

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Mandate of the Committee

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Liaison Committee is a select committee established under the Kitui County Assembly Standing Orders No. 191(1) which states follows;

"There shall be a Select Committee to be known as the Liaison Committee which shall consist of the Chairperson of committees as the Chairperson and the Chairpersons of all committees of the County Assembly".

The Liaison Committee derives its mandate from Standing Order No. 191(2). The committee's functions include;

- i. To guide and co-ordinate the operations, policies and mandates of all Committees;
- ii. To deliberate on and apportion the annual operating budget among the Committees:
- iii. To consider the programs of all Committees, including their need to travel and sit away from the precincts of the County Assembly;
- iv. To ensure that committees submit reports as required by these Standing Orders;
- v. To determine, whenever necessary, the committee or committees to deliberate on any matter;

- vi. To give such advice relating to the work and mandate of select committees as it may consider necessary;
- vii. To consider reports of committees that have not been deliberated by the County Assembly.

2.0. APPROVAL OF COMMITTEES' WORK PLANS AND APPORTIONMENT OF BUDGETS

Mr. Speaker Sir,

Committees are crucial to the legislative process and enable the County Assembly to fulfil its legislative and oversight responsibilities as outlined in Article 185 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010. County Assembly committees are expected to develop and prepare work plans aligned with their mandates, outlining the activities they intend to undertake throughout the year.

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Liaison Committee is mandated under Standing Order No. 191(2) (b), and (c) to deliberate on and apportion the annual operating budgets among Committees in addition to considering the programs of all committees, including their need to travel and sit away from the precincts of the County Assembly.

Mr. Speaker Sir,

It is on this basis that the Liaison Committee proceeded for a retreat to Mutomo Highway Cottages, from 26th to 30th August 2024, to scrutinize the proposed committees' work plans and budgets before subsequently aligning them as the Committee deems fit.

2.1 Committees' Budgets

Mr. Speaker Sir,

In determining the criteria to be adopted in apportioning the budgets, the Liaison Committee considered:

- i. The size of each Committee (as pertains to the membership).
- ii. its mandate and any other statutory obligation as conferred by law.

In this financial year 2024/2025, the total budget allocation shareable amongst committees is Kshs 82,421,200. This was shared by the Committee as follows;

3.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

Mr. Speaker sir,

It is important to note that the Liaison Committee held several sittings to deliberate on this matter of Committee work plans and the apportionment of the operating budgets. Therefore, in her bid to ensure that there was fairness in the whole process, the committee made several observations from the presentations of annual work plans that the chairpersons of the Assembly Committees presented before the Liaison Committee;

- 1. That, Committees, through their chairpersons, presented realistic work plans that were admissible to the Liaison Committee. Those committees that did not present their proposed work plans will do so during subsequent committee sittings. These committees include; Selection Committee, Finance and Economic Planning and Culture, Youth, Sports and Social Services Committee.
- 2. That, there was a need for all sectoral committees to familiarize themselves with the County ministry's budget and work plans to ensure proper implementation of the budget by the relevant ministries as approved by the County Assembly. This will enhance the Committee's oversight role since they shall be operating with a guide which will act as a performance measurement tool.
- 3. There were disparities between the Committees' proposed budgets and budgetary apportionment by the Liaison Committee. This was occasioned by the fact that the Committees requested funding that exceeded the amounts approved for the financial year 2024/2025 as shown in the table below:

4.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

Mr. Speaker Sir,

Having rigorously gone through the whole exercise of considering Committee work plans and apportioning the operating budget to the Assembly Committees, the Liaison Committee makes the following recommendations: -

- 1. That, the Committees' work plans as approved by the Liaison Committee under the standing order 191(2), be strictly adhered to. This will help in facilitating the committees to effectively achieve their planned activities as they seek to fulfil their mandate in a structured and orderly manner.
- 2. That, the committee clerks must ensure that they keep an updated record of all their respective committees' expenditures to keep track of the committees' balances. This will ensure that the committees are updated on their available budgets hence helping them prioritize their activities efficiently.
- 3. That, the Committees are at liberty to make necessary amendments to their work plans depending on the arising needs and circumstances (for instance matters of bills, policies, petitions among other legislative documents presented before the Committee or emergency issues affecting a particular committee) but, these changes or amendments must be presented before and approved by the Liaison Committee to ensure order and adherence to the Committees' work plans.
- 4. That, the Liaison Committee encourages the Committees to ensure that they achieve all the planned activities using the apportioned budget, by merging several activities that could be performed together. This will ensure that the Committees deliver on their mandate but within the available means.
- 5. That, in the subsequent financial years, Committees' budgetary allocations shall greatly depend on their performance in the previous financial year. This measure will ensure and encourage committees to perform optimally.

Further, the move shall motivate the non-performing committees to improve thus ensuring maximum utilization of the available resources and value for public funds.

6. That, in future, the budgetary allocation should provide for a contingency fund to cater for necessary emerging unforeseen activities. For instance, consideration of legislative documents such as bills, motions, policies, and petitions.
