth

The nominee notified the committee that her current net worth is Kshs.76M with sources of income including salary from The Teacher Service Commission, Family House worth Kshs 2.5M, 3 acres of land worth Kshs 3M, 2 family cars worth Kshs 2M, a plot worth Kshs 2M, 8 acres of land worth Kshs 8M, 8.2 acres of land worth Kshs 58M Kitui Teachers Sacco shares worth Kshs 600,000 and business investment.

Pro-bono/Charity work

The nominee is involved in charity work and contributed given education support to two needy children at Kithendu Primary School and St. Angela's Girls High School.

3.1.7 General and sector specific questions to the nominee

In order to assess the nominee's overall suitability for the position, the Committee examined the nominee on general and specific thematic areas which the nominee responded to as follows: -

On understanding the role of a Chief Officer in the Department she was being vetted for;

The nominee explained her personal role as a Chief Officer in the Department she was being vetted for and stated them, among others, as the following; -

1. That she will be in charge of administration in the department,
2. That she will be the Accounting and Authorized Officer for the department,
3. That she will endeavor to ensure that there is effective and efficient management of financial and human resources,
4. That she will be responsible for developing and implementing policies and programs for effective service delivery and any other duty as she will be assigned by the CECM or the Governor.

On the plans to put in place to make cultural festivals annual and visible events in Kitui County;

The nominee stated that cultural festivals bring people together and having them annually will not only enhance social life as well as a means of earning revenue. If approved, the nominee will work hand in hand with the committee to push for more budgetary allocation to the department to be able to carry out such activities. The nominee submitted that with adequate budgetary allocation, she will be able to plan and organize for two cultural festivals in a year.

On what she would do to ensure our artists especially the Kamba dancers to benefit economically from their art;

The nominee stated that the department she was being vetted for was a strong and dynamic one as she acknowledged the need to embrace and enhance the Kamba culture. She further noted that contemporary music was lucrative as she quoted some of the famous Kamba music artists who are earning lots of money from their art. If approved, the nominee committed to establish a government funded recording studio to help the artists and musicians record their productions cheaply.

On measures she would put in place to ensure that Kamba Culture becomes a source of tourism-revenue;

The nominee submitted that if approved, her department will venture into mapping and developing cultural sites which she believes will attract tourists both locally, nationally and internationally. Upon mapping and developing the sites, the nominee would use every other available means especially media platforms to market the sites so as to attract more tourists.

On bringing on board the Persons Living with Disabilities in the implementation of programs and projects in the department;

The nominee informed the members that she holds a diploma in special needs education and a degree on the same and therefore serving this category of persons is a matter close to her heart. She submitted that she is their advocate and she will ensure that they are well taken care of by implementing the governor's program in her manifesto which seeks to register this category of persons with the National Council for people living with disabilities and the treasury to allow them access to the 5% government procurement opportunities on top of the 30% opportunities reserved for the marginalized groups.

On addressing the Socio-Cultural factors that hinder gender mainstreaming in Kitui County;

The nominee offered to apply a multisectoral approach in responding to this question. She submitted that women had been elevated in the society at the expense of men, thus leaving the boy child vulnerable. If approved, the nominee stated that she will not leave the men to suffer but will accord all genders equal opportunities in all aspects. She admitted that most men were suffering in silence for lack of people to advocate for their needs and rights.

On addressing gender-based violence;

The nominee acknowledged that gender-based violence was rampant in the society and that there was need to handle the issue with the seriousness it deserves. The nominee committed to work with the relevant County Assembly committee to

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establish rescue centers where the victims of gender-based violence can be taken for counselling and offering them safety until they recover. The nominee also proposes to have lawyers to advocate for the rights of victims of gender-based violence.

On stalled projects of Social Hall that were constructed by the first regime;

The nominee, once approved, undertook to complete such stalled projects and equip them. She will then put them into proper use either by hiring them out to generate revenue and allow for practical activities for CBC children so as to nature their skills and talent.

3.2 MR. NASON KANG'ALYA KILONZO

Mr. Kilonzo was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during vetting as follows;

3.2.1 Personal Background

The nominee is a male Kenyan born on 24th November, 1990 in Kyangwithya West Ward in Kitui County. The nominee confirmed that he is a Kenyan Citizen and did not hold any other citizenship.

3.2.2 Academic and Professional Qualifications

The nominee is currently pursuing a Master Degree in Statistical Science at Strathmore University. The nominee holds a Bachelor of Science in Actuarial Science with IT from Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology (attained second Class Honors – Upper Division)-in 2016. He sat for his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education in Matinyani Boys Secondary School in 2010 and Kenya Certificate of Primary Education in Unyaa Primary School in 2005.

3.2.3 Employment Record

The nominee is a Sales Executive consultant at Car and General LTD (2021 up to date). He has served in the following positions:

1. Statistics Office at Frontman Consultants (May 2019 – May 2021) - Mombasa/Kilifi Cluster from October 2016 - December 2017. Also served as a participant in project review of projects, coordinated data collection

- exercise by social worker, conducted the needs assessment for individual PAP'S on projects related engagement and monitoring major statistical indicators through quarterly collected data for reporting to the world bank.
2. Research Assistant at Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (July 2018 – May 2019) and served in conducting literature and data searches for ongoing research projects, provided other research, writing, edited support for various reports of land in new areas and cleaned and conducted statistical analysis of complex data bases in strata.
 3. Research Assistant at TADE (K) LTD (January 2018 – May 2018). He served to conduct literature reviews, maintain accurate records of interviews and summarize project reports. He also prepared, maintained and updated the website materials and monitored projects budget.
 4. Claim analyst Intern at Mayfair Insurance Company (MIC) March, 2015 – August 2015. He served in reviewing requests for claim denial, clear data and claim exceptions ensure deficiencies are flagged correctly. He also provided support in handling general liability, property, builders risk and auto claims where applicable.

3.2.4 Potential conflict of interests

The nominee declared that he currently does not have any persons or matter that would present a potential conflict of interest should he assume the office of the Chief Officer for Sports, Youth ICT and Initiatives. He further informed the committee that, should a conflict of interest arise, he would declare the interest in writing to the appointing authority as stipulated by the Law.

3.2.5 Other issues under consideration

Integrity

The committee heard that the nominee had neither been charged in a court of law nor had been adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of County Assembly. He further stated that he had not been dismissed or otherwise removed from Office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

Sources of income and net worth

The nominee notified the committee that his current net worth is Kshs.32M with sources of income including salary from Car and General Co. LTD, Family House worth Kshs 4M, ¼ acres of land at Utawala worth Kshs 6M, 1 family car worth Kshs 1M, a plot at Muluu worth Kshs 3M and 5 acres of ancestral land worth Kshs 20M,

3.2.6 General and sector specific questions to the nominee

In order to assess the nominee's overall suitability for the position, the Committee examined the nominee on general and specific thematic areas which the nominee responded to as follows: -

On his role as the Chief officer for Youth, Sports, ICT and Innovations;

The nominee explained his personal role as a Chief Officer in the Department he was being vetted for and stated them as follows;

1. THAT he will be in charge of administration of the Sports, Youth, ICT and Initiatives Department and she will be the Accounting and Authorized Officer responsible for:
2. THAT he will be the strategic policy direction overseer in the department,
3. THAT he will be the accounting officer of the department,
4. THAT he will be expected to oversee implementation of sub-departmental and sectoral plans as well as steering County strategic policies and initiatives as envisaged in the current Kitui vision for economic and social transformation,
5. THAT he will be expected to co-ordinate performance management systems through continuous performance evaluation to improve service delivery and efficiency,
6. THAT he will be expected to implement and oversee coordination of intergovernmental programs and any other duty that may be assigned to him by the CECM.

On how he will improve Sports and talent promotion;

The nominee underscored the importance of sport as a social integration tool in the society. He stated that he was aware of the dilapidated state of playgrounds in all the Forty (40) Wards. If approved, the nominee undertook to implement the Governor's manifesto under the program; Youth empowerment and Sports which entails improvement of the sports facilities in the County by ensuring that; levelling of playgrounds, construction of daises, changing rooms and terraces for spectators, a move he believes would go a long way in enhancing the capacity of sporting activities in the County.

He further stated that upon approval, he intends to initiate inter ward sports competition and tournaments are made annual events. The nominee also proposed that he would establish a talent academy that will train the young people in various disciplines including athletics, football, stand-up comedy, modelling among others. To achieve this the nominee committed to work closely with the members of the Sectoral committee on Culture, Youth, Sport and Social Services.

On how to tap into the programs of the National Government;

The nominee informed the committee that there is a need to have a high-stake holder engagement matrix. In community development, work plans are essential guides to the establishment and achievement of the agenda. The nominee acknowledged that the national government has a work plan just like the County Government and that he shall endeavor to collaborate with the national government and harmonize the work plans so as to avoid duplication of roles. He would lobby that the national Government to boost the County Government's capacity to implement the planned programs.

On plans to ensure that the youth have access to the 30% procuring opportunities;

The nominee stated that the County has a Data Centre and that he will deploy his statistical knowledge and capabilities to develop a good data base. He will hence come up with registered youth entities for doing businesses, both limited and partnership entities. He cited that he will then stratify the departments through the

procurement officers attached to different departments so that after undertaking a procurement exercise of works and services, an evaluation will be conducted as one of the compliance measures to ensure that all the categories of works/services preserved for the youth have been offered to them. The nominee further undertook to pursue the implementation of the Youth Infrastructure Savings program, an integrated program which is contained in the Governor's manifesto. The nominee further committed to organize awareness and sensitization programs to the youth on matters registration of companies and application of government tenders.

On the initiatives to employ in order to tap into the advantage of existing ICT platforms;

The nominee acknowledged that there are many digital platforms and that tapping into the potential of technology is an indispensable affair in the 21st Century. The nominee recognized the need to tap into the potential of this sphere. He proposed to put measures to tap into the potential of some social platforms such as the Facebook and WhatsApp groups as very key in dissemination of information in terms of the programs happening across the County. Appreciating that national government is in the process of digitizing its five thousand services, the nominee noted that the first regime under the stewardship of H.E the Governor, Dr. Julius Malombe, constructed a resource Centre in Ikutha ward, one in Zombe/Mwitika ward and another one in Kivou ward, Mwingi. The nominee undertook to equip these resource centres after which he will use them to train the youth on how they can capitalize on the digitized national government services.

CHAPTER FOUR

4.0 OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

The Committee observations were guided by Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 as read together with provisions of Section 9(2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and provisions of Standing Order 190 (5) (f) of the Kitui County Assembly Standing Orders.

The Committee upon considering the nominees filled questionnaires pursuant to Section 7(9) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies) Approval Act, 2017, their Curriculum Vitae and having heard their oral submissions during the approval hearings, made the following observations on their suitability for appointment to the positions of Chief Officers in the ministry Culture Gender and Social Services, Youth Sports, ICT, and Innovation.

4.1 Ms. Brettah Mwikali Mwangangi

The Committee made the following Observations on her suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer, County Department of Culture Gender and Social Services;

1. THAT, the nominee holds a Bachelor of Education (Primary with Special Needs option) from African Nazarene University. She also holds a Diploma in Management from the Kenya Institute of Management; she holds another Diploma in Special Needs Education and holds a P1 Certificate.
2. THAT, the nominee is eligible for appointment to State Office since she is a Kenyan citizen born in 1968, in Matinyani Ward of Kitui Centra Sub County in Kenya and does not hold dual citizenship.
3. THAT, the nominee has an experience of over 30 years working as a teacher and has rose from being an assistant teacher to a head teacher in different schools.
4. THAT, the nominee-
 - i. Worked as a head teacher at Kithendu Primary School – Yatta Sub County Machakos County. (2018 – Date)
 - ii. Worked as a head teacher at Ndalani Primary School – Kitui West Sub County Kitui County. (2011 – 2018)

- iii. Worked as a head teacher at Kavisi Primary School – Kitui Central Sub County Kitui County. (2010 – 2011)
 - iv. Worked as a deputy head teacher at Unyaa Primary School – Kitui Central Sub County Kitui County. (2009 – 2010)
 - v. Worked as an Assistant teacher at A.I.C Matinyani Primary School – Kitui West Sub County Kitui County. (1991 – 2009)
 - iv. Is a member registered member of the Teachers Service Commission.
5. THAT, the nominee meets requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity having obtained clearance from Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), and the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB).
 6. THAT, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75(1) (Conflict of Interest), Article 76(Financial probity), Article 77(Restriction on activities of state officers) and Article 78 (Dual citizenship) of Constitution of Kenya,2010.
 7. THAT, the nominee was competitively recruited by the County Public service Board and forwarded to H.E the Governor for appointment. This was evidenced by the advert placed in the Standard and the Star newspaper on Friday, 7th October, 2022 setting the requirements for the position and the report submitted by the County Public Service Board to H.E the Governor.
 8. THAT, no memoranda were received from the members of the public contesting the suitability of the nominee to the position despite notifying the public of the same vide an advert in the Standard newspaper on 21st January, 2023 and in line with Section 7(5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.
 9. THAT, the nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the department of Culture, Gender and Social

Services and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Chief Officer responsible for the docket.

Having considered the academic and professional qualifications, the work experience, adherence to the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and all other laws governing appointments to Public Office; and having conducted approval hearings with nominee, the Committee on Culture, Youth Sports, Gender and Social Services finds **Mrs. Bretta Mwikali Mwangangi SUITABLE** for appointment as the County Chief Officer for Culture, Gender and Social Services.

4.2 Mr. Nason Kang'alya Kilonzo

The Committee made the following Observations on his suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer, County Department of Youth, Sports, ICT and Innovation;

1. THAT the nominee is currently pursuing a Master of Science in Statistical Science. He holds a Bachelor Science in Actuarial Science with IT.
2. THAT, the nominee is eligible for appointment to State Office since he is a Kenyan citizen born in 1990, in Kyangwithya West Ward of Kitui Centra Sub County in Kenya and does not hold dual citizenship.
3. THAT, the nominee has an experience in working as an IT statistics expert in different organizations.
4. THAT, the nominee-
 - i. Has served as a Statistics Office at Frontman Consultants (May 2019 – May 2021)
 - ii. Has served as a Research Assistant at Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (July 2018 – May 2019)
 - iii. Served as a Research Assistant at TADE (K) LTD (January 2018 – May 2018).
5. THAT, the nominee meets requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity having obtained clearance from Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), and the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB).

6. THAT, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75(1) (Conflict of Interest), Article 76(Financial probity), Article 77(Restriction on activities of state officers) and Article 78 (Dual citizenship) of Constitution of Kenya,2010.
7. THAT, the nominee was competitively recruited by the County Public service Board and forwarded to H.E the Governor for appointment. This was evidenced by the advert placed in the Standard and the Star newspaper on Friday, 7th October, 2022 setting the requirements for the position and the report submitted by the County Public Service Board to H.E the Governor.
8. THAT, no memoranda were received from the members of the public contesting the suitability of the nominee to the position despite notifying the public of the same vide an advert in the Standard newspaper on 21st January, 2023 and in line with Section 7(5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.
9. THAT, the nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the department of Sports, Youth, ICT and Initiatives and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Chief Officer responsible for the docket.

Having considered the academic and professional qualifications, the work experience, adherence to the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and all other laws governing appointments to State/Public Office; and having conducted approval hearings with nominee, the Committee on Culture, Youth Sports, Gender and Social Services finds **Mr. Nason Kang'alya Kilonzo SUITABLE** for appointment as the County Chief Officer for Sports, Youth, ICT and Innovation.



RE: NOMINATION OF PERSONS TO BE APPOINTED AS CHIEF OFFICERS

Following the advertisements for the positions of chief officers (CO's) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on 7th October, 2022 and 14th October, 2022 a total of 1,866 applications were received. A total of 208 applicants were shortlisted for the 26 posts with eight (8) persons shortlisted per position. Interviews were conducted from Wednesday November 23rd, 2022 to Friday December 9th, 2022.

After the conclusion of the interviews, the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on Tuesday December 13, 2022 to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

Please note four (4) current chief officers (COs) who were appointed in 2017/2018 by my predecessor H.E. Charity Kaluki Ngilu moved to court on 13th December 2022 alleging their appointments were on permanent and pensionable (P&P) basis and not contractual, among other prayers. The officers were granted conservatory orders by the Employment and Labour Relations Court (ELRC) thus restraining the Governor from appointing new chief officers to the four departments listed below or replacing them as COs until the case is heard and determined. The ex-parte orders were served to the Governors Office on Wednesday December 14, 2022.

The initial court order was extended by the ELRC during an Interparties appearance on Monday December 19, 2022. I am advised the ELRC orders were also served to the County Assembly and I trust they have been availed to you. It is noteworthy the ELRC Court did not injunct the entire recruitment process as prayed by the four applicants/plaintiffs.

The four officers and their departments are:-

1. Godfrey Zakayo Kimanzi – Chief Officer, Office of the Governor. *(There is however another current Chief Officer in the Office of the Governor responsible for Public Service Management & Administration).*
2. Geoffrey M. Changangu – Chief Officer, Department of ICT & Youth Development.
3. Enoch Ngũthũ – Chief Officer, Department of Livestock, Apiculture & Fisheries Development
4. Eng. Joseph Kimanga – Chief Officer, Department of Gender, Sports & Culture

This is therefore to request you to have the Chief Officer nominees vetted/considered for appointment by the County Assembly as necessary (see list below).
