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CHAIRMAN'S FORWARD

In accordance with Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 as read together with Section 6(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No. 5, 2017, His Excellency the Governor nominated Ms. Kamunda John, Mrs. Agnes Kawila Mulewa, and Mr. Stephen Kitonga Salee for appointment as the Chief Officers in the County departments of Governor's Service Delivery, Public Service and General Administration, Decentralized Units, SEKEB, and Inter-Governmental Units respectively.

The nomination was communicated to the Speaker of the County Assembly on 19th December, 2022. In line with the provisions of Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act and the Kitui County Assembly Standing Orders No. 42(1); the Speaker delivered a communication to the House which committed the nominee to the Committee on Administration and Coordination of County Affairs for vetting and approval hearings.

The Speaker of Assembly, aware that the House was on recess directed that the Committees commence preparation for the exercise during the week of 23rd to 28th January, 2023 and conduct the actual vetting on 30th and 31st January, 2023. This would enable the Committee to come up with a report for tabling and subsequent adoption by the Assembly within the required timelines.

Conforming with Section 7(4) & (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, the Clerk of the Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media (Standard Newspaper and Daily Nation) on Monday, 23rd January, 2023. The notification was to inform the nominee and the members

of the public on date, time and place for the approval hearings. In the same advert, the Clerk of Assembly made a notification under Section 7(10) of the same Act requesting members of the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*affidavit*) on the suitability of the nominees. There were no submissions received to that effect as at the deadline of 26th January, 2023, 5.00 pm.

The nominees appeared before the Committee on Monday, 30th January, 2023 for approval hearings in accordance with the provisions of Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act and Standing Order 42(4) the County Assembly Standing Orders.

The three nominees were administered oaths pursuant to Section 12 (2)(a) at commencement of each hearing for them to partake their submissions under oath. The nominees shared with the Committee their original and certified copies of academic certificates and original clearance certificates and proceeded to provide further information as requested by the Committee members.

Having conducted the approval hearings and satisfied with the responses submitted by the nominees, the Committee recommends THAT;

1. This House approves for appointment **Ms. Kamunda John**, as the Chief Officer, County Department of Governor's Service Delivery.
2. This House approves for appointment **Mrs. Agnes Kawila Mulewa**, as the Chief Officer, County Department of Public Service and General Administration.
3. This House approves for appointment **Mr. Stephen Kitonga Salee** as the Chief Officer, Decentralized Units, SEKEB and Inter- Governmental relations.



However, this committee advises H.E the Governor,

- i) To take note of the Case filed in a court restraining appointment of Ms. Kamunda John as per the Governor's letter dated 19th December, 2022 referenced CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40.
- ii) **NOT** to appoint Ms. Kamunda John and Mr. Stephen Kitonga Salee who are both public officers until they provide proof of either, leave of absence as public officers, transfer of service, or resignation from their current positions before their appointment to their new positions.
- iii) **NOT** to appoint Mrs. Agnes Kawila Mulewa who is a state officer until she provides proof of leave of absence as a state officer, transfer of service or resignation from her current positions before her appointment.

I now take this opportunity to thank all the Members of the Committee for their input and valuable contributions and time during the approval hearings and deliberations in compiling this report. The Committee also takes this opportunity to thank the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the County Assembly for the logistical support accorded to it during the exercise.

On behalf of the Committee on Administration and Coordination of County Affairs and pursuant to Section 9(2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, Standing Order 42(4) and 179(6), it is now my duty and privilege to present this report for adoption by the Assembly.

- vii. Make reports and recommendations to the county assembly as often as possible, including recommendations of the proposed legislation.

In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to ensure and coordinate the participation of communities and locations in governance at the local level and assisting communities and locations to develop the administrative capacity for the effective exercise of the functions and powers and participation in governance at local level.

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Establishment of the Office of the Chief Officer.

Mr. Speaker Sir,

Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 provides that:

The Governor shall:

- i. Nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board; and
- ii. With the approval of the County Assembly, appoint County Chief Officers.

2.2 Functions of the Chief Officers.

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The functions state that;

- i. A County Chief Officer shall be responsible to the respective County Executive Committee Member for the administration of the county department as provided under section 46 of the County Governments Act, 2012.
- ii. The County Chief Officers shall be the authorized officer in respect of the exercise of delegated power.

2.3 Message from H. E. the Governor Dr. Julius Malombe.

On 16th January, 2023, pursuant to Standing Order 45 the Speaker of the County Assembly conveyed a message to the Assembly, that H.E. the

Governor, had nominated the nominees for appointment as Chief Officer in the department of; -

1. Kamunda John- Governor's Service Delivery
2. Agnes Kawila Mulewa- Public Service and Administration
3. Stephen Kitonga Salee- Decentralized Units, SEKEB, and Inter-Governmental Relations.

The names of the nominees and their curricula vitae were thereafter committed to the Sectoral Committee on Administration and Coordination of County Affairs for consideration.

2.4 Speakers Committal

The Speaker in his Communication from the Chair, issued on **Monday, 16th January, 2023** and pursuant to Section 14(3) of the County Governments Act, and Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, committed the names of the nominees to the sectoral Committee on Administration and Coordination of County Affairs for approval hearing pursuant to section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, and subsequently table a report to the House within twenty-one (21) days.

2.5 Notification to the public.

Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that *"Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated"*.

The Assembly subsequently placed an advertisement in the Standard and Daily Nation Newspapers dated 23rd January, 2023, inviting the nominee for vetting before the Sectoral Committee on Administration and Coordination of County Affairs, on 30th January, 2023 at 9.00 a.m. at the Assembly Precincts and further requesting for memoranda for or against the nominees on or before Friday, 27th January, 2023.

On 23rd January 2023, the Clerk, placed a notification on the Standard and Daily Nation newspapers informing the general public of the planned approval hearings for the nominees, among nominees to other dockets and further requesting for memoranda for or against the nominees on or before Friday, 27th January, 2023.

By the set deadline of 27th January, 2023, for receipt of the above information, the Committee had not received any memoranda from the public on the nominees.

2.6 Notification to Nominee

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 45 (1)(b) of the County Governments Act, 2012 as read together with Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly, through an advert appearing on 23rd January, 2023, Standard and Daily newspapers, notified the nominee of the date, time and venue for the approval hearing.

2.7 Report of the CPSB on the Nomination Procedure and Criteria

The Committee reviewed the procedure and criteria used to arrive at the nominees as submitted by H.E. The Governor vide a letter dated 19th

December, 2022 which was satisfactory as it was comprehensive on how the nominee were derived at pursuant to section 45(1) (a) which states that, *“The Governor shall nominate qualified and experienced county chief officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board.” (See annexures)*

2.8 Committee Proceedings

Committee on Administration and Coordination of County Affairs three nominees appeared before the Committee on 30th January, 2023 for the approval hearings at the Kitui Assembly precincts.

Mr. Speaker,

The Committee considered the nomination of:

Ms. Kamunda John to the position of Chief Officer – Governor’s Service Delivery, Mrs. Agnes Kawila Mulewa to the position of Chief Officer- Public Service and General Administration, Mr. Stephen Kitonga Salee to the position of Chief Officer- Decentralized Units, SEKEB and Inter-Governmental Relations, **guided by Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017** and prepared its report.

In its report, the Committee has made the following conclusion: -

- i) That Ms. Kamunda John to the position of Chief Officer – Governor’s Service Delivery, is academically and professionally qualified for the position. she had met all the required clearances as per chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

That the nominee clearly exhibited an understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer.

That the nominee demonstrated knowledge and experience in service delivery and good governance.

- ii) That **Mrs. Agnes Kawila Mulewa**, the Chief Officer to the Department of Public Service and General administration, is academically and professionally qualified for the position. She further has all the required clearances as per chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

That the nominee clearly exhibited an understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer.

That the nominee demonstrated knowledge and experience in Administration and Public Service issues.

- iii) That **Mr. Stephen Kitonga Salee**, the Chief Officer to the department of Decentralized Units, SEKEB and Inter- Governmental, is academically and professionally qualified for the position. He further has all the required clearances as per chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

That the nominee clearly exhibited an understanding of the roles of a Chief Officer.

That the nominee demonstrated knowledge and experience in Decentralized Units, SEKEB, and Inter-governmental issues.

Mr. Speaker,

Having considered the suitability of the nominees and pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Committee recommends the approval by the Assembly and Subsequent appointment by H.E. the Governor, of:

- i) Ms. Kamunda John- Nominee to the Position of Chief Officer in the County Department of Governor's Service Delivery.
- ii) Mrs. Agnes Kawila Mulewa- Nominee to the Position of Chief Officer in the County Department of Public Service and General Management.
- iii) Mr. Stephen Kitonga Salee- Nominee to the Position of Chief Officer in the County Department of Decentralized Units, SEKEB and Inter-Governmental Relations.

Mulewa to the position of Chief Officer- Public Service and General Administration, Mr. Stephen Kitonga Salee to the position of Chief Officer- Decentralized Units, SEKEB and Inter-governmental Relations, for consideration and adoption.

2.9 Clearance and Compliance Requirements

The County Assembly wrote to the below-listed government agencies requesting them to issue reports on the nominees relating to the matters within the respective agencies' mandate: -

1. Directorate of Criminal Investigations.

The DCI confirmed through a letter dated 23rd January, 2023 that the Certificates of Good Conduct held by each of the nominees were valid and authentic

II. Tax obligation.

The KRA confirmed through a letter dated 1st February that the Tax compliance certificates submitted by the nominees were valid.

II. Ethics & Anti – Corruption Commission (*the Commission*)

Ethics and Integrity.

The Commission responded through a letter dated 26th January, 2023 stating that it had neither undertaken any investigations nor recommended prosecution against any of the nominees pursuant to its mandate.

IV. Directorate of Immigration.

Status of Citizenship.

The Directorate through a letter dated 25th January, 2023 confirmed that all the nominees were Kenyan citizens and none of them held dual citizenship.

Kenya Revenue Authority

V. Higher Educations Loans Board.

All the nominees were cleared by HELB through a letter dated 24th January, 2023

VI. Office of the Official Receiver.

Status of Bankruptcy.

The Official Receiver through a letter dated 24th January, 2023 confirmed that none of the nominees had been subject to any insolvency proceedings

VII. Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.

Political Party affiliations.

The Registrar of Political Parties through a letter dated 23rd January, 2023 confirmed that none of the nominees were officials of any registered political party.

VIII. Universities.

Authentication of Nominees' academic certificates.

All the concerned Universities confirmed that the degree certificates held by all the nominees were authentic

IX. Kenya National Examination Council.

Statement of Examination Results.

The Council confirmed that Certificates of Secondary School Education held by all the nominees were authentic

X. Credit Reference Bureau.

Credit Reference.

Metropol CRB Ltd and CREDITINFO confirmed that the Credit Reference Certificates submitted by the nominees to the County Assembly were valid and authentic.

CHAPTER 3

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEES

The Committee conducted approval hearing for the nominees on Monday 30th, January 2023 in Tent 3 in the County Assembly precincts. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No.5 of 2017 and the Kitui County Assembly Standing Orders.

The Committee vetted the nominees using the guidelines provided in Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No.5 of 2017, provides for issues which the County Assembly is supposed to consider in relation to any nomination. These are:

- a) The procedure used to arrive at the nominees;
- b) Any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- c) The suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

The schedule to the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No.5 of 2017 provides for the criteria used to guide the Committee. Briefly, these are:

- a) Education, employment record;
- b) Public office, political activities and affiliations;
- c) Deferred income or future benefits;

- d) Sources of income, tax status, statement of net worth;
- e) Potential conflicts of interest;
- f) Pro bono or charity work;
- g) Whether the nominee has been charged in a court of law or convicted;
and
- h) Whether the nominee has been adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of a parliamentary committee or commission.

Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No.5 of 2017 provides important points to note, which are:

- a) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, and background.
- b) The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate.
- c) Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated
- d) A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall end.

The Committee held two sittings one from 9.30 A.M to 1.00 A.M and the other one from 2.30 A.M to 4.00 A.M. on 30th January, 2023 during which it conducted approval hearings and noted the following, THAT

3.1 KAMUNDA JOHN.

Kamunda John, the nominee for Governor's Service Delivery appeared before the committee on 30th January, 2023 at 9.30 A.M and was vetted under oath. The committee noted the following;

Date and place of birth.

The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen born in 1985 in Tharaka, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

The nominee holds a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology and communication and a minor in political science, Masters of Arts in international relations both from the university of Nairobi.

Work experience.

The nominee has thirteen years work experience, the nominee is currently the Assistant Director Trade- County Governments of Kitui since January,2014 She has also worked as a social worker with A.I.C Nzewani C.D.C from September 2012 to July 2013 and a project director at A.I.C Mwarangeni C.D.C from August to December 2013.

The nominee also worked with the Royal media services from March to May, 2010 as an intern.

Income and net worth.

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that her estimated net worth is Kenya shillings fourteen million (14 million).

Integrity.

The nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer

The nominee submitted that she is a public officer, an assistant director- Trade.

Original documents.

During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original documents to the committee for confirmation;

- i. Identification
- ii. Degree certificates
- iii. Clearances from: - DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA

3.1.1. SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE

The committee posed the following sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows; -

On how to ensure effective service delivery as a new department

The nominee committed to building strong working relationships with the other County departments and ministries to ensure timely service delivery to the people. The nominee pointed out that, through the public communication department, she will communicate to the public in a timely way and also receive communication from the public in a timely manner to ensure timely service delivery. She also believes that performance contracting works if done well, and that her department will work with other departments to sign performance contracts with senior managers and junior officers, and have work plans in place to make service delivery more effective.

On the nominee's understanding of good governance.

The nominee highlighted national values and principles of governance as stipulated in article 10 of the constitution of Kenya (2010). Among them, she noted devolution of power, patriotism, the rule of law, democracy, and participation of the people in matters that affect them, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized, integrity, transparency, and accountability in service delivery and focus on sustainable development.

The nominee also recognized the values and principles of public service as highlighted in article 232 of the constitution of Kenya (2010). In her explanation, she attributed to high standards of professional ethics, efficient, effective, and economic use of resources, involvement of the people in the process of policymaking through public participation, accountability for administrative acts) transparency and provision to the public of timely,

accurate information and representation of Kenya's diverse communities, fair competition, and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions.

On whether there is a conflict between the Ward Development Committee and the local people.

The nominee assured the committee that there will be no conflict between the people and this committee. She ascertained that the Ward Development Committee works hand in hand with the ministries to ensure the effective implementation of projects at the ward level. She mentioned that the members of the public can report if there are any irregularities in the implementation projects at the ward level.

On the mandate of the ward development committee.

The nominee confirmed to the committee that at the moment the mandate of the Ward Development Committee (WDC) has not been communicated. She mentioned that CLIDP is not currently in this sector but the WDC is currently overseeing the local projects under this program at the ward level.

On the nominee's understanding of CLIDP, Challenges so far, recommendations, and how she will ensure equitable development throughout the county.

The nominee explained to the committee that CLIDP is a fund that is distributed equally to all the wards in the county and is meant to ensure equitable infrastructural development across the county. The nature of the projects that are done for each ward depends on what the community wants and what they prioritize.

On the challenges, the nominee posed that the community usually has higher expectations than the planned and they do not understand why it is lower than what they expect.

On recommendations, the nominee proposed that the government should do more civic education to communities so as to differentiate between CLIDP and other infrastructural projects from other departments like Lands, Infrastructure, Housing, and Urban Development within the ward.

On how the nominee is going to actualize the governor's manifesto of the office of the governor.

The nominee posed that the manifesto cuts across all other departments. In her capacity, she committed to advising or highlighting the key issues of the manifesto. She will also create rapport with other departments so that the projects are aligned with the 16-point agenda of the governor's manifesto. Besides, she will communicate to the public the government's manifesto through the public communication department which is under the office of the governor, from planning to budgeting in accordance with the manifesto.

3.1.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE.

The committee having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and her oral submissions during the approval hearing made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer Governor's Service Delivery;

- i) THAT in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
- ii) The nominee holds a Master's degree of arts in international relations and a Bachelor of arts in sociology and communication with a minor in political science from the University of Nairobi, among other professional qualifications. she has over twelve years work experience having worked at the Ministry of Trade for nine years. Her academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.
- iii) The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
- iv) The nominee demonstrated knowledge of the Governor's manifesto and its implementation, community development and issues touching on service delivery and good governance and therefore has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CO in the county department to which she has been nominated.

3.2 AGNES KAWILA MULEWA

Agnes Kawila Mulewa, the nominee for Public Service and General Administration appeared before the committee on 30th January, 2023 at 11.30 A.M and was vetted under oath.

The committee noted the following;

Date and place of birth.

The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen born in 1980 in Kauwi ward, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

The nominee holds a Masters of Arts in Kiswahili, and a Bachelor of Education Arts both from the university of Nairobi.

Work experience.

The nominee has over twelve years work experience, and she is currently the Chief Officer- Public Service Management and Administration and acting County Secretary- Kitui County Government.

She has also worked as a chief officer in the Department of Education, and office of the Governor.

She worked in South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU) from April 2010 to 2017 as an assistant Lecturer and Administrator in SEKU and as a part time lecturer in Kenyatta University.

She was also an administrator in Gender Round table department of history in September 2007 to December 2008 in Kenyatta University.

Income and net worth.

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that her estimated net worth is Kenya shillings forty-seven million (47 million).

Integrity.

The nominee submitted that she had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

The nominee submitted that she is a state officer - Chief Officer Public Service Management and Administration and Acting County Secretary.

Original documents.

During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original documents to the committee for confirmation

- i. Identification
- ii. Degree certificates
- iii. Clearances from: - DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA

3.2.1 SECTOR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.

The committee posed the following sector specific questions to the nominee to which she responded as follows; -

On the issue of public participation in CLIDP and Pro-Poor programs, challenges and recommendation.

The nominee confirmed to the committee that public participation in CLIDP and Pro-Poor programs is done every year. She noted that some wards have more villages than others with examples of Athi and Kyuso wards which

makes it difficult to conduct public participation in one day. She said that she will raise the issue with the government to allow ward representatives and their people to participate fully. In order to ensure more time for the public participation exercise, the nominee proposed to raise the issue so as to increase the days for carrying out the public participation exercise.

On challenges, the nominee informed the committee that the needs of the public at the grassroots are more than the government resource envelope as far as money set aside for the fund is concerned. The nominee in an example cited an example when members were asked to list say 5 priority projects, the community expects all of the 5 projects to be done and the department ends up only doing one which is at the top of the list of priorities.

On recommendations, the nominee advocated for the effective implementation of projects. She proposed to have an itemized budget for these projects so that by the end of public participation you can tell members of the public that this is what they can do for them.

On the formation of the Ward Development Committee and the possibility of conflict arising between the Ward Development Committee and grassroots networks used by ward representatives to reach the people at the ward level.

The nominee informed the committee that the formation of the Ward Development committee instead of village councils was a cabinet decision to oversee the implementation of development projects at the ward level. She acknowledges that the formation of village councils is the right way and that she will advise the replacement of the Ward Development Committee with the Village Council.

On conflict arising between Ward Development Committee and grassroots networks used by ward representatives, the nominee assured the committee that there will be no conflict between the people and this committee. She quoted section 53 of the County Governments Act on village councils and committed to implementing devolution to the fullest and will have village councils as envisaged by the law.

On the alignment of County Assembly activities and County Executive activities of county importance.

The nominee posed that there is a need for the County Executive to do a schedule of activities and dates in advance so that they can interrogate and give feedback on important issues in a timely manner and also accord members an opportunity to attend to these matters.

On the nominee's understanding of good governance.

The nominee defined good governance as a process from the global view where government institutions are put to test on how they spend their resources, within the law, transparent, with no corruption, and accountable. She demonstrated her understanding of article 10 of the Constitution 2010 and named among others devolution of power, patriotism, the rule of law, transparency, and accountability in service delivery, democracy and participation of the people in matters that affect them, good governance, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized, integrity, and focus on sustainable development.

In line with article 232 of the Constitution (2010), the nominee highlighted the following values and principles of public service as follows; objectivity

and impartiality, prudent management of resources, effective and efficient use of public resources, ensuring equity, being transparent and provision to the public of timely and accurate information, avoiding discrimination of any form, involving people in the process of policymaking through public participation, and being sensitive to the less privileged in the society.

On how to ensure transparency in the office of the governor.

In response to this, the nominee highlighted the following to ensure transparency in the office of the governor.

- i) Offer members of the public an opportunity to scrutinize any activity of the office so as to give them an opportunity to participate in decision-making that affects them.
- ii) Being honest in the declaration of key events in good time, and declaring amounts for doing projects for each ward
- iii) Advertise through open tender for CLIDP and pro-poor projects, publish names of those who have benefited from the fund, and distribute this information to the relevant stakeholders.

On how to ensure effective service delivery in the ward, Sub County, and Village Administrator's offices.

The nominee committed to the committee that she will ensure that Ward, Sub County, and Village Administrators have a good working environment to execute their duties e.g. provide offices and working tools.

Noting that during the first government, only three (3) Ward Administrators' offices were completed, and 37 are not completed, she assured to the

committee that she will fast-track the completion of these stalled Ward Administrator's offices. She mentioned that the current budget has allocated 10 million towards the completion of the same starting with the ones which are almost complete. Further, she committed to working with the relevant stakeholders to identify land where to construct the remaining ward offices that never began like Kyangwithya East Public participation to be done so that members of the public can decide where they want the office to be located.

As part of her plan to ensure effective service delivery, the nominee vowed to implement performance contracting and set targets for the officers to achieve as well as to train them so as to empower them and develop a proper staff establishment plan.

On the issue of two villages sharing a village administrator.

On the issue of sharing offices between the county officers at the ward level, the nominee committed to conducting an assessment to determine whether sharing of ward administrator's offices is possible.

On the effectiveness of service delivery by Village Administrators in the wards.

The nominee acknowledged that some village administrators had issues with the local people like in Mui ward where he was unable to execute his/her duties. She also noted that there are other officers that have issues, that prevent them from working effectively with the local people. To respond to these, the nominee suggested the following;

- i) The delocalization of village administrators by asserting that village administrators are public officers and can work anywhere within Kitui county and its possible to transfer or deploy them to other departments. If the village administrators have issues with the local people, they can be deployed to other departments and other village administrators sourced competitively.
- ii) Follow the right procedure of removal from office by forwarding these cases to HR for disciplinary action.
- iii) Rehabilitation of village administrators is also possible.
- iv) To create more awareness to members of the public to give their views and recognize village administrators as one of them who is mandated to do work for the government on their behalf.
- v) The government to competitively source for village administrators who can work well with the people and fill in any vacancies in this office.

On Border line issues at Ithumba, Mandongoi, Imumba and Twambui.

When responding to this issue, the nominee highlighted that the function of security is not yet devolved. She noted the importance of collaboration between the county government and the national government to allow easy police patrol along the Ithumba, Mandongoi, Imumba, and Twambui borders. She committed to ensuring that the county government and the national government work hand in hand to handle this issue.

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3.2.2. COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE.

The committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, her curriculum vitae and her oral submissions during the approval hearing made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer Governor's Service Delivery;

- i) THAT in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as she is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
- ii) The nominee holds a Master's degree of arts in Kiswahili, and a Bachelor of Education arts from Kenyatta University, among other professional qualifications. she has over fifteen years work experience having worked at the Ministry of Administration and Coordination of County Affairs for four years and worked in other Ministries like Education and was the Chief Officer office of the Governor. Her academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.
- iii) The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
- iv) The nominee demonstrated knowledge of Administration and coordination, human resource management issues and also management of county resources, she also had mastery of administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and therefore has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to

serve as a CO in the county department to which she has been nominated.

3.3 STEPHEN KITONGA SALEE.

Stephen Kitonga Salee, the nominee for Decentralized Units, SEKEB& Inter-governmental Relations appeared before the committee on 30th January, 2023 at 2.30 P.M and was vetted under oath.

The committee noted the following;

Date and place of birth.

The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born in 1972 in Nuu ward, Kitui County.

Academic and professional qualifications.

The nominee holds a Bachelor of Education Arts from Moi University, Masters of Arts in Project planning and Management from the university of Nairobi.

Work experience.

The nominee has over twenty-five years work experience, and he is currently the Director of Administration, Ministry of Education, ICT and Youth Development - Kitui County Government.

The nominee also worked in the following position across different periods of time as follows;

- i) 2018-2022- Deputy Director -Administration, Ministry of Education, ICT and Youth Development

- ii) 2014-2018- Sub -County Kitui County Administrator, Mwingi Central
- iii) 2011-2012 – County Director of Youth Development – Kitui County rank of principal Youth Development officer
- iv) 2007-2011 worked as District Youth Officer/ District Sports Officer and chief Youth officer
- v) 1997-2007 taught at Yambyu Girls Secondary under Teachers Service Commission.

Income and net worth.

The nominee indicated in the questionnaire provided by the County Assembly that his estimated net worth is Kenya shillings twenty-four million, two hundred and eighty thousand (24,280,000).

Integrity.

The nominee submitted that he had never been charged in any court of law or adversely mentioned in any investigatory or parliamentary report of inquiry.

State or public officer.

The nominee submitted that he is a public officer – Director of Administration, Ministry of Education, ICT and youth Development- Kitui County Government.

Original documents.

During the approval hearing, the nominee submitted the following original documents to the committee for confirmation

- i. Identification
- ii. Degree certificates
- iii. Clearances from: - DCI, HELB, CRB and KRA

3.3.1 SECTOR-SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO THE NOMINEE.

The committee posed the following sector specific questions to the nominee to which he responded as follows;

On the understanding of the department.

The nominee defined the key sections in his docket to demonstrate his understanding of the department. He described decentralized units as the administration of county governments which includes the Sub-county, Ward, and, Village administration, and that it involves placing services from the central government to other lower units. On SEKEB, he defined it as the South Eastern Kenya Economic Block for Kitui, Machakos, and Makueni counties. He posed that intergovernmental relations deal with other governments at the county and national levels.

On how to make Kitui shine out of the SEKEB union.

The nominee mentioned that the block was inaugurated to bring development to the people of these three counties and could get sponsorship in many areas, share natural resources, support each other, conduct free trade, exchange culture, enter into peace and unity agreements and create jobs for the local people. He added that the governor of Kitui County is the chairperson of SEKEB and will work together with his government to move Kitui forward.

On the expansion of SEKEB.

In response to the expansion of SEKEB, the nominee informed the committee that the department developed the Kitui County SEKEB Act, 2022 which allows for new members to SEKEB. He asserted that the act has set out procedures to get more counties on board to grow. He also suggested that his office in collaboration with the governor will lobby from other counties like Kajiado, Tharaka Nithi, and Taita Taveta among others to join SEKEB through their governor (County executive) and the County assembly.

On the relationship between County Executive and County Assembly.

The nominee noted the importance of a smooth working relationship between the two organs and working together in harmony by ensuring frequent consultations with this committee. He committed to pushing for officers in the field to cooperate with ward representatives for effective service delivery.

On what causes a conflict between ward representatives and the County Executive and what happens when there is a conflict.

The nominee cited the existence of bad blood between the two arms of government, lack of consultations on important matters, undue adherence to procedures like in the case of KICOTEC establishment and operations, ballast crusher, and irregular appointments in the government. The nominee noted that these in the past led to the people of Kitui not getting enough development, delay in service delivery like in the case of delay in the approval of the county public service board members, vetting of chief officers, and failure to achieve the governor's manifesto.

On the resolution of the border conflicts at Ithumba, Mandongoi, Imumba and Twambui.

The nominee highlighted the following to help solve the conflicts at Ithumba, Mandongoi, Imumba, and Twambui borders.

- i) Engagement with governors of Kitui and Tana river counties to bring peace.
- ii) The governor to put a cutline between Kitui and Tana rivers to clearly show boundaries as most of these conflicts are caused by people outside these counties who come to compete for resources like water and grazing fields.
- iii) Create a cutline or a clear border.
- iv) Development of the area on the Kitui side to make the area assessable
- v) To survey the area so as to provide title deeds to the people in these areas to control trespassing
- vi) To set up police stations along the border line.
- vii) The county government to build the police posts and the national government to provide police officers
- viii) Consult widely and form peace committees along the borders.

On the relationship between the County Assembly and the County Executive on the border line conflict.

The nominee informed the committee that there is a committee working on this issue and the governor will involve the ward representatives from the affected areas when the time to involve them comes so as to get their views on solving the problem.

On the role of the chief officer in border line conflicts.

The nominee assured the committee to work closely with the office of the governor to help him solve the conflicts because security is not a devolved function but it is handled through the county policing authority where the governor and the county commissioner have high stakes.

On how to ensure service delivery to the people of Kitui.

The nominee committed himself to apply articles 10 and 232 of the constitution on national values and good governance and principles of public service in his work. He vowed not to allow shortcuts, adhere to procedure, does wide consultations with leaders and engage stakeholders, and ensure public participation on key issues that affect the people.

On plans to improve the competitiveness of Kitui as a brand.

The nominee stated that he will ensure that service delivery is done in a unique way and Kitui will be known for its outstanding service delivery to the people. He noted that Kitui has a wide range of resources compared to Machakos and Makueni. These include; land, minerals, and tourist attraction sites. It will use these resources to create investments that bring long lasting benefits to the people.

3.3.2 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE.

The committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire, his curriculum vitae and his oral submissions during the approval hearing made

the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the Chief Officer Decentralized units, SEKEB and Inter-Governmental Relations;

- i) THAT in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office as he is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
- ii) The nominee holds a Masters of arts in Project Management from Nairobi University and a Bachelor of Education Arts from Moi University, among other professional qualifications. He has over twenty-five years work experience having worked as the Director of Administration in the Ministry of Education, Deputy director Administration for four years and sub- county Administrator for four years. His academic credentials, professional training and experience comply with section 8 of the Act.
- iii) The nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having been cleared by all relevant government agencies.
- iv) The nominee demonstrated knowledge of decentralization, decentralized units and had mastery of regional integration, inter-agency relations, administrative and technical issues touching on the County ministry and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as a CO in the county department to which he has been nominated.











1. This House approves for appointment **Ms. Kamunda John**, as the Chief Officer, County Department of Governor's Service Delivery.

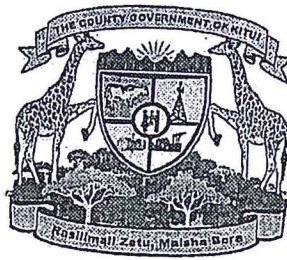

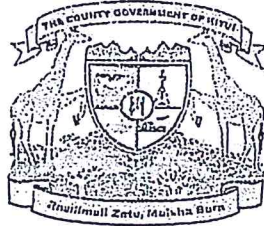

Introduction

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am. It started with a word of prayer by Mr. Joseph Kyavoa. The agenda was tabled and adopted.

MIN 1/6/10/2022 ADVERTISEMENT OF THE COUNTY CHIEF OFFICERS

The Board acknowledged receipt of a communication from the Executive on advertisement for sixteen (16) positions out of twenty six (26) positions of Chief Officers through letters Ref: CGKTI/OoG/HRM/VOL.2/4 (25) dated 4th October, 2022. However, the Board was notified that, the other ten (10) positions of Chief Officers were to be submitted for Board's deliberations and action. The Board deliberated on the sixteen (16) position to be advertised and made reference to the County Government Act No 17 of 2012 Section 46 (1) which states that; the county executive committee shall determine the organization of the county and its various departments, and for that purpose may—

- (a) establish, continue or vary any department, and determine the objects and purposes of the department;
- (b) determine the number and nature of departments at the decentralized units;
- (c) abolish any department; and
- (d) determine or change the name of any department.

Members deliberated further in reference to Article 46 (2) which states that; when establishing and organizing the county, the county executive committee shall take into account, and be guided by, the need to—

- (a) be responsive to the needs of the local community and the functions and competencies assigned to and transferred to the county;
- (b) facilitate a culture of public service and accountability in the county Public Service;
- (c) be performance oriented and focused on the objects of devolved government set out in Article 174 of the Constitution;
- (d) ensure that the county departments align their roles and responsibilities with the priorities and objectives set out in the county's policies and plans;
- (e) organize its departments and other structures in a flexible way in order to respond to changing priorities and circumstances;
- (f) assign clear responsibilities for the management and coordination of departments and functions;
- (g) allow participatory decision making as far as is practicable; and
- (h) provide an equitable, fair, open and non-discriminatory working environment.

The Board Concluded on this item and resolved that, the sixteen (16) departments proposed to be held by the incoming Chief Officers were not new offices in the County Public Service and did not require invoking the procedure provided for under section 62 of the County Government Act, 2012.

The Board finally resolved to advertise for the sixteen (16) positions to reach the widest coverage through the use of media and the County Website.

- i) At least one candidate from each of the Eight (8) sub- Counties per position where applicable.

- ii) At least one candidate from each of the forty (40) wards in all the positions where applicable.
- iii) Meets minimum qualifications and experience as per the advert.
- iv) Representation of special groups (PLWD, Women, and Youth),
- v) Regional balancing/county diversity
- vi) Minorities



RE: NOMINATION FOR APPOINTMENT OF COUNTY CHIEF OFFICERS

Your letter Ref: CAK/ADM/15/7/(44) dated 21st December, 2022 on the above refers.
We wish to respond to the issues raised as follows:-

1. Rationale for the Post 2022 General Election Departmental Structure

The County Governor is obligated by law to ensure the structuring of the County Government after a General Election in a manner that will most effectively and efficiently deliver on the incoming government's vision and development agenda. This is the letter and spirit of section 30(2) (e) of the County Government Act, 2012.

The **twenty six (26)** departments under the reorganised county government structure were presented to the pre-election County Executive Committee and formed the basis of the Supplementary Budget I that the said County Executive Committee approved on **Wednesday October 19, 2022** and thus complying with the requirements of Section 46 of the County Governments Act, 2012.

It is noteworthy, the said Supplementary Budget I was subsequently forwarded to the County Assembly and was accordingly approved on **Wednesday November 30, 2022**. The **twelve (12)** ministries and **twenty six (26)** departments were part of the Governor's inaugural speech at the opening of the 3rd County Assembly delivered on the

11th October, 2022. Hence, the County Assembly was duly indulged on the matter, as necessary.

The Kitui County Public Service Board equally adopted and maintained the departments and proceeded to prepare advertisements for potential applicants to fill the subject chief officer positions in the **twenty six (26)** departments on the **7th and 14th October, 2022.**

2. Procedure used to arrive at the nominees including criteria for shortlisting

Following the advertisements for the positions of Chief Officers (CO's) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on **7th October, 2022** and **14th October, 2022** a total of **1,866** applications were received.

The County Public Service Board (CPSB) has advised my office that they were guided by the Constitutional Values and Principles in Article 10 and 232 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, and they used the following criteria to shortlist a total of 208 applicants for the **26** posts with **eight (8)** persons shortlisted per position:

- i. At least one candidate from each of the **Eight(8)** Sub Counties per position where applicable
- ii. At least one candidate from each of the **forty (40)** wards in all the positions where applicable
- iii. Meets the minimum qualifications and experience as per the advert
- iv. Representation of special groups such as Persons Living with Disability (PLWD), Women and Youth
- v. Regional balancing/ County diversity
- vi. Minorities

The County Public Service Board conducted interviews from **Wednesday November 23rd, 2022** to **Friday December 9th, 2022.** After the interviews were concluded the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on **Tuesday December 13, 2022** to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

3. Report of the Kitui County Public Service Board on the selection of the Twenty Six (26) nominees.

The County Public Service Board's report on the scoring and ranking of the candidates shortlisted and interviewed for the **Twenty Six (26)** CO positions is herewith enclosed.



4. Criteria for Nomination for Appointment

After I was satisfied the gender, regional balance etc considerations would be realized, I opted to nominate for appointment all those candidates that were ranked highest by the County Public Service Board *granted the overriding essence of recruitment*

of CO's is effective delivery of services to our people. (See attached, my letter Ref. CGKTI/OOG/ADM/23/40 dated December 19, 2022) Besides educational qualifications and leadership management exposure/experience and potential, I have, to the extent possible, endeavored to observe the $\frac{2}{3}$ gender rule, regional balance, inter-generational and diversity inclusivity.

All the county's **eight (8)** constituencies have at least one Chief Officer (CO) nominee. **Eight (8)** of the nominees are women with **one (1)** of them coming from a marginalized/minority community in the county.

Nine (9) of the nominees are aged **37** years or below and **Seven (7)** of these are youth aged below **35** years. I was advised that none of the Persons Living with Disability (PLWD) qualified for the advertised chief officer positions.

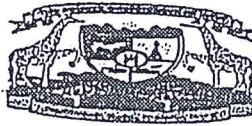

Following the advertisements for the positions of chief officers (CO's) by the Kitui County Public Service Board (CPSB) in the print media and website on 7th October, 2022 and 14th October, 2022 a total of 1,866 applications were received. A total of 208 applicants were shortlisted for the 26 posts with eight (8) persons shortlisted per position. Interviews were conducted from Wednesday November 23rd, 2022 to Friday December 9th, 2022.

After the conclusion of the interviews, the County Public Service Board submitted the names of the candidates as ranked for each post to the Office of the Governor on Tuesday December 13, 2022 to facilitate consideration for appointment of suitable and qualified candidates.

Please note four (4) current chief officers (COs) who were appointed in 2017/2018 by my predecessor H.E. Charity Kaluki Ngilu moved to court on 13th December 2022 alleging their appointments were on permanent and pensionable (P&P) basis and not contractual, among other prayers. The officers were granted conservatory orders by the Employment and Labour Relations Court (ELRC) thus restraining the Governor from appointing new chief officers to the four departments listed below or replacing them as COs until the case is heard and determined. The ex-parte orders were served to the Governors Office on Wednesday December 14, 2022.

The initial court order was extended by the ELRC during an interparties appearance on Monday December 19, 2022. I am advised the ELRC orders were also served to the County Assembly and I trust they have been availed to you. It is noteworthy the ELR Court did not injunct the entire recruitment process as prayed by the four applicants/plaintiffs.

The four officers and their departments are:-

1. Godfrey Zakayo Kimanzi – Chief Officer, Office of the Governor. *(There is however another current Chief Officer in the Office of the Governor responsible for Public Service Management & Administration).*
2. Geoffrey M. Changangu – Chief Officer, Department of ICT & Youth Development.
3. Enoch Nguthu – Chief Officer, Department of Livestock, Apiculture & Fisheries Development
4. Eng. Joseph Kimanga – Chief Officer, Department of Gender, Sports & Culture
